WCUZ to sponsor Showboat benefit

The Lowell Showboat is coming out of its brief retirement for a Memorial Day weekend performance which could ease its \$45,000 debt by as much as \$15,000.

The Showboat Board of Directors and representatives from radio station WCUZ together worked out a weekend which will include a parade, a 40-team softball tournament, and a one-night performance by country singer Bobby Bare at the Showboat amphitheatre.

The event will be called the WCUZ/Budweiser Showboat

Softball Classic.

WCUZ spokesman Kevin Reynolds said Tuesday that the deal with Bobby Bare was as "good as gold." The station has already received a contract from Bare which officials expect to sign and return as soon as they have a check for him.

Bare will be performing Saturday, May 28, with proceeds from entries in the softball tournament expected to cover the cost of his appearance.

Teams for the tournament are already being solicited over the air by WCUZ, and event co-

sponsor Budweiser is putting up notices for the tournament in taverns in the Grand Rapids area.

Reynolds said that he anticipated no problem in recruiting 40 12-man teams for the double elimination tournament to be held Saturday and Sunday, May 28 and 29.

Fee for entering the tournament will be \$15 per player, with each participant receiving two tickets to the Bare performance in addition to the opportunity to play.

Three thousand additional tickets will be available for Bare

fans and Showboat supporters.

Though the Showboat Board of Directors chose to cancel this summer's Showboat performance for fear of increasing indebtedness, the Memorial Day weekend was okayed because WCUZ agreed to absorb any loss if the event is not a money-maker.

But, on the other hand, if the event shows a profit, all funds not needed to cover expenses will go to the Showboat.

Board opts for split millage proposal

Drawing on information gleaned from the post-millage election survey and meetings with area townspeople, the members of the Lowell Board of Education voted Monday night to place a split millage proposal before Lowell school district voters in June.

Board members Linda Beers, Wayne Dowling, Roger Kropf, and Chris VanAntwerp with John Haggai, James Dumas, and Mary Yost absent approved a proposal which will require separate voter approval of a 17.9 millage renewal and millage increases of 3.9, 4.1, and 4.3 mills for years 1983-5.

Taken together, the proposal is identical to the one placed be-

fore voters March 14.

Board members expressed their confidence that absent members felt as they did about the proposal.

In connection with the upcoming millage election, Superintendent Kelly announced the names of candidates for the school board. The nine candidates running are Stanley Williams, Roger Kropf, Sandy Nagy, George Blocher, Diana Fulkerson, Gary Ross, James Goulooz II, JoAnn Murphy, and Robert Kinsey.

Due to the high interest in the school board election, LEA president Tom Stahr said that the LEA would be sponsoring a "meet the candidates" night on June 6 at 7 P.M. Location for the

meeting will be announced later.

In other action, the board gave Superintendent Kelly authorization to hire additional staffing consisting of nine teachers, one library aide, and one study hall supervisor. The board also approved moving three part-time teachers to full-time status.

The additional staffing is considered necessary to implement the six-hour day this fall.

Kelly took the opportunity Monday night to commend maintenance workers at Lowell Area Schools for their efficiency and high standards.

A report submitted by head maintenance worker Clare McCaul shows that Lowell school maintenance costs com-

pare favorably to the national average in several categories.

The national average of maintenance costs per student, for example, is \$357. At Lowell the cost is \$254.

The average school maintenance worker in the U.S. is responsible for 16,000 square feet of floor space; Lowell maintenance workers clean 24,000.

Salaries also compare favorably. While the average salary for school maintenance workers is \$16,877, Lowell maintenance workers average \$13,873.

Total budget for maintenance at Lowell Area Schools is \$677,000.

A fatal shooting Thursday at a Lowell area residence was ruled as a suicide, according to Detective Sergeant Chet Bush of the Kent County Sheriff's Department.

James J. Lafey, 32, of 633 Coit NE, Grand Rapids, was pronounced dead at the scene as the result of a 4.10 shotgun blast to the neck.

The shooting occurred at approximately 2:15 P.M. Thursday at the Danny Wachu residence, 2348 Segwun.

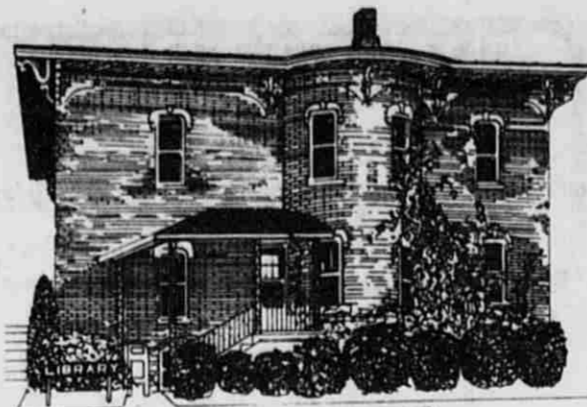

FISHING INFORMATION:
Steelhead:
When east winds prevail at the pier in Grand Haven, fishing conditions are good. Small cohos, browns and an occasional chinook are being taken.

The main stream of the Grand River has good numbers of steelhead, but high water conditions make fishing extremely difficult. Boats and heavy anchors would be required.

Tributaries such as Crockery Creek, Rogue River, Flat River, Prairie Creek, Fish Creek and the Looking Glass are the best bets right now.

Smelt: No smelt runs to report in the District at this time.

MISCELLANEOUS:
Licenses are in now and most all hunting and fishing licenses should be on sale at all licensed dealers. Remember, senior citizens get a reduced rate on licenses. You must be 65 years of age or older to qualify for senior licenses.

Dams:
This is the time of the year when we're most concerned about the safety of Michigan dams. High water, which normally occurs during late winter and early spring, is the greatest threat to the structural stability of dams. Even though there is little possibility of snowmelt causing any high water and dam failures.

Apparent danger to any of Michigan's 2,200 dams should be reported to DNR Water Management Division, telephone (517) 373-0208 during normal business hours, Monday through Friday (except on holidays). At other times, dam safety reports should go to the Pollution Emergency Alerting System (PEAS) at telephone 1-800-292-4706.

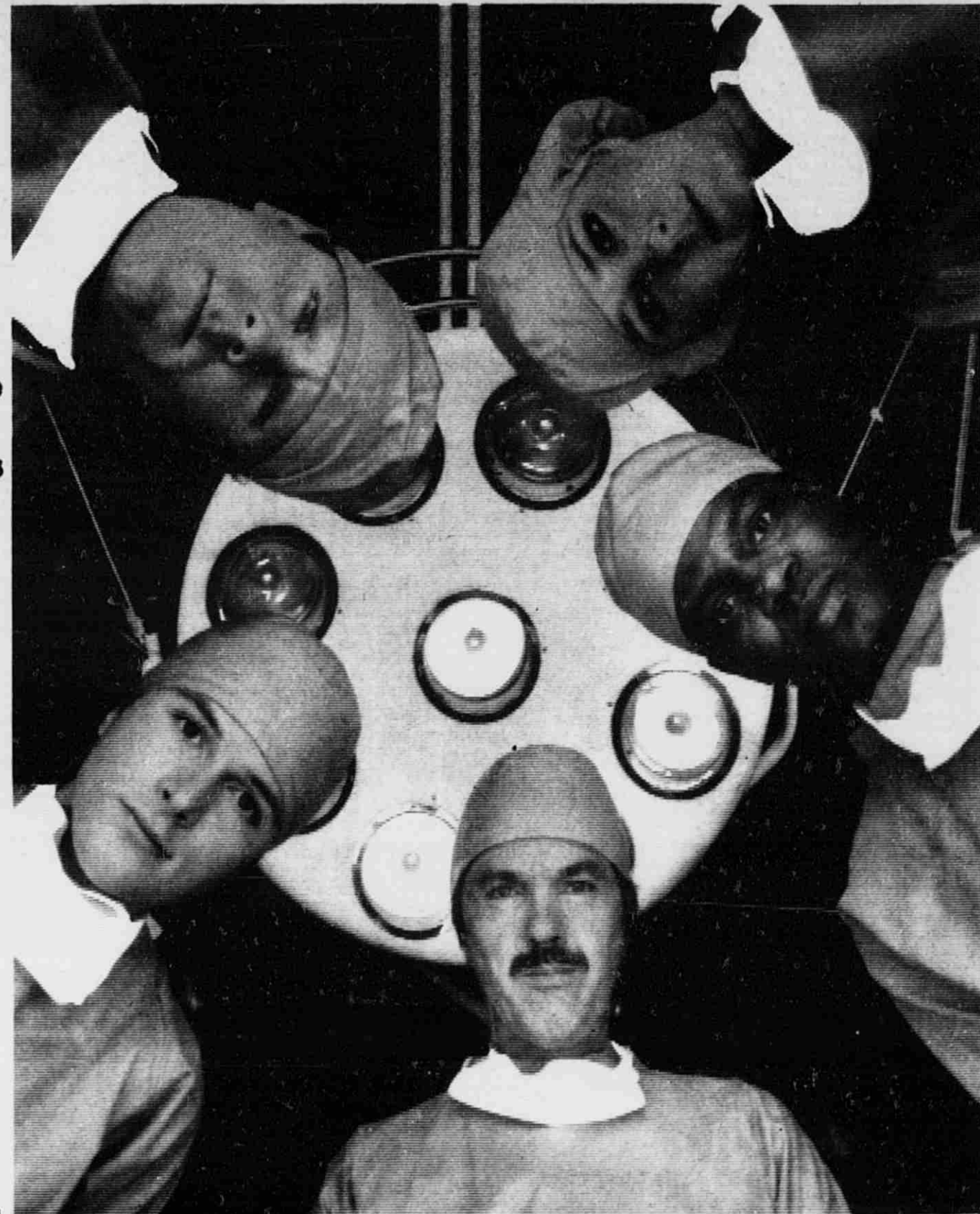

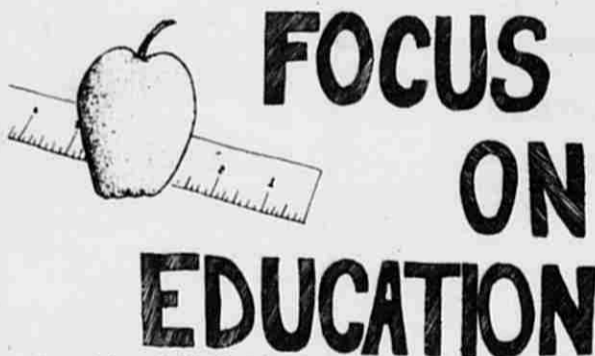
IN THE SERVICE

The winners were: Bob Rice, Dana Blohm, Pete Kemp, Doug DeVries, and Adam Buffin.

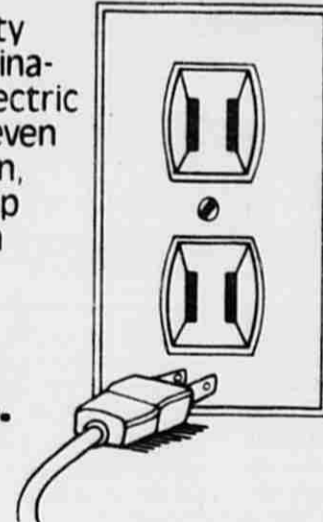
