





NEW ORLEANS, March 16.—In re-sponse to a pullished call signed by 100 of the leading citizens a mob of infuri-ated men broke into the parish prison Saturday morning and lynched cleven of the Italians who were acquitted on Friday of the assassination of Chief of Police Hennessy. The victims were: Antonio Scoffedi, Joseph Nas-sea. Pietro Monastero, James Caruao, Rocco Gerael Frank Romero, Antonio Marchesi, Louis Tra-hia, Loretto Comites, Antonio Bagnesto, Man-nel Polite. their power. 


