## City Council balks at approving mall rezoning

The 55,800 sq. ft. mall proposed to be built west of the new apartment buildings on Lowell's West Main Street may have already caught a bit of a snag. The Lowell Planning Commission last week recommended that the City Council approve a rezoning

request by East Lansing Realty and Development Co. to grant the proposed mall property C-2 Limited Highway Commercial status, rather than its current R-3 Residence and Apartment zoning. The recommendation call for a P.U.D. (Planned Urban Development) cover which would give the city the right to review and approve plans for the mall.

The snag came at Monday night's city council meeting when council members decided to hold yet another public hearing on the rezoning request. They could have approved the rezoning right away, as the planning commission had already held a public hearing on the issue, but the council opted to

exercise their option to hold another one at their regular meeting of Monday, August 15. City Manager Ray Quada pointed out that the previous public hearing had been publicized in the newspaper, and letters had been sent to nearby property owners, as is required, but pointed out that considering the size of this project, a second public hearing might well be in order.

On hand to voice his disapproval with the rezoning proposal was Bill Hitchcock of Caledonia. Hitchcock, a realtor, along with a partner Bill Shurl, also a realtor and developer, own 28 acres just to the west of the proposed mall property. Hitchcock said that they bought the

property about two years ago with the intention of building a mall on it, and their property is already zoned C-2 in accordance with the city's master plan. Hitchcock said that he and Shurl have been waiting for the economy to improve before announcing their plans, and getting residents excited too far prior to construction. Hitchcock said that he knew this had happened two times here before with other mall proposals.

Hitchcock and Shurl built and own the new 66,000 sq. ft. mall in Caledonia, and Hitchcock says that he is very pleased with the fact that they are about 90% filled with renters now, and are currently negotiating with a na-

tional franchise business that would take the remaining space. When asked if the chances of business survival in a mall so close to the 28th Street business district were good, Hitchcock pointed to his Caledonia mall and noted that it's only nine miles from 28th Street.

Noting some of the recent retail development on the west side, Hitchcock said that it is unfortunate that they didn't have the option of going into a mall atmosphere. "Being in a mall near a big drawing card like a major food store adds at least 10 to 20% to a retailer's business, automatically", Hitchcock said.

Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones (Proverbs 16:24).

Sybil was helping prepare breakfast. She looked up suddenly from the toast she was buttering and exclaimed, "I like soft butter! I don't like hard butter! It tears holes in the toast!"

It was our usual custom to keep a portion of butter out of the refrigerator. But on this morning there was none available at room temperature. Therefore, Sybil was finding it difficult to prepare the toast.

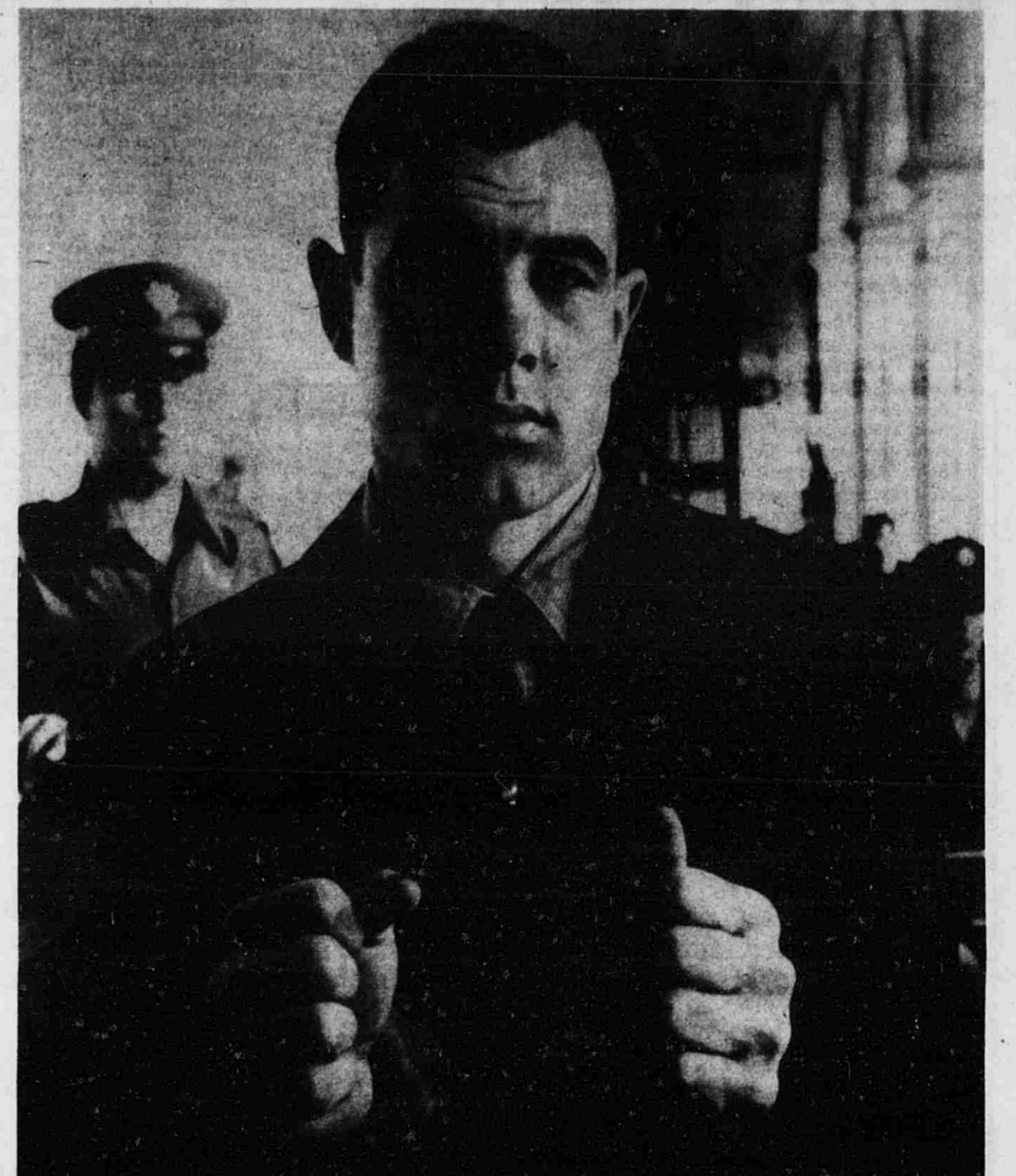

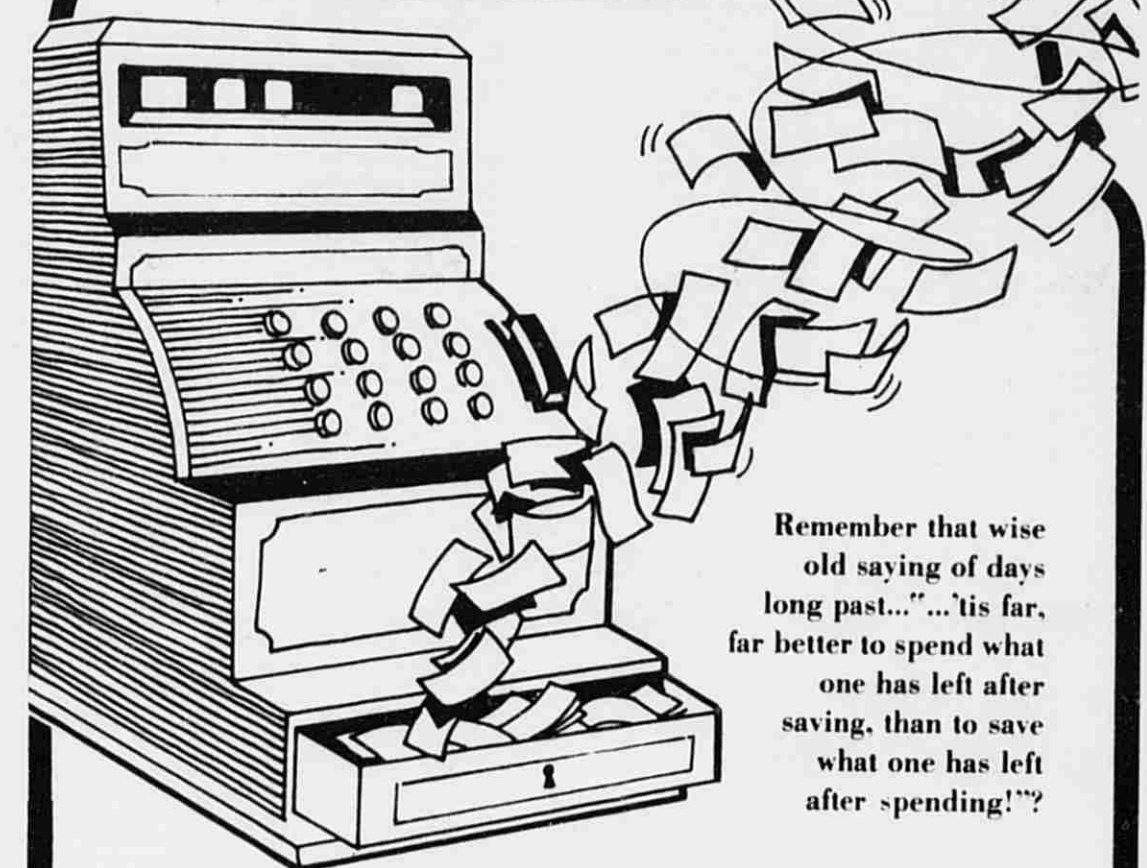

# LOWELL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS of the CITY COUNCIL of the CITY OF LOWELL, MICHIGAN

Regular meeting of Monday, July 18, 1983.

The Meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Dean Collins. The Pledge of Allegiance was given and the Roll called.

Present: Councilmen Fonger, Maatman, Schneider and Collins.  
Absent: Councilman Christensen.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Fonger that the absence of Councilman Christensen be excused, due to a business engagement out of the city, supported by Councilman Schneider.

Carried.

IT WAS THEN MOVED by Councilman Fonger that the Minutes of the July 5 Meeting be approved as written, supported by Councilman Maatman.

Carried.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Fonger that the Bills and Accounts Payable be allowed and warrants issued, supported by Councilman Maatman.

Yes: Councilmen Fonger, Maatman, Schneider and Collins.  
No: None.  
Absent: Councilman Christensen.

The first item of business was a recommendation by the Planning Commission for approval of a rezoning request for a parcel of property owned by the Nazarene Church, located on Avery Street, between the Church on the West, and a lot located on the corner of Avery and N. Jefferson Streets, (also owned by the Church) from R-2 Residence and Apartments, to a Public Facility Zone.

Manager Quada explained that a Public Hearing had been held before the Planning Commission, and the request approved by them.

Mr. Ivan Blough, builder, was present and explained that the purpose of the request was to allow the construction of an activity building 34 feet by 90 feet, for use as divided class rooms, a dining hall, wedding receptions, etc. It would have a kitchen and restroom facilities. A 50 space parking area would be located in front of the building.

Manager Quada noted that everything meets the ordinance requirements for the Public Facility Zone, building, location, parking, etc. and that a set of plans will be submitted for site review which will detail screening, plantings, layout of parking etc. which will need to be approved by the Planning Commission before construction is allowed.

IT WAS MOVED by Commissioner Schneider that the request of the Nazarene Church to rezone a parcel of property located on Avery Street between the Church and the lot to the East, on Avery and N. Jefferson Streets, from R-2 Residence and Apartments to a Public Facility Zone, supported by Councilman Maatman.

Carried.

The next item was the consideration of a contract for "Miss Dig" services from Consumer's Power Company.

Manager Quada explained that there are numerous times

when anyone excavating areas for installation of underground utilities, or repair, need to know exactly where to locate other underground lines, such as water, sewer, gas, cable or telephone. The "Miss Dig" service makes this information available so that any digging will not break or cut through existing pipes or wires. The service will cost about \$16.00 per month. It may not be needed each and every month, but the times that it is needed it will be invaluable. He suggested that the cost and contract be reviewed in six months, and if costs outweigh the amount of service, the contract can then be terminated. He recommended approval.

The following resolution was offered for adoption by Councilman Schneider, supported by Councilman Fonger.

WHEREAS, the City of Lowell desires to participate in and receive the services of "Miss Dig"; and

WHEREAS, said services require the execution of agreements between the City of Lowell, its Light and Power Company and "Miss Dig" (Consumers Power Company);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute the necessary documents and contracts to provide for "Miss Dig" services, and participate in same.

Carried.

Council also discussed the proposed contract with Consumers Power Company for a 120 volt power service unit.

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Fonger for adoption, supported by Councilman Schneider.

RESOLVED, that it is hereby deemed advisable to enter into contract with Consumers Power Company of Jackson, Michigan, for furnishing 120 volt service for a power supply unit to the City of Lowell, Michigan, for a period of one year, and thereafter from year to year, in accordance with the terms of the contract heretofore submitted to and considered by this Council; and

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that the Mayor and City Clerk be and are authorized and directed to execute such contract on behalf of the City.

Carried.

Council next considered approval of a contract with Highway Maintenance Specialist, Inc. to repair cracks and joints in several areas of City streets.

Manager Quada explained that a constantly used street surface will last about 15 to 20 years. With hot and cold weather changes cracks are formed. Moisture seeps in, freezes, dust and dirt are blown in, and cracks get bigger and the street deteriorates at a much faster rate. With this type of repair, the cracks and separated joints would be routed out, sand-blasted, then air-blown to remove dirt, then injected with a hot rubber asphalt to seal. Cost would be 60¢ per lineal foot, and the area approximately 3/4 of a mile, totaled. He recommended approval.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Schneider that the crack-seal contract with Highway Maintenance Specialist, Inc. for the repair of certain City streets at 60¢ per lineal foot be approved, supported by councilman Maatman.

Carried.

Council also discussed a proposal to pave the alley behind City Hall, East to Washington Street.

Manager Quada explained that Mr. Bill Bennett, owner of Big "D" Auto Trim, owns the property on N. Washington Street, between Main and Avery Streets, and will give the City a written easement for which the City will pay the paving costs. In addition, paving would be done up to Big "D" buildings on each side of the easement, for which he would pay the cost, a total of \$3,100 to the City, \$300 to Big "D" Auto Trim. The Manager recommended approval.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Fonger that the contract with Woodland Paving Company, to pave the alley behind City Hall, from N. Monroe Street through to N. Washington Street

for a cost of \$3,100 to the City, and \$300 to Big "D" Auto Trim, for a total cost of \$3,400 be approved, supported by Councilman Schneider.

Carried.

Under Citizen Input and Suggestion, Mr. Gerald Kellogg stated that a petition drive has been initiated by Amity Street-area residents to show interest in keeping the "Macker" basketball tournament in Lowell. He asked for a vote of support from the City Council, to show that the City is interested in keeping it also, explaining that it is an asset to local business, "a 48 hour money-maker", as well as a good, clean, neighborhood event. He suggested forming a committee of Councilmembers, Macker Committee members and Citizens at Large to help develop an area in which to hold the annual tournament. He stated that a possible donation of land was being worked on, and turned the floor over to Mr. Dick Bryan to explain that part.

Mr. Bryan stated that he has been talking to a Lowell company that owns 26 acres on Bowes Road as a possible site for a park development. But, before the deal can go any further, a vote of support by Council is needed to prove that the City really is interested in keeping "Macker" in Lowell. He then turned the floor over to "Gus Macker", (Scott McNeal).

Mr. McNeal stated that first he would like to clear up a point, that the "Macker" wants to stay in Lowell, they always have. However, with the growth of the tournament over the years, they knew they would have to get off the streets, but attempts to find another suitable place have just seemed to be dead ends, thus the invitation and proposition to move to Grand Rapids.

He then presented a drawing of possible development of the 26 acres, which could house the tournament, but would not be limited to that, by any means. Space would be provided for a camping area, soccer fields, ball diamonds, play areas, etc. The central area would be an intersected, paved area on which the tournament would be played, and used as a roadway the balance of the year.

Councilman Maatman stated that he would like to see the project pursued, and the other Councilmembers concurred.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Maatman that a written letter in support of the Macker Basketball Tournament be drafted, supported by Councilman Schneider.

Carried.

Manager Quada stated that personally, he is also in favor of keeping "Macker" in Lowell, however he must take the roll of "bad guy" as the City Manager, because it is his responsibility to the people of Lowell to insure that all the projects and services can be paid for, that's his job. It is all well and good to want a park, but once it is built, who is going to maintain it.

Some members of the audience stated that it could be deeded to the City.

Manager Quada stated that that was exactly his point. The City. The City is expected to take over and maintain every project. He explained that at present there are not enough funds or manpower to properly maintain City-owned property or parks that we have now. He asked the audience, how many people they thought would vote for a millage increase to hire more employees or purchase additional equipment, or give up one of the other services to channel that money into a maintenance fund for a new park. Those are just some of the questions that he must address each year at budget preparation time, and that special interest groups, such as "Macker" supporters must consider also, when requesting support from the City.

He continued that Lowell has been fortunate to have a good recreational program through the local Y.M.C.A., with help from the King Memorial Fund, but down through the years there have been arguments as to how those monies should be used toward recreational projects. He said he would also like to see some "Y" Board members and someone from Lowell Area Schools included on the proposed committee, and volunteered to sit on the committee himself. Councilman Maatman volunteered also.

**Council Proceedings continued**

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Schneider that Manager Quada and Councilman Maatman both be appointed as City representatives to the "Keep Macker in Lowell" committee, supported by Councilman Fonger.

Carried.

Also under Citizen Input, Mr. Larry Isenhoff had a complaint about dogs being allowed to run loose in his neighborhood, leaving messes in his yard. Manager Quada suggested that he call the City's Animal Control Officer each time it happened and the owner would be cited. Mr. Isenhoff stated that that had already been done, the tickets merely paid, and the dog still allowed to run. Chief Emmons was directed to investigate the situation.

Mrs. Mary Ann Gwatkin asked if anyone from the City had been in the 200 block of Lincoln Lake Ave. recently, stating that it looks like a ghetto area. She asked if there is a public inspector or ordinance to enforce a clean up of the area. Other members of the audience were quick to cite other known health problems stemming from the area, as well as junk of all kinds being stored on the premises.

Manager Quada replied that appearance citations had already been issued on the junk, and that he would contact the Kent County Health Department to check on the other problems.

Mr. Isenhoff then asked about motor bikes and mopeds being ridden on City streets, on the railroad tracks and across private property, and if property owners are liable for any injuries on their property.

A discussion followed on the subject, of helmets not being worn, and there not being much that can be done at present because the State does not require helmets or licensing.

Under the Manager's Report, Manager Quada requested permission to seek bids on air conditioning for the City Hall. Permission granted!

Under Council Comments, Councilman Maatman asked if there is anything the City can do to keep kids from swimming below the dam on Main Street. He saw one man drown there a few years ago, and does not want to see it again.

Chief Emmons replied that officers have made kids leave the area on many occasions, only to have them return as soon as he left. Parents have been notified of the danger, but the kids are still there.

Manager Quada stated that he would contact King Milling Company about installing signs in the area for "dangerous swimming"

The last item of business was appointments to be made to various City boards and commissions.

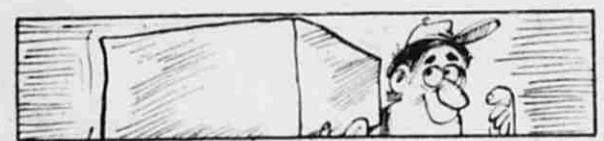

**Consider more than purchase price when planning any major buys**

If you are stashing away your summer job earnings so you can make a major purchase -- like a 10-speed bike, 35MM camera or stereo system -- you want to make the most of your money. Why not follow the path of the corporate purchasing agents? Before buying, project the initial purchase price and any costs for using the item, maintaining it, and protecting it from theft or loss, advises the Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants.

No matter what you buy or how much you spend, the first rule for both a company investing in a computer or a kid wanting a bike is to shop around. Compare various models, special features, prices and service available from different stores.

Generally, a discount or department store may save you some money, but a store specializing only in bicycles or electronics, for example, may offer a better selection, specialized advice and, most importantly, follow-up service. Mail-order firms are also popular, but making exchanges may be time consuming and inconvenient.

Before you buy, check the product's warranty. Find out if it covers parts, labor or routine servicing, and in the case of a new bike, how long you're entitled to free adjustments. Also, don't forget to budget for sales tax on the purchase and for any delivery costs.

In addition to the costs of your big purchase, remember to budget for some essential extras, CPAs advise. After spending a few hundred dollars for a bike, it's good planning to spend an extra \$20 to \$40 for a theft-proof bicycle lock. A camera or electronics dealer may offer a lower priced "package deal" which includes accessories like a camera bag or stereo headset, if you purchase everything at one time.

Young people should check with their parents to find out if their home insurance policy covers the loss of a new bike, camera or stereo. A special insurance "rider" may be needed on times over \$500, which means an increased insurance premium.

Your parents may be able to claim a tax deduction on uninsured property that is destroyed or stolen. Of course, there are rules covering such tax deductions, CPAs note. For example, the total of all losses for the year has to exceed 10 percent of your parent's income, and you have to subtract \$100 before deducting each loss.

Keep a separate record of the model number and serial number of the item for insurance purposes and to identify it if stolen. In many areas you can register a bicycle serial number with the local police department. Some police departments have special equipment to engrave your name on your property to help discourage thefts and speed up identification.

Hold onto your sales receipt and any written warranty and photographs of what you buy. You may need this information for police or insurance reports, or to ensure warranty coverage in case you need repairs.

Naturally, the best part of buying anything new is using it. For purchases like a stereo or camera, you'll have to set aside money for records or film.

After buying, you may decide to start saving again for something like a new camera lens, tape deck for your stereo or travel bags for your bike. Once you save enough follow the same comparison shopping rules, spend wisely and enjoy what you buy.

## cozy corner

## Vehicle codes ready

The 1983 edition of the Michigan Vehicle code is off the press. The 315-page code, cross-indexed by subject and published by the Michigan Department of State, contains all laws involving vehicle use on Michigan highways.

The code also gives duties and responsibilities of the Secretary of State, definitions of vehicles, laws on safety, use of bicycles, motorcycles, snowmobiles, off-road vehicles, and watercraft.

According to Secretary of State Richard H. Austin, the code is not on any best seller list, but is required reading for law enforcement and others responsible for law enforcement and traffic safety in Michigan.
