The races at Kalamazoo last week, were not so largely attended as those previously held at that place. The people are waiting for the Lowell races to see who takes the largest premiums. The citizens of Greenville are making it lively for the liquor sellers of that city. There seems to be a general waking up among the cold water people. Is it strange? Frank was taken into custody by officer Converse, and lodged in jail at Ionia. The boys were about 18 years of age, and it is a sad occurrence for themselves, their families and friends.

The Republican National Convention met at Philadelphia, on the 5th inst. and concluded its labors on the following day.

Grant was unanimously re-nominated for President, by acclamation, and Henry Wilson, was nominated for Vice President on the first ballot.

The manner in which Gen. Grant was endorsed by the Convention, clearly proved that he is wanted for another four years by, at least, the small (7) portion of the people.

Grant out to grass, on the 31st of May. Let the Republican party thank Summer for the result of his attack on the Administration.

Grant was elected to the office of President, and had not the question of locality been an argument against his nomination, he would undoubtedly have been chosen again for the Vice Presidency.

Hon. Wm. A. Howard, in announcing the vote of Michigan in the Philadelphia Convention, said: Michigan gave 22 votes and not an official among them.
