

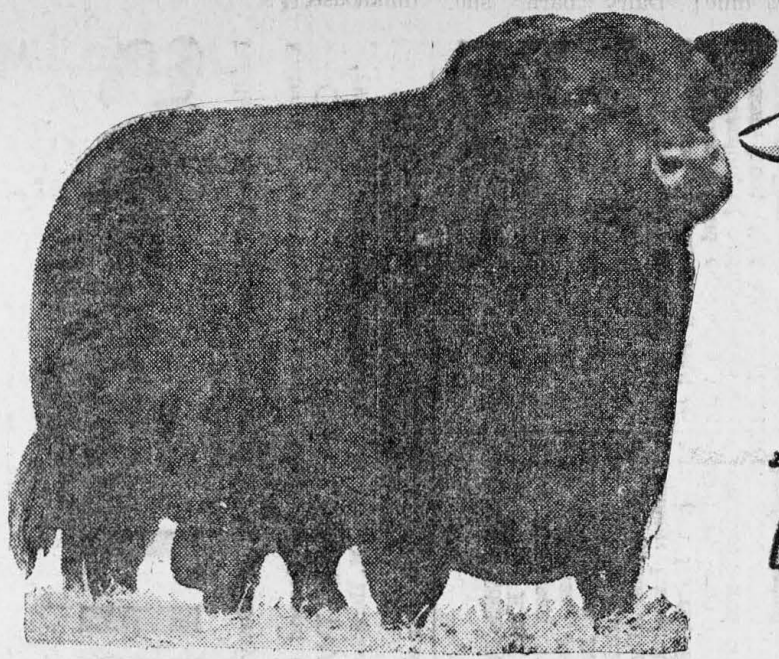

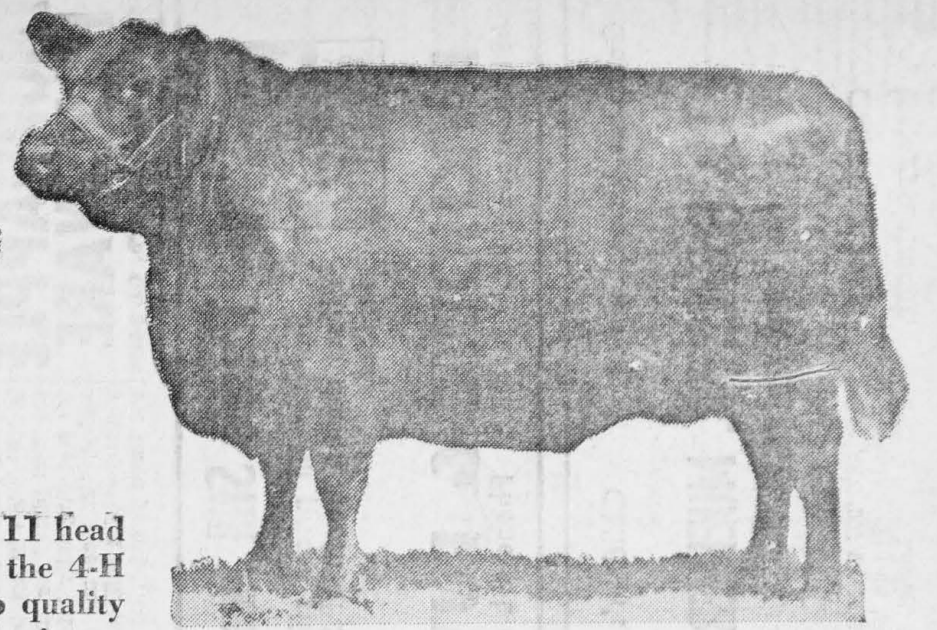

Fire School Being Held At Ada Hall

A firemanship training school that opened in Ada Town Hall on September 1, and concludes with the awarding of certificates to the firemen from this area, (Kent County) on Thursday, Sept. 10.

The school was conducted under the direction of Kent County Fire Chief, C. J. Geldersma and Wallace F. Gannon and Bruce Parrott of Michigan State University.

The school is teaching volunteer firemen the technique of ventilation, fire size-up, locating fires in buildings, ladder handling, and rescue work. The night classes from 7 to 10 p. m. are supplemented with practical experience. A practice house burning was held Saturday afternoon when a 12 room house, barn and outbuildings located on Crayhen St., donated by the Lincoln Foundation, were burned.

No New License Plates Issued in '60

Judging from inquiries at 250 Michigan Department of State Branch Offices there are many people in Michigan who are not aware that they will NOT have new license plates in 1960.

Instead, starting on November 1, 1959, owners of passenger vehicles will, when registering, get a metal tab, 3/4 by 1 1/2 inches in size, which is affixed to the upper right hand corner of the 1959 license plate.

The tab carries a serial number etched in the metal and the number '60 in green on a golden yellow background. This is the reverse of the 1959 plates which carry yellow numerals and letters on a green background. The serial numbers will not be identical with the two-letter four-digit county-designated license plates but will run numerically starting at 1001. According to Secretary of State, James M. Hare, the low numbers will be shipped to Upper Peninsula branches and the highest numbers, which run into seven digits, will be sold in Wayne County branch offices.

"Production on these tabs is well under way at Jackson Prison," Hare said.

"Inasmuch as a new law passed by the Legislature this year calls for completely reflectorized plates in 1961, we will not be able to use the 1959 plates for three years as we had originally intended," Hare added. "It was our goal to save a quarter of a million dollars over the three year period but now that

Many Republicans are taking another look at State Senator Carlton H. Morris of Kalamazoo, figuring that a new party chief is emerging from the GOP tax victory.

Morris is being mentioned as a possible candidate for the nomination for Governor. Some of Paul Bagwell's most ardent supporters are wondering whether the Kalamazoo Senator would not be a strong candidate for United States Senator.

For it was Morris who held Republican legislators together during the dangerous weeks when many leaders were ready to surrender to Gov. Williams by enacting a corporation income tax.

In the end, victory resulted from teamwork that had been lacking in the GOP for almost a decade. State Senator Frank Beadle, of St. Clair, the caucus chairman, made the compromise possible by insisting on tax relief for the small business man and a boost for big corporations. State Senator Lynn O. Francis, of Midland, the floor leader, kept peace in the family at a time when rioting threatened.

On the House side, the settlement would not have been possible without the skillful leadership of Rep. Allison Green of Kingston.

But in command of the long battle was Senator Morris, who was given control of the tax bills by Senator Clyde H. Geerlings, of Holland, chairman of the tax committee, in a generous gesture of party loyalty.

Morris arrived in the Senate in January, 1949, when Gov. Williams was starting his first term. Unlike many first termers, he remained quietly in the background—a handsome six-footer who appeared from the start to have qualities of statesmanship.

For 11 legislative sessions, I had a desk on the Senate floor facing Senator Morris and only 12 feet distant. Yet he remained somewhat of a stranger. He never sought publicity. He never volunteered information, although he would answer questions readily if able. He was not a part of the nightly political gatherings in the cocktail bars. At work in the Senate committee rooms, he was a nervous floor-pacer, a chain smoker of cigarettes; sometimes quick tempered when the road was rough, but always just as quick with an apologetic smile.

When the tax bill finally was passed and politicians began mentioning Morris for the governorship in 1960, I drove to Kalamazoo County to find out who this man might be—this Senator I had been facing for more than a decade. "Meet me in front of the bank in Gobels," he said.

It turned out that Senator Morris has a summer cottage on a small lake near the village of Gobels.

With the Senator at the bank was his four-year-old daughter, Melanie.

"It's a name we picked from a book," the Senator said. "Melanie says she likes it."

He led the way on a rutted road through rich farm lands and into a wood lot. Suddenly, we were in a bush, skidding down a hill to this little lake. The cottage is as remote from civilization as any cabin in the Upper Peninsula. There is no phone.

It's an old cottage, but with the warmth of a home that's been lived in. Martha, 9, and Mike, 6, had just returned from swimming with

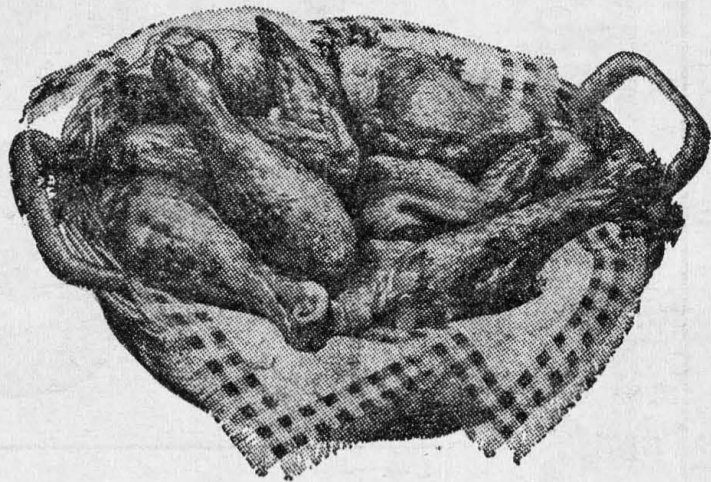
