Language and Alphabets.

It is said that the various nations of the earth speak about eighty-three different dialects; but these can be traced to a much smaller number of languages, which again are all referred by philosophers to three classes.

Of modern languages, the Chinese is the most difficult; Latin the softest; Spanish the most pompous; French the most polite and passionate; and the English the most copious and energetic.

The English alphabet contains 26 letters; French 25 ; Hebrew, Chaldean and Syriac, 22; Greek 24; Latin 25; Spanish and Slavonie, 27; Italian 20; Arabic and Sancrit 28; Persian 31; Turkish 36; Coptic 32, Muscovite 43; Dutch 26; Ethiopie 222; Bengal 21;

Brachman 19. The French language bas about thirty-two thousand words, the Spanish thirty thousand, and the Italian

thirty-five thousand. The English consists of about forty thousand words, and is continually increasing its stock. It contains about twenty thousand Saxon words nine thousand of Latin or Norman origin, and about fifteen hundred of Greek derivation; together with German, Welsh, Spanish, Danish, Ara-

bie, Hebrew, &c. In English, the scientific words are mostly from the Greek ; terms of art from the Frenck, Latin and Italian ; and names of places and rivers mostly from the Saxon.
