Mrs. Cooney, mother of the Very Rev. Father Cooney, died in Monroe last Wednesday at the advanced age of 103 years. The hospital connected with the State Public School at Coldwater, was burned between 5 and 6 o'clock, Thursday morning. The fire originated from a defective chimney. Loss about \$1,500; no insurance. A block of wooden buildings in Owosso was destroyed on the 18th inst. by fire. It originated in F. R. Cokely's store room, and a meat market, harness shop, store room, private house occupied by one Schmeinkburg, and three saloons were burned. The Press office was saved, though it required great exertions. The loss is reported at \$5,000 with no insurance. Hon. G. G. B. Yeckley, member of the Lower House for the Second District of Van Buren County, died at his residence in Hamilton, near Decatur, on Thursday the 18th inst., of typhoid pneumonia. He was one of the prominent men of the county, and his many friends throughout the State will deeply deplore his demise. He was forty-five years of age. From our daily exchanges we learn of the arrest and imprisonment of one C. L. Alden, who is assailed with the charge of having debauched eighteen girls between ten and thirteen years of age, while employed as their tutor in Warren, Macomb county, about eighteen months ago. When exposure became imminent, Alden fled, and all efforts made to secure him proved futile. A few days ago a young man named Kaitz, a brother of one of the victims, came out of the lumber woods, and on his way home stopped at West Branch. On entering a saloon he saw Alden seated at a table smoking, and knew him at a glance as he was formerly well acquainted with him. But Alden, who now went by the name of Smith, did not recognize Kaitz. Kaitz ascertained that he was likely to remain at West Branch some time if unmolested and went to Mt. Clemens and procured a warrant which he placed in the hands of the sheriff. The sheriff arrested him last Thursday, and he is now confined in Mt. Clemens jail. Alden is a man of ability and education; a linguist and a musician.
