the Governor's Message before our readers this week, although most of them have, undoubtedly, read it be-

It is a lengthy document and deals with many questions of importance to - the people of the State.

.It shows that the general prosperity of the State and its increase of population during the past two years, have been most satisfactory, that the development of the great material resources of the State and the increase of its material wealth, have been gratifying. The educational system of the State has kept steady pace with its increase of population and material growth. Of the condition of the University and Agricultural College, the Governor speaks in high terms.

He recommends appropriations for the erection of an additional structure to the present Insane Asylum for the benefit of male patients alone, leaving the present Asylum building wholly for female patients.

The condition and working of the State Prison and Reform School is in the highest degree satisfactory. He recommends however, an appropriation for the enlargement of the prison, also, believes the Agent and other officers of the institution are not at present sufficiently paid for their ser-

During the last two years, State Lands have been disposed of under existing laws to number nearly 600,-000 acres.

The Governor suggets the re-compilation of the statutes of the State. and recommends an appropriation of \$100,000 for the year of 1872, toward the construction of a new Capitol building and State offices. He also recommends that a Board of Commissioners be appointed to pris cure plans and specification for a new Capitol, and that the work of erecting these buildings be proceeded to. when approved under such directions as the Legislature may determine.


