Gen. Sherman, Lieut. Grant and other Americans have been looking over the ruins of Pompeii. The report of the directors of the Detroit and Milwaukee Railroad Company, with statement of accounts, etc., to the 31st of December, 1871, has just been issued.

The bond held of the company, including preference shares and ordinary stock, is \$10,213,227.75. The actual cost of the line up to Dec. 31st, 1871, has been \$11,797,742.48, of which amount \$1,264,881.98 has been provided for out of revenue since the re-organization in October, 1860.

A comparative statement of expenditures (excluding Lake Michigan portion) and expenditures, for the former 1870 and 1871, shows that in the former year the receipts were \$1,421,122.63, and the expenditures \$917,890.47, or 64.58 per cent. of the receipts, leaving a balance of \$503,232.16; while in the latter year the receipts were \$1,507,813.74, and the expenditures \$565,663.16. It will thus be seen that while the expenditures for the year just closed are larger than were for the preceding year, the revenues have increased at a greater ratio.

After much loud talk in the Senate Sumner's resolution to investigate the sale of arms to France, has passed. It is evident that Mr. Sumner has his eye on another "sign," and that his resolution for this investigation, means more so than merely its "common significance." 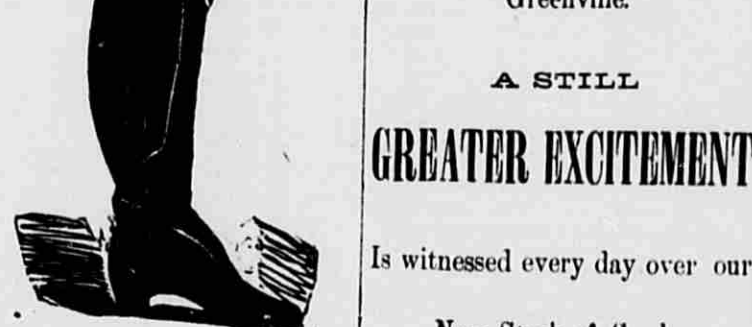

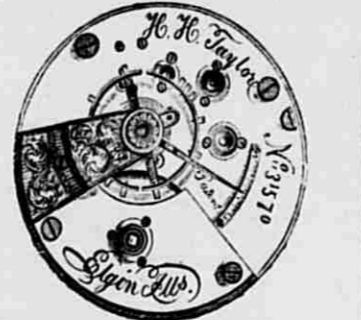
