cial crisis next year due to the cial crisis next year due to the monetary demands placed upon it by the March 14th defeat of the millage proposal, contractual increases, the additional staff needed to return to a six hour day necessary to keep Lowell High School accredidation and inflation.
If the current millage is retained without increase by the voters in the next election, the school system would run a possible $\$ 803,409$ deficit. With the

But Kuipers says that a vocational handicap may be some thing invisible -- diabetes, allergies, epilepsy, or a bad back, for example
Any of these may be an obstacle which prevents a person from obtaining work at his skill level Kuipers said he is aware o one client of MRS who had a Ph.D. in nuclear physics, and ye was vocationally handicapped.
A person accepted by the program undergoes a comprehensive evaluation to determine the extent of his handicap and to pinpoint his vocational skills, inter ests, and experience
Once the evaluation is com pleted, support services are provided to help that person reach his vocational goal. These services may include psychological counseling, vocational training, and direct placement. One-third of Kaipers caseload consisis of high schoo juniors and seniors, some of them students at Lowell.
Kuipers says that students are very responsive to the service he has 10 offer because, faced win a number of tough decisions cgarding school and career, 17 and 18 - year-oids are often unaware of the programs and services available to help them mee their vocational goals.
Students with any kind of handicap .- physical, mental. or emotional -- are often dismayed by the problems facing them:
