And now at the age of eighty-four, Mr Williams contributes, his "1,000 ems" in commemoration of a departed craftsman who has since filled a large space in the world's eye, but who, when we, mature in years, had commenced the battle of life, was but six years old.—N. 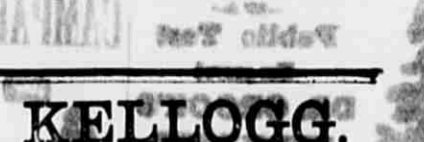

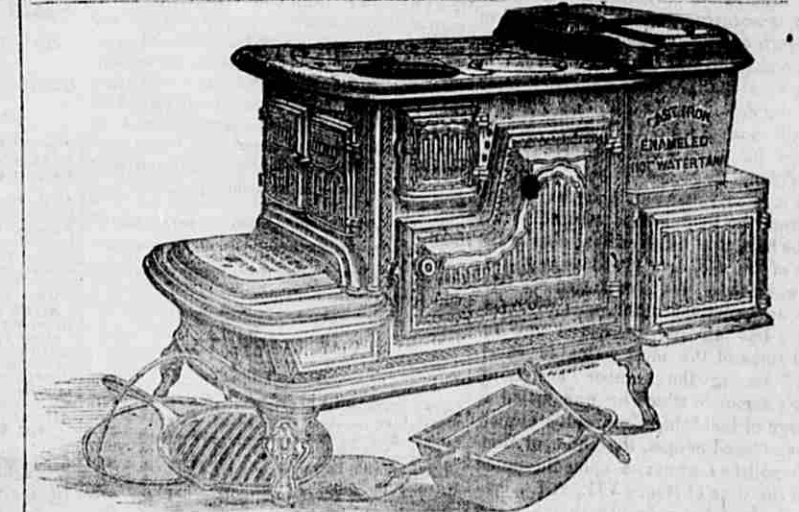
