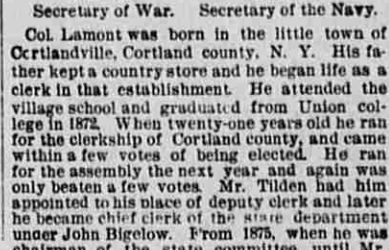
Grover Cleveland Inaugurated as President—His Address—Short Biographical Sketches of the New Cabinet.

"MY FELLOW CITIZENS: In obedience to the mandate of my countrymen I am about to dedicate myself to their service under the sanction of a solemn and deeply revered oath.

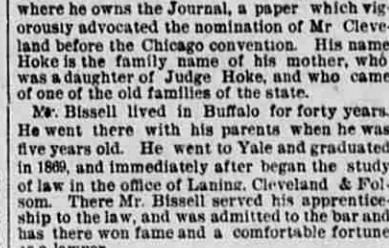
