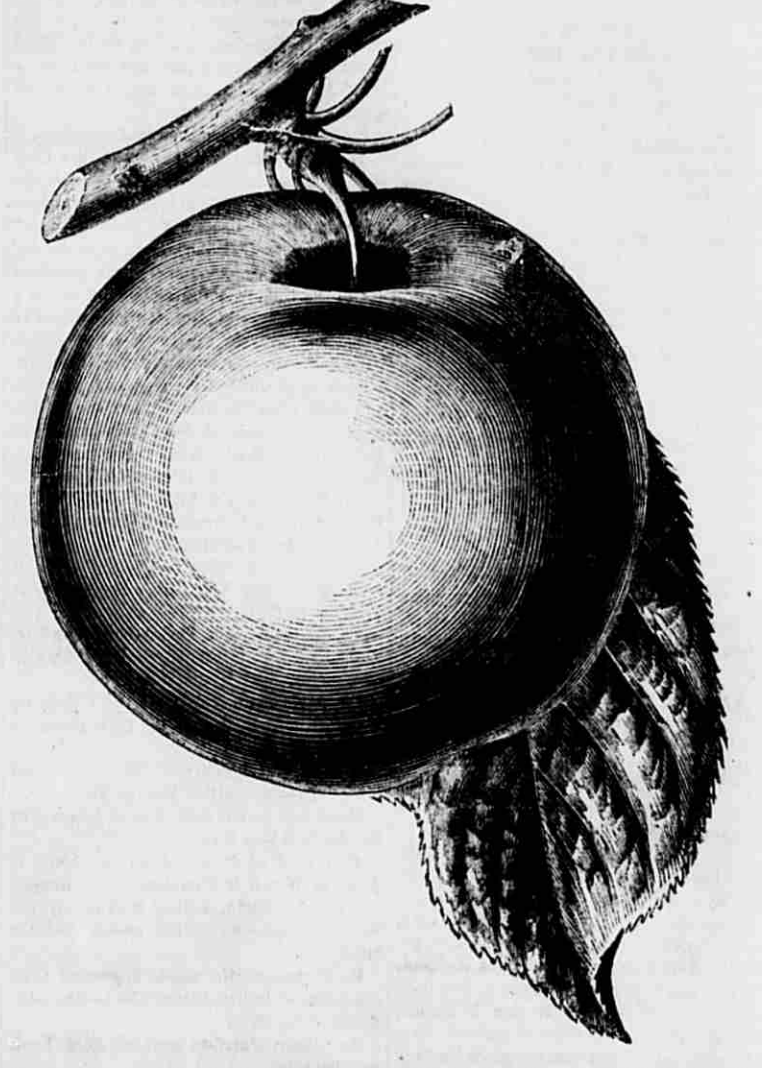

The Largest Diamond.

The English papers announce that a diamond weighing 288 carats has been found at the Cape of Good Hope. Its color is a bright yellow, and its shape is good, though a few slight scratches are noticed on the surface. What value experts will assign to the jewel still remains to be seen, and depends mainly on the manner in which it can be polished. Its weight is greater than any known diamond. The great Russian diamond weighs only 193 and the Pitt only 136 carats. The Kohinoor weighed originally 800, but was reduced by a Venetian jeweler to 779 carats, and lost in 1852 a year after the London exhibition no less than 176 1/2 carats, so that it at present weighs only about 102 carats. The importation of diamonds from the Cape has much depreciated the ordinary diamonds. The large ones, on the other hand, still retain their value.
