Tilden as a Legislative Shirk. Tilden's record as a member of the New York Legislature has been overhauled by a correspondent of the New York Times.

A leading Democratic paper in Nebraska, the Lincoln Daily Globe, says: "To-day we hoist the name of Hayes, whom we will support for President in preference to Tilden."

Gov. Noyes gives the latest and best version of the "bloody shirt" in his speech at Rochester the other evening. "Well, gentlemen, it was no disgrace to Rutherford B. Hayes to wear the bloody shirt when the rebel bullet went crashing through his blood and bone, and broken arm hung by his side, as he led his brave boys on."

Tilden recently paroled and restored to citizenship Joseph Simmons alias "Peppermint Joe," a hotel sneak-thief, John J. Mullin, a highway robber, James O. Chambers, convicted of assault with intent to kill, and Joseph Matthews, who had been condemned to be hung for murder, but was afterwards sentenced to imprisonment for life.

The Democratic idea of political morality is well represented by a story which is told in Hartford. It is said that when the Connecticut delegation to the Democratic National Convention reached St. Louis they were at once seized upon by the anti-Tilden men from New York, who used every argument against his nomination.

The Democrats who were jubilant at the withdrawal of Mr. Orth from the Republican ticket in Indiana, have stopped laughing very suddenly since the appearance of Gen. Benjamin Harrison at the head of the ticket.

There were, as usual, three great appropriation bills—the general appropriation, the Supply bill, and the Canal bill. Each of these involved millions of dollars.

There was an amendment of the State constitution, to secure reform in the State Prison management. Tilden dodged all votes on that.

One of the great measures of the session was the ratifying by the State of New York of the Fifteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

As beautiful but as empty a soap bubble, is the way the Brooklyn Argus, a democratic paper, characterizes Tilden's letter.

If the man on the fence stays there till he has read and digested Gov. Tilden's letter he won't get down in time to vote.

The soft-money editor, as he finishes at the close of the second day his perusal of Gov. Tilden's letter lays it down quietly, rubs his weary head, and soliloquizes: "Why, I wouldn't have taken that 'r, w, after all!"

And here is another! Simeon K Wolf, of Salem, Ind., elected to Congress by the Democracy of the New Albany District, in 1872, has come out squarely for Hayes and Wheeler and will take the stump for the Republican ticket.

The Toronto Globe speaking as one of the "outside world," says: "The outside world was naturally curious to see upon what terms Tilden, with his hard money notions, and Hendricks, with his much-abused rag baby, could row in the same boat. The result may provoke a smile if not a jeer."
