

The fall of Paris is now an event daily expected. To attempt to imagine the throbbing of that great heart of France, is needless.

The history of that city during the past few months, is marked indelibly on the minds of the people of many nations. Gradually approaching the end, the contest we hope will soon be over. Germany engaged in the conflict feeling that the result received from France was sufficient provocation. In this she deserved and had the sympathy of other nations.

War commenced. The month of August was marked with Prussian victories and French defeats. Sept. 1st commenced with all advantage in favor of the Prussians. The next day followed the capitulation of the French army, and surrender of the Emperor. Next in order was the uprising in Paris. The Empire was declared at an end, and a Republic proclaimed.

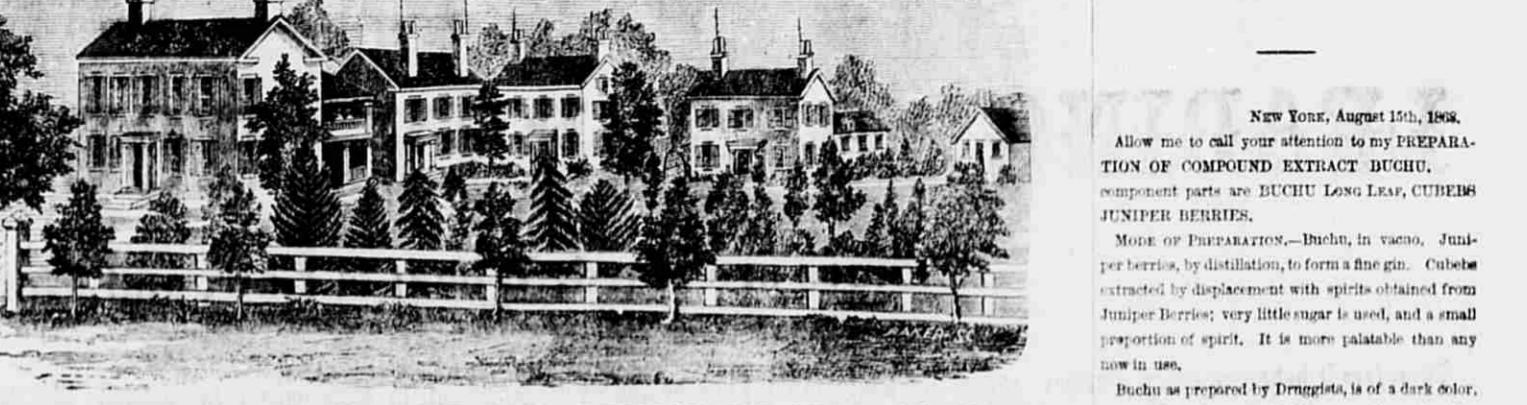

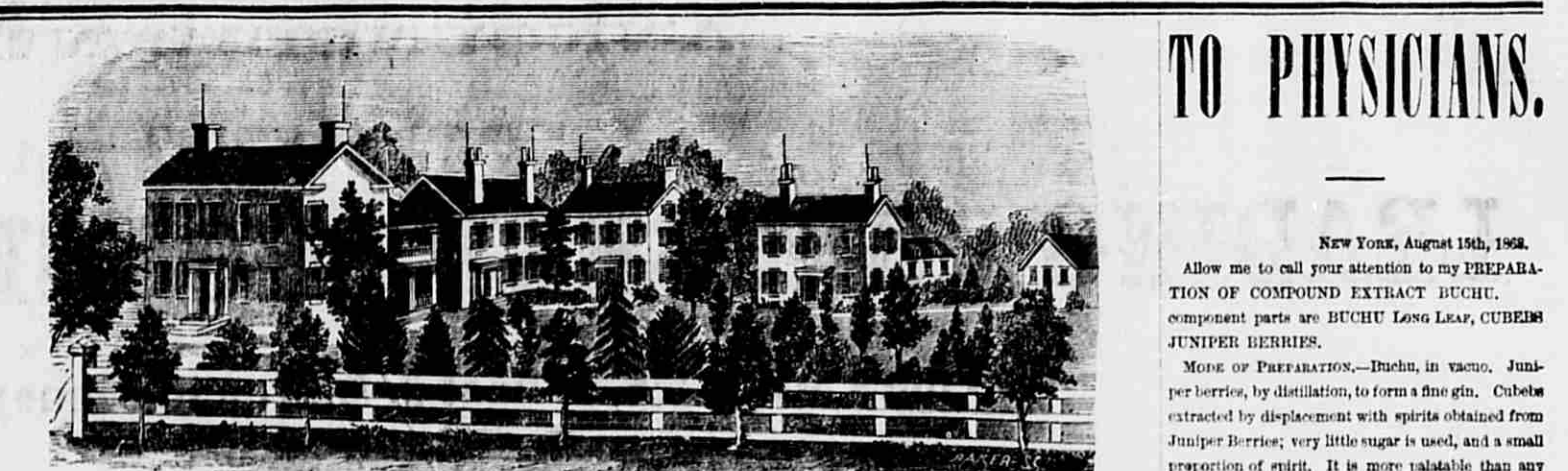
