In 1864 he was appointed a Brigadier General for gallant and meritorious services at the battles of Winchester, Fisher's Hill, and Cedar Creek. In the spring of 1865, he was in command of an expedition against Lynchburg, when the war closed, and iv honor of his distinguished services, he was brevetted major general. While he was engaged with Sheridan in the famous campaign in Shenandoah Valley he was elected to Congress from the Second Cincionnati district, and re-cleeted in 1866. He was ever an able and highly valued supporter of the principles of the Republican party. In 1867 this party, in Ohio, by general acclaim non-mated him for the governorship. There were many complications in this election, the community being greatly agitated and divided by the neuro sufferage complications in this election, the community being greatly agitated and divided by the negro suffrage question. Gen. Hayes, who had won much esteem by his dignified bearing during the conflict, was elected by a 3,000 majority, and in 1869 he was elected by an increased majority. Gov.
