MISCELLANEOUS. The official returns of the census super-visors give Boston a population of 363,-565, an increase of 71,066 in ten years. A decided shock of earthquake was felt at Ottawa at 2 o'clock Thursday morning, accompanied by a loud rumb-ling noise.

An examination made by physicians showed the following result: Pulse 72, temperature 98, respiration 16, and weight 1314.

The Mormons celebrated their first entrance into the Salt Lake valley, 33 years ago Saturday, with the usual elaborateness. Good order prevailed and the discipline of an army was everywhere apparent. A procession embracing 10 brass military bands, representing "sentiments and ideas," agricultural and horticultural products, trades, industries and manufactures, was an hour in passing and was witnessed by from 10,000 to 20,000 specta-

tors.

The official census of the second district of Kansas, comprising the 50 western counties, gives a population of over 335, 000, an increase of 275,000 since 1870. The census of the entire state will probably show a population of 1,000,000.

Deckman, one of their number, shot through the abdomen. Sunday afternoon a party, said to number 200, again attacked the camp, and a most desperate fight followed, ending in breaking up the meeting. It is thought that some of the colored people were killed, but they dispersed so rapidly that the facts could not be gathered. No arrests have been made.
