#### Report Two New Cases of Diphtheria

Diphtheria, a longtime enemy of health in our community, showed flashes of its old power during the week end. Dr. W. B. Prothro, City-County Health Officer, reported today that two cases of diphtheria have been reported in Grand Rapids.

The two cases, Dr. Prothro said, were the first that have been re-

ported in the city or county since 1955 when seven cases were reported. The last diphtheria death occurred in 1945.

Dr. Prothro said that the recent number of cases cropping up throughout the United States including over 20 so far in Detroit this year, serves as ample notice that the disease is still with us and that the only prevention is through adequate immunization.

We can expect even more trouble from diphtheria, Dr. Prothro warned, unless every person is immunized and given booster shots on schedule. Protection against the disease by immunization is safe, sure and as close at hand as your doctor's office or your Health Department clinic, Dr. Prothro stated that booster immunizations are recommended for pre-school children if they have not had one within the last three years. For other persons including adults, it is recommended that booster immunizations be given every four or five years after their last shots. Most adults.
