The quality of the tear generally depends upon the age of the leaves, the youngest of which are the best. The carliest leaves are called Itziban, those of the second harvest Niban, and those of the third harvest Sanban. The finest qualities are ground to powder and so stored up. Four qualities of Niban are distinguished. The Sanban sorts are similar to the tea exported by China to Europe. The last quality, which is consumed by mechanics and peasants, is called Bantsjaa, and it suffers no change when exposed to the air, while with the better sorts the contrary is the case. 


