THE SITUATION.

The bombardment of Paris is being vigorously continued, with all advantages in favor of the Germans.

The French have become dissatisfied with Gen. Trochu and demand that a change be made which will give them a fighting man in his stead.

On the morning of the 13th inst. one of the most desperate and bloody battles was fought between the armies under Prince Charles Frederick and Gen, Chanzy.

Sixty thousand men were engaged on each side, and the fighting was kept up from 9 a. m. until 5 o'clock in the afternoon, when the whole French Army of the Loire began to retreat. The slaughter was fearful. Fifteen thousand French soldiers fell during the engagement.

The Germans are evidently in carnest and intend the contest shall soon be closed.

LANSING

The proceedings of the State Legislature thus far, have not been of special importance. The committees have been appointed and are just getting fairly at work.

On the 11th, Senator Ball intro duced a bill to amend the law relating to the incorporation of Water-Power Companies, which was referred to the committee on incorporations ; also a bill to secure free schools in the city of Grand Rapids, which was referred to the Committee on Public Instruction.

In the Blouse, Mr. Ifill' introduced a bill to incorporate the village of Rockford, Kent Co., which was referred to the Committee on Banks and Incorporations.

On the 14th Sen. Sheley of Detroit introduced a bill to establish a State department of Insurance. Referred to Committee on Insurance.

Senator Cravath introducad a bill establishng a State Board of Health, to consist of seven members, whose terms of office shall be six years. Six of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, and the seventh to be elected by the others. Referred to the Committee on State Affairs.

Of the 34 Senators of the State, 8 are Lawyers, 5 Merchants, 4 Farmers. 4 Lumbermen, 4 sundry "pursuits," 2 Druggists, 1 Banker, 1 Miller, 1 Editor, (poor fellow,) and one real estate dealer.
