



May 13.—In the Senate the president pro-tem, laid before the Senate a communication from the Secretary of the Interior recom-mending the appropriation of \$67,90 to cover deficiencies in the appropriation for salaries and commissions of registers and receivers of land offices for the facal year ending June 33, 1880. Referred.

Mr. Voorhees (Dem., Ind.) submitted a reso-lution directing the Secretary of the Interior to report to the Senate the names of all the railroad corporations in the United States to whom grants of land have been made by cem-pliance with the terms of the grants within the time specified thereir; also the number of sores of uncarned land claimed by each of such railroad corporations, and the period of time when their right to them expired under the limitation contained in the same grants.




