Health in Michigan. Reports to the State Board of Health by fifty-eight observers in different parts of the State for the week ended June 22 indicated that influenza, bronchitis, remittent fever and erysipelas increased, and diphtheria, measles and indigestion decreased in area of prevalence. Diphtheria was reported at twelve places, scarlet fever at seventeen, typhoid fever at five, and measles at six places.
