The action kicked off Saturday morning with the first round of the WCUZ/Bidweiser Softball Classic which was finally decide ounday in a game between Wheels Unlimited and Poor Arthur. Wheels Unlimited won the championship game 6 -0 thereby winning first place trophy and Poor Arthur 2nd and Bill's Gym Plus 3rd.

At eleven the Showboat Parade started down Main Street. Eight floats representing local organizations and businesses, clowns, fire engines, antique and new cars, horsemen, old time bicycles, the calliope and local bands all entertained young and old.

Following the parade, pylons were placed in a curving, obstacle course design down the parade route for the running of the outhouses. Pfaller's Riverside Clothing's four man team proved victorious in their caffeine powered one-holer. Jim Pfaller, Leo Pfaller, Mike Feldpausch. and Steve Feldpausch pushed and pulled their way to what was later described as a superior ability and age motivated victory. The crowds then moved down to the amphitheater boardwalk where seven contestants involved in a heated chile cook-off were simmering. hether it be on a T-shirt, bumper sticker or front license plate. every time I see the slogan, "I don't get mad, I get even", I immediately think of an experience I had while in the army. I went to Korea as an M.P. in 1971, but after six months there, our M.P. company was cut back to detachment strength, and I was out of a job. Rumor had it that most of us would be transferred to M.P. companies up north, near the de-militarized zone. Not relishing that idea. I scrambled around, and pulled a couple of strings through friends at headquarters company. I ended up getting a "cush" 8 to 5 job as a customs inspector at the hold baggage depot. It was here that I met Eric "Hutch" Hutchison, a fellow customs inspector, and probably the person for whom the "get even" slogan was coined.

Hutch and I became fast friends, and when I look back on the fun we had. I figure it should have been us paying the army. instead of the other way around.

Getting back to the "get even" incident. It all started when Hutch and I were walking back from the mess hall and had to pass by our 3star general and his aide, a captain. We saluted, but after we had passed by, the captain hollered at us to stop, and we were dressed down, chewed out, and yelled at for a good five minutes about our long hair, long sideburns, sloppy dress and disrespectful salute. whatever that meant. All the while, the 3-star general stood a few feet away. waiting for the captain to be done with us.

All officers, could, and usually did have their belongings packed at their billets, rather than bring it all into our depot for packing and shipping. On these "packs", we customs inspectors rode with the Korean freight contractors, and watched to see what went into the cartons. We got royal treatment from the officer being packed, as they wanted us to do our best to see that their cameras, stereos, china, dress uniforms, etc. all made it back to the states swiftly and

two weeks prior to when Hutch was to get out of the army, guess who came up on our pack schedule? Hutch said, "he's mine".

We could usually breeze through one or two packs in a morning or afternoon. Hutch spent two complete days on the captain's pack. He made him tear the backs off all his stereo components, turn all the pockets inside out on all his neatly folded uniforms, he even made him take apart his ball point pens to check for contraband. Hutch ran all the paperwork and box labels through as usual, with a destination to some remote sounding missle site in Utah. When he was done, he handed me the paperwork, and said, "look at this". I couldn't find anything wrong with it, so he said, "Look at his orders". I looked over the orders, and finally noticed that the good captain wasn't going to Utah, he was going to the Pentagon. I would he very surprised if the captain ever got re-united with his baggage.

Electronics revolution is changing how we spend time and money

Those personal cumputers that fit on a desk top are part of an electronics revolution sweeping into the 1980's much as televis ion swept into the 1950's. Other parts of the electronic revolution are video game units, cable television systems, videotape recorders and special cable or com-

All told, new electronic tech-

nology is changing the way people work, communicate and spend their leisure time and money, notes the Michigan Association of CPAs. Before long, there may be a computer in every home and you will be able to shop, bank and find entertainment without leaving the house. However, it is also likely that the cost of maintaining these electronic and communications "systems" in your home will be greater than what you now spend on heat and utilities. So, now is a good time to start planning your finances to take advantage of these new developments, CPAs

Before you buy a basic computer, the "hardware" that perorms computing work, consider the costs of the "software." or instructions that allow certain work to be done.

What you spend on software programs, costing from \$10 to \$500, depends on what you want to do -- from playing Pac-Man to charting your annual budget to regulating your home's lights. temperature and security system. There will be additional costs

or add-on components to perform certain tasks. A software or disc drive, which costs about \$600, feeds software programs into our computer. If you use your computer as a word processor, a printer to type out the text costs \$400 to \$800. The paper for the printer is about \$10 for 500 sheets

If your're an investor and want to use your computer to get acsess to stock and bond reports, ou'll have to buy a modem, for \$100 to \$300, to connect your computer by telephone line with a teledata service.

You can also use your telephone line and modem to connect your computer with your office, bank or other computer operators and get airline schedule information and order etail products promoted on Cable television channels

Naturally, costs for these capabilities will depend on how much you use them. One teledata service, which provides stock prices, plus news reports and even classified ads, charges a one-time subscription fee of \$100 and an hourly usage cost ranging from \$20.17 during "prime" business hours to \$5.75 n hour after midnight. Another Ervice, with stock market information, charges 90 cents a mi nute during the day and 15 cents

a minute at night. Some minor costs involved in HEALER YOUR COMPUTER ARE FOR parts like the keyboard, printer or drive, may require occasional servicing. Consider buying either a warranty extension, for \$90 to \$300 a year depending on e computer, or a maintenance contract that costs 10 to 15 percent of the price of the computer

You can also use your televison to play video games, or connected with a videotape recorder

BE A BACKYARD BEEKEEPER!

You can grow your own honey, even in the heart of a city, in the suburbs, or on Third Avenue in Smalltown, U.S.A. One MOTHER-reader did, although he lived less than two miles from downtown San Francisco. And if you're lucky, like Gregg was, you might be able to start your hive with a "free for the catching" wild swarm!

Gregg told us how he enlisted the help of a veteran beekeeper/catcher to snag his first springtime cluster of bees. The swarm had settled on a limb that protruded from a hedgerow in the parking lot of a florist's shop. The amateur apiarist set a garbage can under the churning mass of insect life, placed his hive on top of that, gritted his teeth,

and-following his instructor's directions-shook the bee-covered branch down hard. The insects dropped, still clustered, into the hive. Gregg slid the frame (a support which would later hold honeycombs) into place, put on the lid, and the swarm was his! From there it was simply a matter of waiting until the evening of the following day (to allow the bees to get used to their new house and to be sure that they'd all returned from their daytime explorations), then nailing a strip of board over the hive's entrance, and carrying his prize home.

By the time November rolled around, the city bees had provided their keeper with 50 pounds of delicious ambrosia . . . over and above the winter food supply that was left in the hive for the insects. And, by the following September, after adding some supers to the hive, the urban apiarist had harvested another 100 pounds of golden

Gregg believes that city bees can be even more productive than their country cousins. His hive, which sits on top of a large crate in the back yard, is enclosed by a sixfoot-high fence that surrounds the property. Therefore, the honey-makers are protected from overly curious children and animals (and vice versa). Furthermore, since the insects must fly high to clear the fence for foraging, they aren't particularly noticeable to next-door neighbors.

Another advantage this city dweller claims to have is the close-range availability of a steady supply of flowers for his bees to work on right up till winter. Country apiarists often have to rely on one main "honey flow" in the spring when crops and fruit trees bloom. But, since many downtown yards are landscaped with season-long ornamental blossoms, shrubs, or trees, Gregg feels his bees have a distinct advantage.



DANGER: Kite flying can be hazardous to your health

That warning does need to be imprinted on every kite sold. But youngsters should be aware of some basic safety rules when they bring their kites out of storage or try out a new one this month to take advantage of April winds, according to Harry Dam, Consumers Power Company's region electric operating and maintenance superintendent in the Central Region. Dam ad-

(1) Never climb utility poles. television or radio towers, or even a tree to retrieve a kite snagged on a power line. The major ity of accidents occur when youngsters try to disentangle a kite from an electric line. There is the possibility of being badly

(2) Use wood, paper or plastic in making a kite. Avoid wire and metal. A metallic, wire or wet string can conduct electrical current if it touches the power line. (3) Always fly a kite in wide

open areas, away from electrical

(4) Don't fly a kite in the rain. Benjamin Franklin did. to prove that lightning is electricity, but he took quite a chance with that famous experiment.

(5) If a kite snags an electrical line call the utility company Never pull on the line. One of California's worst fires ever started in that way

(6) Should an electric line fall. stand clear. Never touch it. Call the utility

(7) Keep away from busy streets and highways when flying a kite. Consumers Power company has available a 16 mm film, entitled "Overhead Lines --A Matter of Respect," for use by local schools. 

Dioxin in Michigan rivers and streams

Scientists at Michigan State University sampled carp and sucker in the major streams and rivers of Michigan and preliminary results indicate dioxin contamination in fish from those streams and rivers running through Michigan's major industrial areas. Levels measured in the edible portions (skin-on fillets) ranged from non-detectable to about 100 parts per trillion. (A part per trillion is about the same as one grain of sugar in an Olympic-size swimming pool.) The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recommends that fish containing over 50 parts per trillion not be eaten. Some fish in some localities wou'd exceed this limit. The FDA recommendation is based on eperiments on laboratory animals who were exposes to dioxin daily over a lifetime. Even if these studies are accepted, which not all scientists do, they suggest that occasional fish consumption would be unlikely to lead to adverse effects. Some concern might be justified for individuals who use fish as their only source of food. The only confirmed effect of dioxin in humans is chloranene, a skin inflammation similar to, but somewhat more serious than, the typical acne found in teenagers. Toxic effects which have been suggested from animals studies. such as liver damage, cancer, and genetic effects, have not been found in human populations nor have they been fully substantiated in animal research.

In summary, because of the possibility that effects found in laboratory animals could occur in humans, it is prudent to limit dioxin exposure. However, at the levels at which they have been found in Michigan fish, there is probably not much cause for alarm. Efforts should certainly be made to limit future contamination and to clean up that which has been found.
