The Good Effects of Political Agitation.

The political convulsions which occur every four years in our country have a healthy effect. The very bitterness which is born of the agitation produces good results. It excites the people into a personal investigation of national affairs, and thereby prevents official corruption from becoming organic. Official honesty is made the basis of all parties in their efforts to win public support. The best foot is put forward by the respective candidates, and each one strives to convince the people that his party, and his party alone, can advance the interests and maintain the honor of the Republic.

The people listen patiently to the claims of each, examine the facts presented, weigh the evidence, and impartially decide which party, in their judgment is best entitled to their confidence and support. This popular agitation every four years has another good effect. It puts the party in power on its good behavior. If it abuses the trust put in its keeping, the verdict of the people from which there can be no appeal, repudiates it and entrusts the Government to a party more honest and worthy. This has been the experience of parties since the formation of the Republic.

The Republican party has been in power nearly twelve years. It has retained the confidence of the people because it has been the party of justice and honesty. If dishonest officials have crept into power, as soon as their dishonesty was discovered they were at once repudiated. The party itself has remained honest. Integrity has been the rule among its officials, corruption the rare exception.

General Grant is to-day reaping the reward due his honest administration of affairs. The searching investigations which have been made into his official acts have revealed nothing that reflects on his honor as a man, or his integrity as an official. Every effort has been made that partisan ingenuity could devise to discover some weak point in his administration, but the whole line remains as impregnable as was his line in front of Vicksburg. Personal abuse has disturbed him no more than the pistol shots from Pemberton's army. Confident in his own personal political rectitude he has patiently submitted to the verdict of the people, and that verdict has already been made up in his favor, and only awaits the formal announcement in November next.

He will enter upon his second term with the pleasing assurance that he still retains the confidence and love of the American people. The lessons of this campaign in which his official integrity has been the safeguard not only of the Republican party, but of the Republic itself, will redouble his vigilance, and cause him to be even more watchful over the nation's interests.

Grand and complete as his first term has proven, we may safely predict that his second will surpass it, that its close will find the nation advanced still higher in the estimation of the world, the last vestige of sectional bitterness removed by the dawn of a reconciliation that has come to stay, our commerce enlarged every channel of domestic industry improved, our citizens still more prosperous, and the noble party of universal liberty still more strongly entrenched in the hearts of the people.
