## THE WORLD'S FAIR.

A Review of the First Three Months of the Season.

419-The Number in Attendance Growing Larger Daily-How the Finances Stand.

### A GOOD RECORD.

CHICAGO, July 29.—One-half of the term of the World's Columbian exposition is past. The buildings in Jackson park were opened to the people of the world May 1. Wednesday was the eighty-third open day of the fair and the end of the first half of the exposition. I'he last day of the fair will be October 30. It will end, as it began, on Monday. The question of Sunday opening is not being mooted now as it was and there is no likelihood of another open Sunday during the continuance of the fair. Since May 1 there have been eight Sundays when Jackson park was accessible to visitors.

THE FIRST HALF. the last half, declare the commissioners, will be greater From May 1 to July 26, inclusive, 8.226,852 persons passed through the turnstiles at the entrances to the world's fair. Of this multitude 6,115,419 paid admission and 2,411,433 went into the grounds on

THE GREATEST DAY. July 4 was the greatest day in the history of the fair. From early morning until late at night every mode of transit to the exposition grounds was taxed to its utmost capacity. At night, the lake front, where the best view of the fireworks could be obtained, was a solid mass of humanity. The count of the heads said 324,342 persons had passed through the turnstiles. Those who paid admission numbered 283,273 and those who came in on passes 41,069. TOTAL ADMISSIONS.

The total number of admissions in June was more than twice the number in May. The total for June was 3,577,-644, while the total for May was only 1,505,504.

## DETROIT BANKS ARE SOUND. A Gratifying Condition of Affairs Shown

by Their Report. WASHINGTON, D. C., July 20.-Comptroller of the Currency Eckels is much gratified that the national banks of Detroit show by their official statement, just printed, that they are actually improving their condition in spite of the commercial depression and bank failures throughout the country. Their percentage of reserve, which is a sort of barometer in banking, has now increased to 24.80 per cent., which is a gain of over 2 per cent. since the May

The principal features of the present abstract are the two items of loans and words, the Detroit banks have called in Middlesboro, Ky., July 29.—The loans to the extent of over \$2,250,000 in two months. This is an almost unprecedented reduction in loans, and the treasury officials say that while it has the effect of making the banks safer, it must tighten money in business channels at Detroit.




