The Natural Bridge. While the mighty Niagara is ceaselessly thundering forth the teachings of the glorious works of nature, the Natural Bridge, in Virginia, speaks no less emphatically, in its silent, awful grandeur, of the omnipotence of nature's God.

But while Niagara is thronged with its crowds of fashionable pleasure seekers, the Natural Bridge is visited only by a scattering few worshippers of nature.

The first sight of the stupendous arch, as you wind around the rugged path that leads to the bottom of the ravine, fills one with a feeling of awe and surprise, which approaches almost to fear.

In the company of our guide, Mr. Lear (who, by the way, keeps the hotel in connection with the bridge, and is a most affable and pleasing gentleman), we spent over an hour under the arch, as though it had been but fifteen minutes, and when time called us away we were loth to leave a place so sublime, and as it seemed, almost sacred.

Mr. Lear pointed out some curiosities in the rock forming the arch, the most noticeable of which is the eagle with spread wings, formed by the parti-colored rock.

The names of numerous reckless aspirants for fame are seen, engraved in the hard and almost impenetrable rock.

Our guide told us what we were glad to hear; that he was satisfied, from reading history, that George Washington was never so foolish as to hazard his life in the attempt to inscribe his name, as the story has it, above all others in the rock; though he pointed out to us the marks—now nearly effaced—that were said to form the initials G. W.

His explanation was that George Washington must have been at least thirty eight years old, and probably older when he first visited the bridge; and he was unwilling to believe that the Father of his Country, at that age, would attempt so rash and unwise an undertaking.

The bridge is not merely a magnificent work of nature without utility or practical worth, but affords a crossing to a large country of ravine that would otherwise have to be bridged at great labor and expense, there being no other crossing for vehicles within five miles in either direction.

The dimensions of the vast arch are doubtless familiar to most readers, but to give an idea of its height we were told that a tree just under the edge of the arch, the height of which was 57 feet, and which appeared to reach more than half way to the top, was in reality less than one-third the distance from the bed of the ravine to the top of the arch.

The thickness of the rock over the arch is 47 feet; width of the rock under the road bed 85 feet; width of arch—across the stream—90 feet.

We repeat that all living at such an easy distance as most of our readers do from the bridge, should avail themselves of the earliest opportunity to visit it, though we would hardly advise anyone to take our mode of traveling; on horseback, at fifty miles a day.—[Amherst (Va.) Enterprise.]

NEPOTISM. General Grant has been arraigned by Sumner and other disappointed Liberalites as "the greatest nepotist of the age."

To show how groundless the charge is, we give an authenticated list of all the relatives of the President or his wife now holding office under the Government:

Frederick Grant, Lieutenant United States Army. F. T. Dent, Brigadier General U. S. Army.

Jesse R. Grant, Postmaster, Covington Ky. M. J. Cramer, Minister to Denmark.

Orlando H. Ross, Clerk Third Auditor's office. George W. Dent, Appraiser, San Francisco.

James F. Casey, Collector at New Orleans. Peter Casey, Postmaster at Vicksburg. George B. Johnson, Assessor 3d District Ohio.

Alexander Sharp, Marshal Dist. of Columbia. Silas Hudson, Minister to Guatemala.

Frederick Grant, the President's son, was a student at West Point long before his father became President.

General Dent is the President's brother-in-law, and has ever since held a commission in the army. Grant himself graduated from West Point.

With these two officials Grant has no more to do than he has with Sherman or Sheridan.

Jesse R. Grant, the President's father, was appointed by Andrew Johnson, to the office he now holds.

M. J. Cramer is a brother-in-law; was appointed to Leipsic by Johnson, and transferred by Grant to Denmark on the recommendation of Bishop Simpson, Bishop Jayne and others.

Orlando H. Ross, President's cousin, was appointed by the Secretary of the Treasury to a clerkship, through the influence of Senator Logan.

The President knew nothing of the appointment until after it was made. George W. Dent is a brother of Mrs. Grant and James F. Casey her brother-in-law.

Peter Casey is very far removed, being the brother of the brother-in-law of Mrs. Grant.

Geo. B. Johnson is also very distant relative, having married a third cousin of the President.

Both these gentlemen were appointed on the recommendations of the Representatives and Senators from the States and districts in which the appointees live, and the President had nothing more directly to do with them than to concur in the nominations.

Alexander Sharp is a relative of Mrs. Grant, and Silas Hudson is a cousin to the President.

This is a truthful statement of Gen. Grant's nepotism. The sheriff of some counties we could name has a larger list of relatives in office.

When we take into consideration the fact that most of these appointments were made by the heads of Departments, and some did not require even the approval of the President, we can see in its true light the foolishness of the charge against General Grant.

Out of sixty-three thousand offices, the President has nine civil appointments claiming relationship to him. Here is 'nepotism with a vengeance!'

We trust our friends will carry this authentic statement in their pockets, and show it occasionally to those Liberal gentlemen who are trying to make capital out of gossip and slander.
