It is observed that people on the fence are tapping their toe a little on the Hayes side.

A carefully revised summary of the gubernatorial vote in Vermont gives Fairbanks 20,732 majority.

A great excursion from Toledo to Niagara Falls, filling 30 cars panned out 744 for Hayes and 264 for Tilden.
