THE LAST OF RUFOFF.

Rufoff was hung in Binghampton, last week Thursday at 11-30. A. M. He died without the least sign of repentance but on the contrary possessed to the last the same firmness and wickedness of heart he had ever exhibited. He dressed himself without any assistance, for the final scene, and at 11-20 attended by the sheriff and other officers, he entered the yard.

There were present about 200 persons who held permits to witness the hanging. After the death warrant had been read, the sheriff asked the prisoner if he had anything to offer in his defense. He replied in the negative. The prisoner replied in the affirmative. He then asked if he desired any further delay and received a negative reply again, whereupon the signal was given and the prisoner was hung on the gallows until dead. The body was placed in a coffin in care of the prisoners counsel by request of the former to await the orders of Rufoff's brother in regard to the disposition of the remains.

THE PREMIER publication of the treaty of Washington has caused a general stir among the interested and curious, and the matter is being investigated. Several prominent Senators have been accused through different sources, of furnishing copies of the treaty to certain papers for publication, before the proper time had arrived, but nothing has yet been proved to implicate any of them.

MARSHALL JEWELL was last week Tuesday formally installed as Governor of Connecticut, and the distinguished political breeze of that State will again be quizzed, it is hoped.

It is now generally believed by both parties that he was fairly elected to the seat he now occupies, and that the practice of fraud on the part of the supporters of the Democratic nominee—English—has been the cause of all the political disturbance of that State during the contest of the late election.

"THE WORK OF OUR LEGISLATURE IN ITS LAST SESSION."—Foremost stands the exalted "amendment to the Liquor Law" which not only adds credit to the "Legislature," but tells of the strides onward that the "Temperance Cause and Order" are making towards the ultimate overthrow of the throne of "King Alcohol," and the establishment of an Imperial throne where Virtue, Purity and Temperance shall reign in all her strength and efficacy. Already is the power of this Amendment felt, and known, cases have been brought to justice under it, and no sooner is the decision proclaimed than its echo is heard in all parts of the State.

Great pains have heretofore been taken, and munificent and noble provisions made, to diffuse the measure of knowledge, and to render instruction to all; but, perhaps, no move was ever taken which has, or will accomplish more than the coercive popular instruction—the duty of parents to send children to school, which our Legislature in its last session forced by law.

And now it becomes being laws of justice, and as citizens of Lowell truly working by the law to see that this work is carried out in our midst, to the very extremity and aid of the law.

Disorder.—Loud is the tumult in the City of St. Clair. There are the demonstrations in Port Huron, a fight between the two over the "old bone" which place shall be the County Capital.

In the meantime Court is in session at Port Huron, that place being the home of the Circuit Judge and Judge of Probate. The Sheriff and County Clerk, belong to St. Clair and have such a fond affection for their native home, that they have refused to proceed to Port Huron to act in their official capacity there, so long at least as St. Clair is the County site, as they contend. Here is the difficulty. One party claims the removal of the Capital to Port Huron, a fact the other party says its a farce. The end is not yet.

STATE NEWS.

Most of the railroads in this State are issuing new time tables.

The mosquito season has been successfully inaugurated at Jackson.

Track laying has commenced on the railroad from Lansing to Detroit. Harvey Gearhart, of M'uir, was drowned in the Maple River last Sunday.

It is proposed to build a ponton bridge across the sink-hole on the Air Line.

Ann Arbor has it is said, more marriageable girls than any other city of its population in the State.

Benjamin D. and Margaret Compton of Dowagiac were divorced March 20th, and April 30th were married.

A Jackson man is trying to obtain cheap notoriety from the fact that he has not combed his hair in 18 years.

Mr. Barnard, of Benzonia, has been appointed by the Government Interpreter to the Indians in the far West.

The annual races at the Riding Park of the Horse Association of Charlotte come off June 6, 7, 8 and 9.

Henry Johnson, recently arrested near Olivet for bigamy, has been sent to Jackson for two years by the Van Buren Circuit.

The semi-annual meeting of the State Association of the Grand Army of the Republic will be held in Jackson July 20th.

A young lady at Hancock insisted on making a pension of her month, and is now industriously engaged in digging a bent line.

The Jackson Citizen says that last week 177 open cars, loaded with lumber, passed over the Jackson, Lansing and Saginaw Railroad.

A new post office, called Bismarck, has been established in the town of Sunfish, about six miles north of Vermilion, Eaton county.

Hon. Thomas B. Church, of Grand Rapids, has finally been employed to conduct the case on the part of the plaintiff in the Vanderpool trial.

Grand Rapids burglars have reached the lowest depths of brutal degradation. They tried to go through an editor's premises the other night.

President Angell has accepted an invitation to be present at the coming commencement at Ann Arbor, June 28th, and will be inaugurated at that time.

The Mansfield Railroad is a certainty in Allegan county, the full amount of funds necessary having been raised. Work of grading has been commenced.

Seven up is the fashionable dissipation at Portage Lake. The editor of the Mining Gazette gravely says "it is played, we believe, with what are called cards."

A payment to the Holly, Wayne and Monroe Railroad was robbed of several thousand dollars on the D. & M. R. R. between Detroit and Holly, on Monday.

The Michigan Publishers Association holds its annual meeting at Bay City on the second Tuesday of June next. A steamboat trip to Mackinaw is expected.

Wm. H. Ernst, formerly of Jackson, but more recently a resident of Washington, has been appointed Superintendent of the Fort Wayne, Jackson and Saginaw Railroad.

The incendiary youth who set a Jackson newboy on fire was fined \$3. If he had stolen an old rusty gun-barrel he would have been sent to the Reform School until 21 years of age.

Arrangements are making at Kalamazoo, for a big celebration of Memorial Day on the 30th of May. Last Saturday evening a large meeting was called and committees chosen to arrange matters.

The injunction against the Peninsular Railway, procured by Mr. Geo. H. Russell, a contractor, who sued to recover a large claim has been dissolved by mutual consent, a settlement having been reached.

Mr. L. Tussing, who was crushed by a large boulder on his farm in Rives township, Jackson Co. on the 1st, and held in the excavation for seven hours before being released, died on the 10th, having suffered great agony since the accident.
