Death of Jas. Fish, Jr. Col. James Fish, was shot on Saturday, by Edward Stokes, and died Sunday morning. The cause of the shooting was the pending Fish-Mansfield libel suit, in which Stokes had been closely cross-questioned, and an indictment found against him. He was arrested and lodged in jail. The will of the murdered man, which was made a few hours before his death, gives Mrs. Hooker, his sister, \$100,000 in Narragansett Steamship Company's shares. His father and mother are \$2,000 a year each. To each of the two Misses Moore bequeathed \$2,000, and to the Ninth Regiment \$11,000. To his wife he bequeathed the balance of his property of all kinds. His funeral took place at Brattleborough, Vt. yesterday.

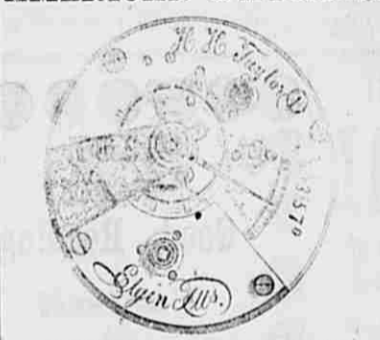
