One senior at Forest Hills High School has been honored for his high performance on the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMQT) given last spring. Each student who is endorsed by his school receives a formal Letter of Commendation signed by his principal and the president of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Howard Dalman, the school's principal, has announced that the Commended student is Thomas H. Nurnberger, son of Mr. and Mrs. William D. Nurnberger, 7625 Cascade Rd., S. E.

"Letters of Commendation are being awarded to 38,000 students throughout the country in recognition of their outstanding performance on the qualifying test.

Although they did not reach the status of Semifinalists in the current Merit Program, they are very capable students. The Semifinalists and Commended students together constitute about 2 percent of all high school seniors. This certainly signifies noteworthy accomplishment by all these bright young people.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation gives recognition to two groups of students who achieve high scores on the NMQT. The Semifinalist group is composed of the highest-scoring students in each state and in U. S. territories. Some 14,000 Semifinalists take a second examination to establish further their eligibility to become Finalists and to receive consideration for Merit Scholarships.

Also featured will be a second best sale and doughnut sale. We will be looking forward to seeing our old friends and hoping to see many new ones.

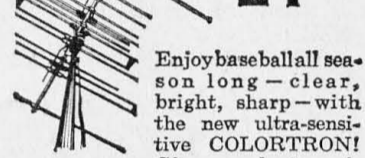

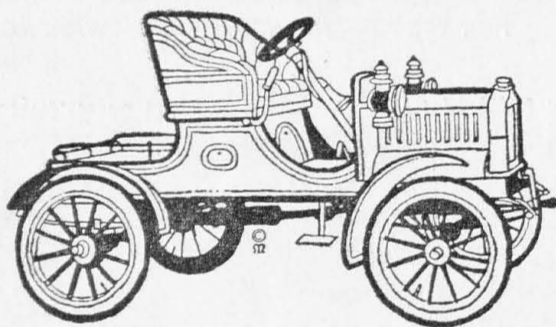

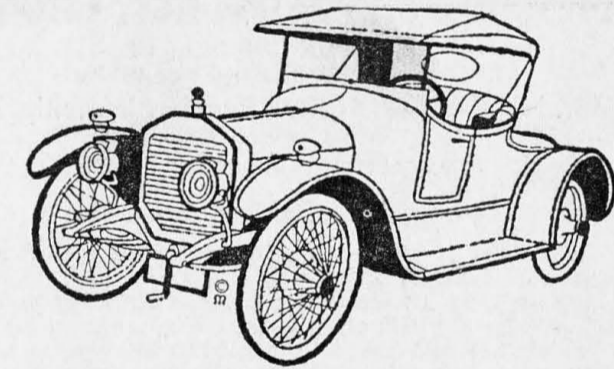
