## Lowell City Council approves zoning variance

The Lowell City Council granted a zoning variance to Allen Hull of 201 Donna St., Lowell at their regular meeting of September 6. Hull had obtained a building permit for a large garage, 28 x 32 feet and sixteen feet high, but after construction began it was noticed that the building did not conform with zoning requirements. After complaints came in to city hall from Hull's neighbors, it was discovered that the building was much too close to the lot line.

Hull in his site plan drawing had measured from the curb, and not his actual lot line which resulted in the building being only 12-1/2 feet from the lot line rather than the required thirty feet.

At a public hearing prior to the August 15 City Council meeting, several of Hull's neighbors were present to complain of not only the location of the building, but the size, height and fact that it is pole-type construction. The building is framed in with truss rafters in place, but no roof

boards. Hull intends to use the building to store two trucks used in this house painting business and the family car.

After taking two weeks to think the problem over, the city council has granted a variance to Hull that will allow him to finish construction, but only if he meets certain requirements. The stipulations laid out by the council include lowering the roof peak to twelve feet, finishing the building with the same siding and paint as is on Hull's house, and adding a breezeway to give the project a more "finished" look. Hull agreed to the stipulation, and the variance was granted.



The roughed in structure belonging to Allen Hull will be lowered 4 feet, sided to match and attached to his residence to comply with a ruling set by the Lowell City Council.

### Crash injures Lowell retailer

John Koewers of 4 Mile Road, Lowell was injured last Thursday at about 7:30 P.M. when he drove his pickup truck into the path of an oncoming semi tractor and trailer hauling a load of polo ponies. Koewers was northbound on Parnell Road and had stopped at the flashing red light at Bailey Drive. According to one report Koewers waited for one car to pass and then pulled into the path of the eastbound truck driven by Jose Campos of Conservation and Faro, Ada.

Reports say that Koewers was thrown from the vehicle and suffered multiple cuts, abrasions and at least two broken ribs, one of which punctured a lung. Koewers was listed in good condition Tuesday at Butterworth Hospital. Koewers is the owner of Discount Enterprises, 219 E. Main Street, Lowell. Campos was not injured in the accident, and the polo ponies were also apparently uninjured.

Koewers mother was following him home, and witnessed the accident. Campos was en-route to the family owned polo field on Fallsburg Park Drive. Kent County Sheriff's Deputies are investigating the accident.

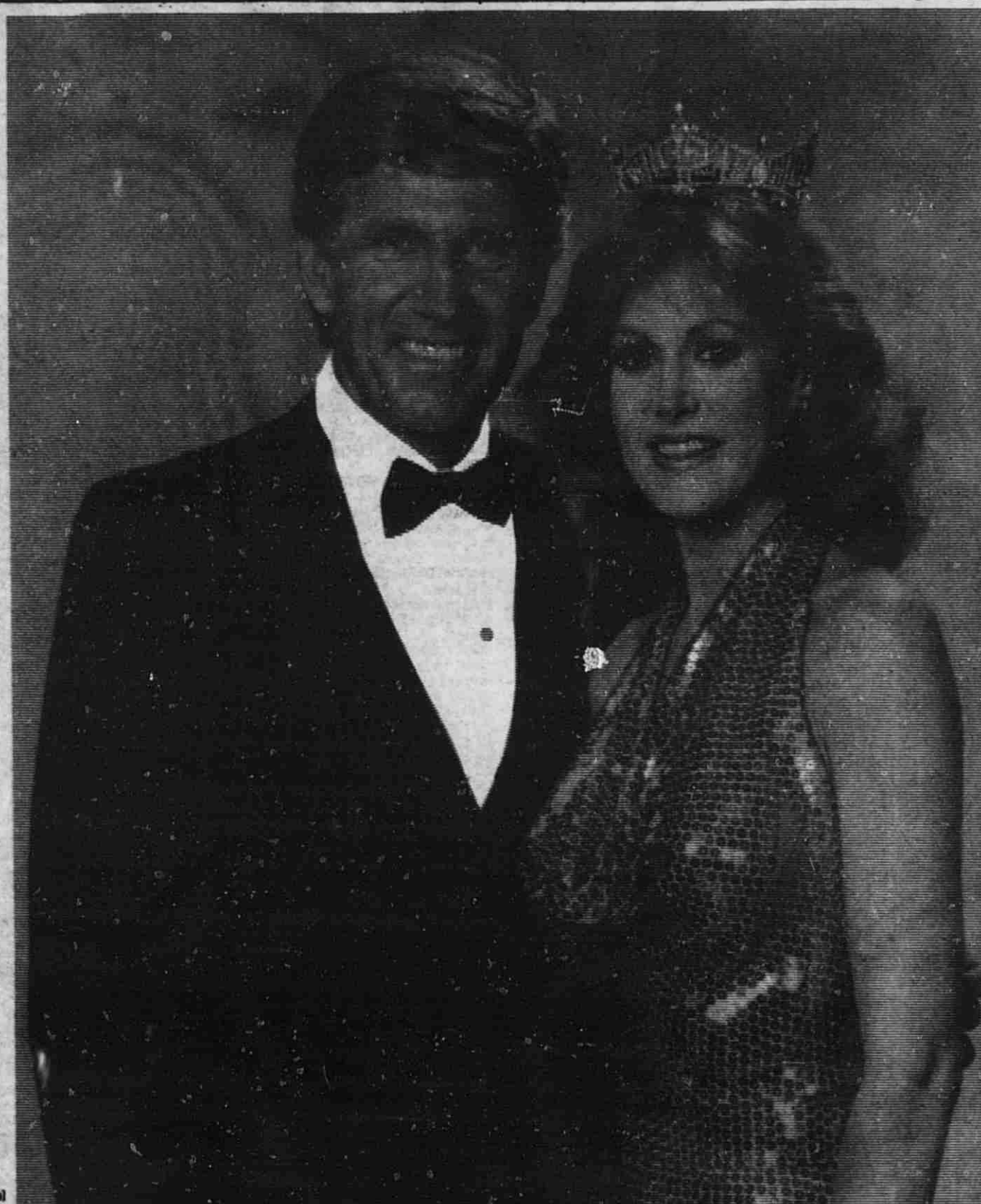

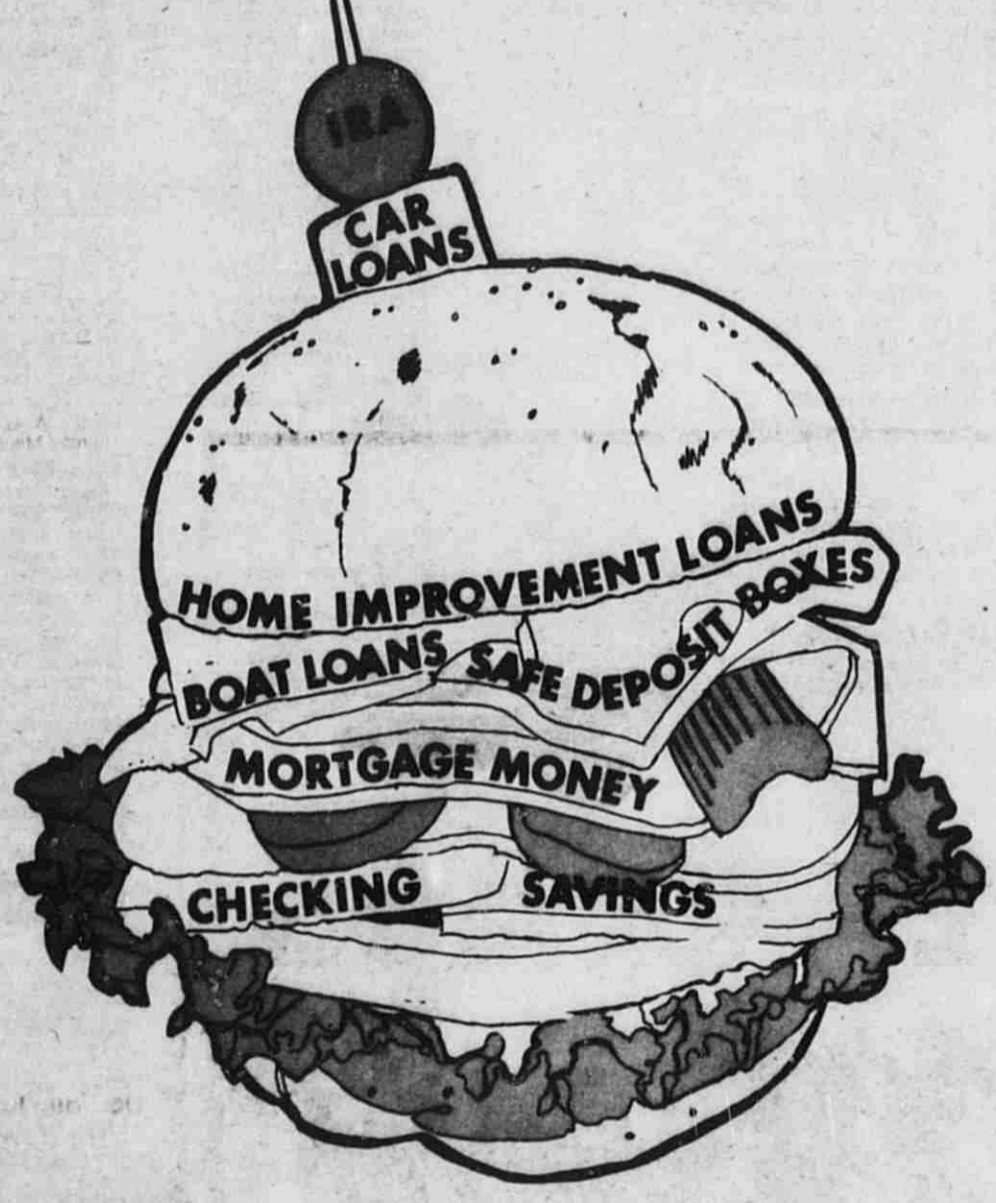

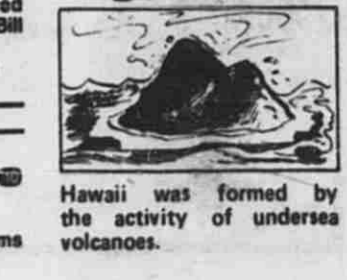

# LOWELL CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular meeting of Monday, August 15, 1983.

The Meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by Mayor Collins. The Pledge of Allegiance was given and the Roll called.

Present: Councilmen Christiansen, Fonger, Maatman, Schneider and Collins.  
Absent: None.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Maatman that the Minutes of the August 1 Meeting be approved as written, supported by Councilman Fonger.

Carried.

IT WAS THEN MOVED by Councilman Christiansen that the Bills and Accounts Payable be approved and warrants issued.

Yes: Councilmen Christiansen, Fonger, Maatman, Schneider and Collins.  
No: None.  
Absent: None.

Mayor Collins then turned the meeting over to Councilman Maatman. Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals, who opened the Public Hearing on a request by Mr. Allen Hull of 201 Donna Dr. for a variance from sideline and height requirements in an R-2 Single Family Residential Zone, to allow the construction of a 28 x 32 foot garage, 16 feet in height.

Manager Quada explained that a building permit had been issued based on a drawing submitted by Mr. Hull, and construction begun, when it was discovered that several mistakes had been made in footage calculations on the drawing, the distance from the property line and actual size of the building compared to the width of the property. Construction was halted and Mr. Hull was advised to either change the building and move it into conformance with code requirements, or petition the Zoning Board for variances from those requirements.

Mr. Hull was present and stated that the building is 30 feet from the edge of the street line, but only 12-1/2 feet from his property line. (It should be 30 feet from his property line.) The 16 foot height is necessary to accommodate the 10 foot high door and 12 foot high walls. The garage will be used to house a large truck.

Mr. Dave Steenwyk, a neighbor, stated that he is very opposed to the structure being left were it is for three reasons, 1. it is out of line with the house and too close to the street; 2. the height; and 3. it is definitely not a garage, it is a pole barn and does not blend in with the rest of the suburbs. He felt it would definitely drop the value of surrounding properties.

Mr. Mark Bukema, representing the Calvary Christian Reformed Church, stated that they are also opposed to the building because of its size and placement. The Church plans on building a new parsonage soon, directly across from the building, and which members feel would be very unfitting to have to look at.

Mr. Hull countered that only two blocks away, a precedent has been set with the allowance of a pole barn type building. His own will be sided and painted to match the house.

Councilman Christiansen asked for comments from the City Planner, Dennis Larkin.

Mr. Larkin stated that it is clearly not in keeping with the suburb

setting in which it is located, especially the height, being higher than any of the houses. It is definitely an out-building, not a garage and should not sit so close to the street. A precedent would be set here if the building were allowed to remain closer to the street than a house.

Manager Quada read a letter from neighbors, Russell and Pauline Spray, also opposed to the size and placement, and who feel that property values will be downgraded if it is allowed to stay.

A discussion followed on the question of the other pole barn being allowed two blocks away, that no letters were received for a hearing on it.

Manager Quada explained that it met requirements, except for the height which is being negotiated for reduction at present, so there was no need to hold a hearing before construction.

Councilman Christiansen stated that he was especially opposed to the 16 foot height in a residential neighborhood.

Mayor Collins stated that he could not understand the need for a structure 28 x 32 feet to store an 8 x 20 foot truck, unless he was planning on using it as a business besides.

Mr. Hull replied that it would be used as garage storage only for two trucks and a car.

Councilman Fonger stated he felt that the set-back requirements definitely must be met, and not allowed closer to the street than any of the houses.

Chariman Maatman closed the hearing at 8:21 P.M. and asked the Board's pleasure.

Councilman Schneider stated he preferred not to make a decision at this meeting, but would like to look at the building and work out the problems in everyone's best interest.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Schneider that the Public Hearing be continued at the first meeting in September, supported by Councilman Fonger.

Carried.

Chairman Maatman then turned the meeting back over to Mayor Collins.

Mayor Collins then opened the Public Hearing on the request of East Lansing Realty and Development Co. to rezone a parcel of property on West Main Street (M-21) from R-3 Residence and Apartments to C-2 Limited Highway Commercial.

REFERENCE NOTE: A recommendation to Council by the Planning Commission to approve the rezoning with a P.U.D. overlay, (Planned Unit Development) had been received at the regular meeting of August 1.

Mr. Arthur Warning, a Main Street business owner was present and expressed concern over the rezoning, when the property directly to the West is already zoned for a mall. He stated that East Lansing Realty and Development knew this property was zoned Residential when they bought it, and now want it changed. He also stated that he hoped Council would give the matter lots of consideration before changing it. He then compared it to the building of Eberhard's which is also in front of a residential area. He stated that a playground and pool area had been promised with other development of the property, which never happened.

Mr. Randall Kracker, and attorney representing Mr. Hitchcock and Mr. Shurlow, owners of the property directly West of the property in question, stated that they were in opposition to the rezoning, and the locating of another mall next to their property. He explained that they had not announced plans for their mall because of the economy, and have preferred to wait because of several "false starts" of other developers of the same area. He asked that the rezoning be denied.

Mr. Hitchcock stated that he had made a statement at the last meeting regarding the use of the property, and also asked for denial.

Mr. Chuck Lippert, Lowell resident and Main Street business owner stated that he has a store located in the Caledonia mall owned by Shurlow and Hitchcock, and has nothing to gain or

lose in either piece of property being zoned for a mall, other than knowing the owners. When a mall was first proposed for the Lowell property, he advised them to keep it on a "low key" basis because of the false starts. He also commented that he was sure that they would build an equally comparable building here.

Mr. Duane Lambert, also a resident and Main Street business owner, stated that the rezoning would create the possibility of ending up with two shopping centers. He cited long term leases that businesses can't get out of, if the mall does not do well. He stated he feels that the one piece of property already zoned Commercial is adequate and is opposed to the rezoning.

Mr. Warning asked if people on Sibley Street should have to look out at 15 foot high walls and smelly dumpsters next to a residential neighborhood.

Mr. Kracker asked if the property remained zoned R-3 why they couldn't just build more apartments.

Mr. Jon Rurquist, owner of the property in question stated that it had at one time been zoned Commercial, then changed later by another developer for apartments that were never built. He announced that Family Foods Stores is the major chain that will be locating in the proposed mall. Also, market studies of the area indicate a need for this type of center, and he stated that he could not understand a need to wait for a better economy.

Mayor Collins then closed the Hearing at 8:49 P.M.

Mr. Lambert asked what affect it would have on downtown merchants.

Councilman Christiansen asked the City Planner for comment.

Mr. Larkin explained that the Planning Commission has discussed the problem of zoning for the best interest of the City many times, especially in the area in question. Sometimes against his better judgement and teachings, changes have been made, because of the Commission's familiarity with the City. The whole area of West Main Street, from Bowes Road to Gee Drive has been discussed many times as the best area for commercial growth, and has been so designated for that purpose on the interim map. Because the Land Use Map has not been formally adopted, the property in question has remained under the current zoning of R-3 Residence and Apartments, which was changed several years ago. He displayed a sectional map entitled "F" and noted how many drawings and how long it had taken before the Planning Commission had been fully satisfied with the various zoning designations.

In answer to Mr. Lambert's question, Mr. Larkin stated that a mall would have a profound impact on Main Street businesses, another subject discussed by Planning Commissioners.

Mr. Warning asked why then, is the City backing a program to fix up Main Street store fronts if they're going to allow a shopping center to take away all the Main Street business.

Mr. Gould Rivette asked when plan "F" had been adopted.

Mr. Larkin replied that this particular section had been approved about 12 months ago, but that the Land Use Map had not been formally adopted yet.

Manager Quada stated that the issue here was not whether or not a mall should be allowed on one piece of property or the other, or Main Street business in general, the issue was whether a C-2 Limited Highway Commercial zone would be a good use of this particular piece of property or not. Council concurred.

IT WAS THEN MOVED by Councilman Schneider that the parcel of property owned by East Lansing Realty and Development Co. located on West Main Street (M-21) be rezoned from R-3 Residential and Apartments to C-2 Limited Highway Commercial, with a P.U.D. overlay, supported by Councilman Fonger.

Carried.

Council then discussed the proposed amendment to the P.A. 198 Certificate of Exemption granted to the C.J. Christoff and Sons Co. in 1981.

Manager Quada explained that when the exemption was granted, the adopted resolution failed to include a financial impact statement paragraph, thus the need for the new resolution.

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Christiansen for adoption, supported by Councilman Fonger.

BE IT RESOLVED that the resolution approving a request for tax abatement under the provisions of P.A. 198 for C.J. Christoff and Sons be amended to include the following:

WHEREAS, it is hereby found and determined by the City of Lowell that the granting of this Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate, considered together with the aggregate amount of the Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificates previously granted and currently in force, shall not have the effect of substantially impeding the operation of the City of Lowell, or of impairing the financial soundness of a taxing unit which levies an ad valorem property tax in the City of Lowell.

Carried.

Manager Quada announced that the Michigan Municipal League will hold its annual meeting in Grand Rapids on September 28 through the 30th. Usually, Council appoints the Manager as Delegate and a Councilmember as Alternate Delegate, both to attend the meeting.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Christiansen that the City Manager be appointed as Delegate and Councilman Fonger as Alternate Delegate to the Annual Michigan Municipal League Meeting, supported by Councilman Maatman.

Manager Quada also stated that the City had received a notice from the Michigan Municipal Worker's Compensation Self Insurer's Fund for a proxy vote for six candidates for Trustees. He recommended that the ballot be returned with the City's approval of all six.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Christiansen that the Michigan Municipal Worker's Compensation Self Insurer's Fund ballot be marked in favor of all six candidates, and returned, supported by Councilman Maatman.

Carried.

Manager Quada also announced that the new roof on the Library was just about complete. He asked Council's pleasure on submitting a portion, or all of the cost of the project to the Helen Look Daley Committee for consideration.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Christiansen that the entire renovation project for the Lowell Library be submitted to the Helen Look Daley Committee for consideration, supported by Councilman Fonger.

Under Citizen Suggestion, Mr. Warning stated he thought that he had read either in the Lowell Ledger or Grand Rapids Press that City monies would be spent to develop a park for the Macker Tournament, and he wanted it known by Council that he is very much against it.

Councilmembers countered that they had given a letter to the Macker Committee, pledging support to help keep the tournament in Lowell, but that no monies have been pledged. Development of a park has been discussed in several different locations, several times, in which the annual event could be held, but nothing concrete had been decided. If anything, the Macker Committee has stated that they are willing to contribute monies to the development of a City park, if they could use it for their annual one-weekend event.

Mr. Warning also asked about complaints having been made about messy condition in back of Eberhard's Supermarket.

Manager Quada replied that he was not aware of any complaints being made to the City, but will check on the situation and bring it corrected if necessary.

Under the Manager's Report, Manager Quada requested that the Council meet after the close of the Regular meeting for an executive session to discuss land acquisition.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Maatman that the Council meet in executive session after the Regular meeting, supported by Councilman Fonger.

Manager Quada noted that no decision would be made on any land acquisition without an open meeting.

Under Council Remarks, Councilman Schneider stated that the Library really looks good with all the work that has been done so far.

IT WAS THEN MOVED by Councilman Christiansen to adjourn at 9:45 P.M.
