There are 30,000 colored members in the Methodist churches at Baltimore. Forty Boston milk dealers have been prosecuted for selling adulterated milk. An Oregon merino buck yielded 39 1/2 pounds of wool at its shearing the other day.

The head waiter of the Hotel Wellesley at Wellesley, Mass., is a Congregational minister. A successful steam car is in use on the Third avenue street railway in New York. For the daily supply of the British metropolis about 5,000 live bristlers were sent to London market.

The annual crop of tobacco of the United States is about 420,000,000 lbs., two thirds of which is exported. It has now come to light that Tweed paid the sheriff \$75 a week for his board while in Ludlow street jail. Judge Hillyon is said to be a man of very ordinary calibre and owes everything he has to the dead millionaire, Stewart.

E. B. Ward's executor advertises to sell a large quantity of Chicago property belonging to the estate, on the 21st inst. President Hayes and family will summer at the Soldiers' home, near Washington. Hayes is devoted to croquet and lawn tennis. Hops are pronounced usually free from vermin this year, but whether this will change the taste of beer is not explained.

A vocal contest was recently held at Kloten, in the canton of Zurich, in which a thousand voices took part. The winner had a banquet, and on the morrow evened the number were dead and 608 were ill. The wine vendor was acquitted, but the man who supplied the cantables was sentenced to three years imprisonment.

A proposition is under consideration for the erection of small spinning mills in the south, costing from \$2,000 to \$5,000, and propelled by water power. It is thought if the south by means of such little mills could secure its own supply of cotton yarn, selling it only in that shape, she would add greatly to her prosperity. An exploration of Great Salt Lake shows that its depth is 36 feet.

In the New York Postoffice.—Owing to the general suspension of business in New York on Friday (the Fourth) and also on Saturday, the delivery of three days' mail Monday morning was something extraordinary. The amount of letters aggregated over 250,000, all which 350,000 went through the boxes, and over 200,000 were taken by the carriers. One carrier had no less than 6,000 letters, weighing 100 pounds even after he had delivered 2,000 letters to one person. The collectors were called in to assist the delivery carriers, and the immense mail was distributed in about the same time as is required on ordinary days. Postmaster James' statement for the quarter ending June 30 shows that the receipts from all sources were \$722,481 61; the expenditures, \$304,225 56. The balance carried to the order of the United States government was \$418,255 95. The revenue was paid principally from the sale of postage stamps, envelopes and postal cards.

Which has shown itself the master in this matter, the south or the north? We will then sponge out the bastard amendments, and all the unconstitutional laws and statutes that appertain thereto; knock the "nation" in the head; crack the free school system wide open; and inculcate the whole country with southern ideas.




