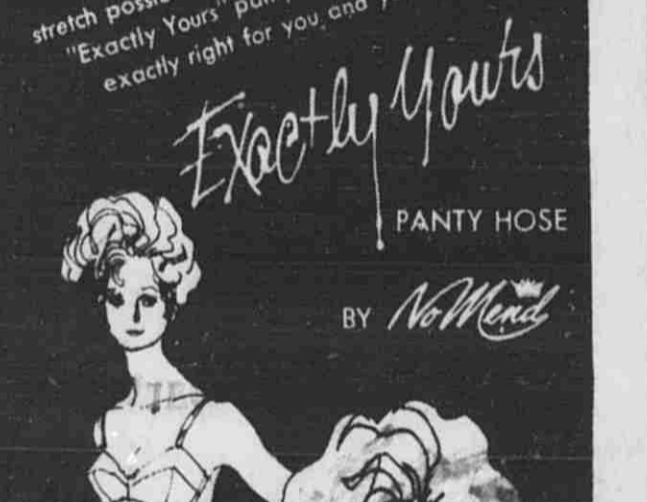

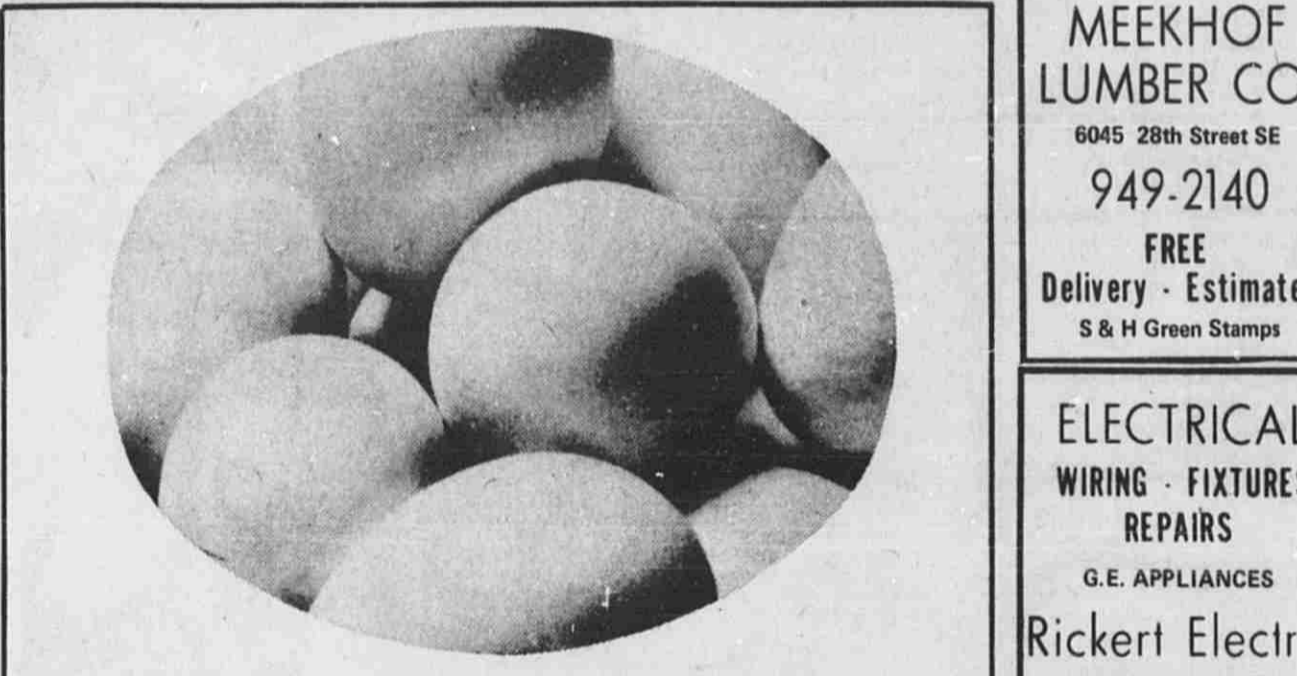

Enrollment Deadline Set for Driver's Course

A registration deadline of May 8 has been set by the Lowell Area School District for enrollment in its summer driver education program.

Any student who is under the age of 18, and resides in the area school district, is eligible to take the course.

The driver education program will provide instruction for at least 180 students. Each student is required to be enrolled for 30 hours of classroom instruction and at least six hours of behind-the-wheel training. Dual-controlled cars, furnished by Jackson Motor Sales, McQueen Motor Company, Royce Ford, Thomet Chevrolet-Buick and Wittenbach Sales and Service, will be used.

In a heartbreaker against Kentwood, Forest Hills High's Golf team lost, 3-2. The final point came on total team scores of 174-173. Terry Walker was low man with a 40 for the match.

Dave Ellis proved himself low scorer at 40 in the match against West Ottawa which Forest Hills won, 4 1/2-1/2.

In Monday's match with Hudsonville, the Green and White linksmen won 5-0. Low scorers were John Robinson with a 37, and Kurt Ray and Dave Ellis with 39's.

The Godwin tennis team which has been scored upon only once in this season, kept its reputation by defeating Forest Hills, 5-0.

However, the Rangers won over Kentwood last Friday, 3-2. Monday's match resulted in a non-league loss to Cedar Springs, 7-0. The overall tennis record so far this season is 12-2, the league record stands at 5-2. "There is the possibility of a good second place for our team," declared Coach Elliot Pearce.

It was a pitcher's battle Monday with Kentwood which finally left Forest Hills with a loss, 3-0. Although Vander Baan pitched a four-hitter, and had two-for-three, it was a matter of seven errors that lost the game for the Rangers. The winning pitcher was Mike Gros who also had a four-hitter.

LHS Golfers Score Upset Over Greenville

There will be no trophy for regular-season competition for Lowell High's golf team, but the Arrows can reflect on a hard-earned victory that had a distinct bearing on Tri-River Conference the title winner.

Coach Al Rowe and his Red and White linksmen knocked off previously undefeated Greenville at Arrowhead GC last Friday, 3 1/2-1 1/2, to drop the Yellowjackets into a share of the lead with Comstock Park.

Jon Schwacha turned in his best round of the season, firing a 39 to share medalist honors with Greenville's Bob Crosby. Dale Kropf had a 40 and Tom Koewers a 41 to help the cause.

Kropf's 41 Monday night tied Sparta's Ron Austin for low medalist, but the Arrows produced no other threat in dropping a 4-1 decision to the Spartans at Arrowhead.

On April 29, Lowell suffered a 4-1 loss to Comstock Park as Paul Hoag fired a brilliant one-over-par 37 for the winners in another match at Arrowhead. Tom Gleiss was low for Lowell with a 42.

Lowell winds up the regular season next week, then swings into regional competition May 15. The Tri-River Conference meet is slated for May 18 at Alpine.

Coach Gary Rivers' baseball team won two of three games played during the week, defeating Coopersville and splitting a doubleheader with Forest Hills.

Blair Cahoon pitched and batted the Arrows to a 4-1 win over Coopersville, fanning eight en route to a four-hitter and collecting a pair of hits that drove in one run and helped him score another. Jim Richard drove in a pair of tallies.

A steal of home by winning pitcher Chris Collins produced the lone run in a 3-0 win over Forest Hills in the opener, but the Rangers came back to take a 4-3 victory in the nightcap as southpaw Scott Vashaw bested Cahoon and reliever John Lyons. Cahoon was the loser when Forest Hills broke a 3-3 tie in the fifth. Craig Wittenbach was 3-for-4 and Jim Herblet 2-for-3 to pace Lowell's eight-hit attack.
