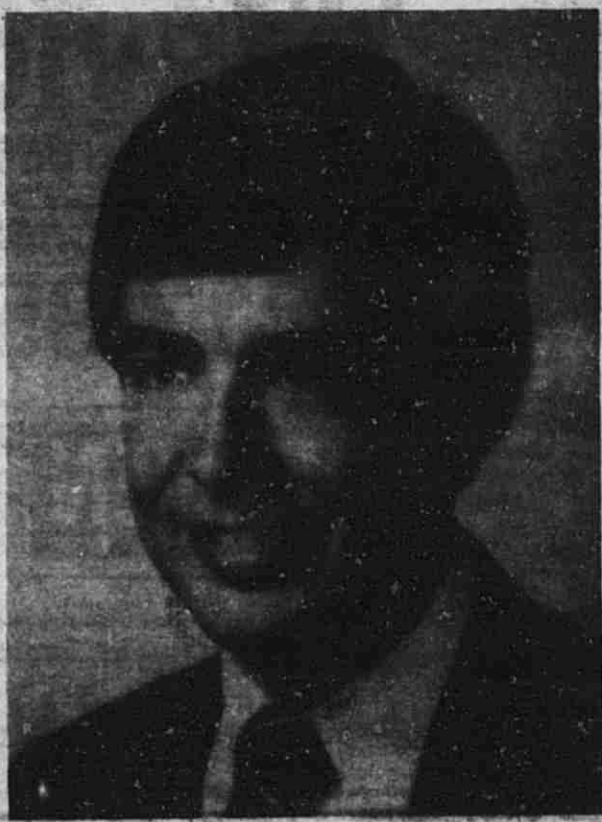
Mr. Myers will have the title of Assistant Vice President, and will assist in lending and in operations.

Saranac girl killed in hayride accident Friday

Ruth Ann Ingraham, a 17 year old Saranac High School senior died of injuries she sustained when she was run over by a hayride wagon. Ingraham was a participant in the hayride, and was riding on the left rear side of the tailgate of the pickup truck towing the hay wagon. The victim was said to have been riding with her legs dangling from the edge of the tailgate and somehow fell under the wheels of the following wagon. The pickup was driven by Christine Anne Haskins, 19, of 7698 Parsonage St., Saranac. The vehicle was said to be traveling at a speed of 10-15 miles per hour. No citation was issued by Ionia County Sheriff's Deputies who investigated.

The accident happened at 11:10 P.M. on Friday, October 7 near the corner of Vosper and Mill Streets in the village of Saranac. Ingraham was transported to Ionia County Memorial Hospital

where she died as a result of her injuries.

Ingraham is survived by her parents Keith L. and Susan D. Ingraham of Summit St., Saranac; a brother Terry living at home, her grandparents, Hubert and Wilma Whorley and a great-grandmother Minnie Nielsen, all of Ionia.

Services were held Tuesday at the Galilee Baptist Church in Saranac.

Although most people are afraid to eat mushrooms not found on supermarket shelves, white-tailed deer are particularly fond of wild mushrooms, according to the National Wildlife Federation. In fact, during certain times of the year, fungi make up more than 80 percent of a deer's diet in South Carolina.

A wild rabbit's first line of defense against a predator is to lie flat on the ground and remain absolutely still, says International Wildlife magazine. If that doesn't work, a wild rabbit can jump a distance of at least eight feet, clear obstacles five feet high, and reach speeds of more than 40 miles an hour.

Dear Editor,
October 9-15 marks the annual observance of National Newspaper Week. This year's theme, "A Free Press-Democracy's First Defense," is especially appropriate since it so accurately describes an essential role of a free, strong and independent press: to provide a free people with a mighty force in helping make our democracy work.

Freedom of the press is an indispensable part of our democratic process. A political and economic system is healthy because a free press provides a forum for competing voices to challenge, question and criticize with equal opportunity. Freedom of expression was considered so important by our founding fathers that they locked these guarantees into the First Amendment of our Constitution.

Michigan citizens have come to appreciate the role of newspapers in their lives. They want reporting that is truthful, accurate, factual and fair. They expect a

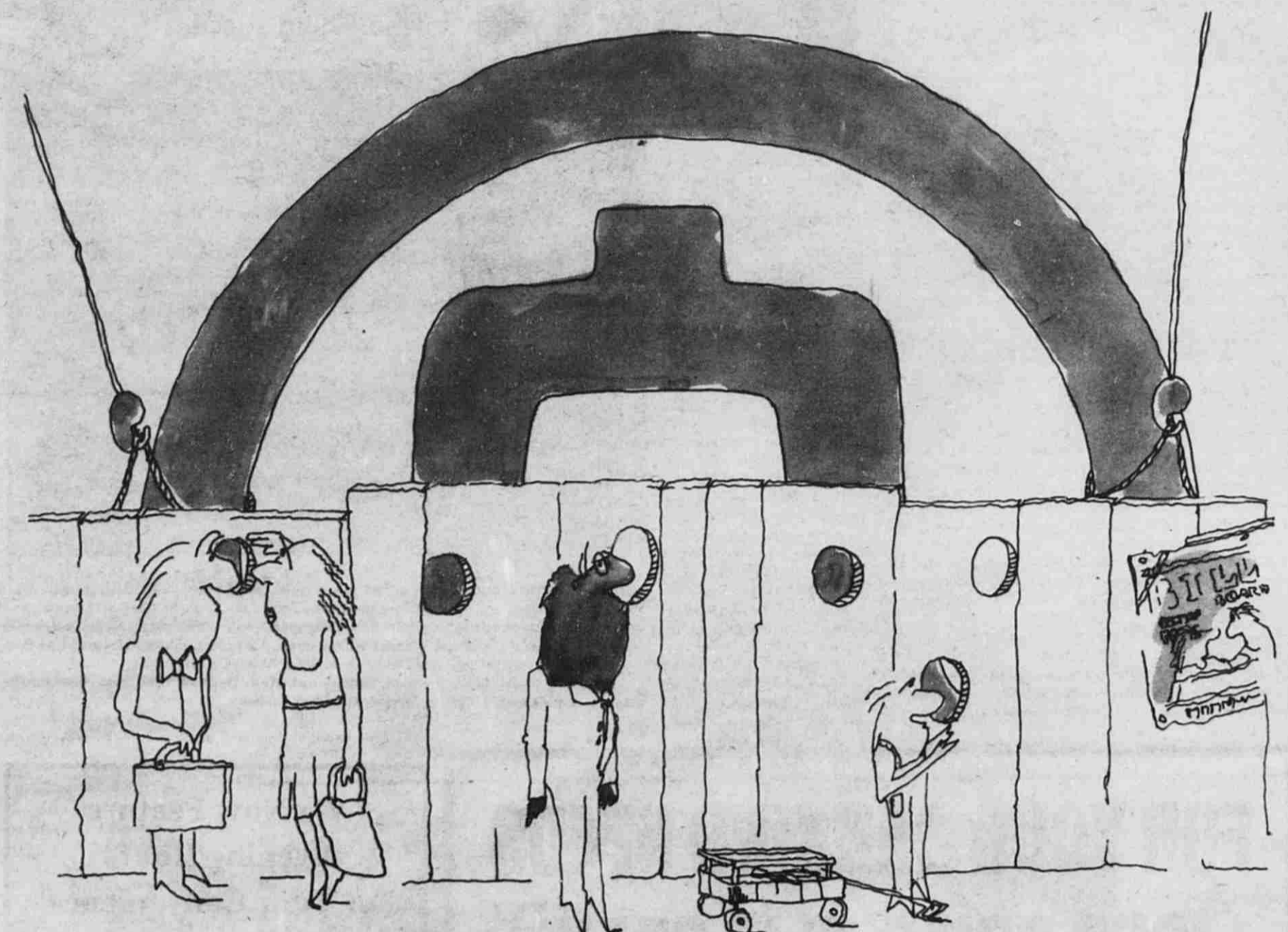

married in 1952 and have five children, four boys and one girl, and two grandchildren. For hobbies he enjoys hunting with both bow and rifle (including muzzle loading), bowling, snowmobiling, canoeing and golf.

'OUTDOORS' with Jack Friesner

This weeks column may be of interest to but a limited number of readers, however I have had enough inquiries into the subject to justify the writing. The selection and use of animal lures and attractors for hunting, trapping, photography or observing wildlife has been practiced for centuries. First we must realize that there are several different types of lures for each species of animal. Proper use of the right lure can be of tremendous value, while improper selection or use can be more of a detriment than asset.

Gland lures, are made by blending and aging natural glands and secretions into a compound which leads others of that species into believing that another has recently visited the spot. It acts as an attractor and subsistence remover at the same time. Gland lure will also attract animals of a stronger or superior species but will tend to frighten and repel animals of a lesser species. For instance, Grey Fox are much more aggressive and muscular than are the Red Fox. A Red Fox gland lure will attract Greys, whereas a Grey Fox gland lure will definitely drive away Reds. A muskrat gland lure will attract racoon and mink as well as rats, while a mink gland lure will frighten rats. A deer gland lure will not only attract deer but also all animals which prey upon deer. Quite naturally a canine gland lure would frighten deer.

Food lure is compounded of food elements which would be attractive to the target species. This lure should be placed where the target species is seeking food. Animals feed, travel and play in different areas, consequently a food type lure in a play area would not be as effective and might tend to make the target species more suspicious.

Curiosity lure is compounded from elements which the target species is not familiar with but also not frightened of, and which would tend to raise his curiosity and cause them to investigate. This would be the better lure to use in his play area or along his travel route.

Passion or matrix lure should be used only during or near the mating season. They contain passion ingredients which arouse the natural mating instinct and can be of great value during that brief period. Each of these lures provide a definite asset to those who properly use them.

Animal urines also are a lure as well as suspicion remover. They are often used in conjunction with other lures and for some species are nearly indispensable.

Lures are heavily used for, and by, all species. Even the highest order of animals rely heavily upon them. Perfumes, colognes, lotions and deodorants are prime examples and most of these are improperly or unnecessarily used. I don't know how to explain the proper use of lures, when those animals of whom I'm talking do not understand how to use their own scents. For example, the overwhelming, offensive smell of too much perfume has the opposite effect of attraction, in most instances. Bear this in mind when using animal lures and don't use too much. If the manufacturer, for instance, recommends seven drops, it would be wise to cut this amount in half. In many instances the manufacturer is only interested in selling more lure. The animals have excellent noses and are just as capable of scenting a few drops as they would be a gallon. I would also recommend purchasing your lures from a well known reputable manufacturer. Many individuals compound an excellent lure for a specific purpose, however, in general its best to stay with those who have an established reputation to protect.

I'm no expert on the subject, but I have used lures along the trapline for many years and feel somewhat knowledgeable. I am always willing to discuss the subject with anyone who stops by the shop. I also sell a complete line of Carmen, Helfrich, and Hawbaker lures. The Combination, 526 East Main Lowell, 897-6111.

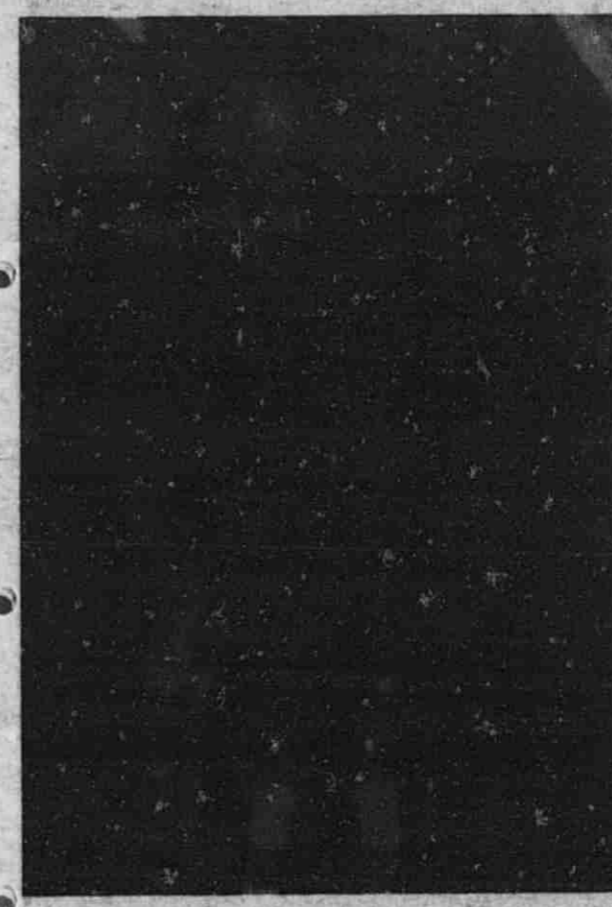
The girls JV team won both its games for the week, beating Cedar Springs 44-36 and Delton 50-42.

Lowell School Board "Highlights"

The Lowell Board of Education held its regular meeting on October 10 at 7:30 P.M. in the Board offices. During the recognition of the audience, Mr. Jerry Hale, representing a group of parents, approached the Board regarding a problem with bus 78D. The Board acknowledged an awareness of the problem and reaffirmed its commitment to work with the parents in reaching a solution. Before the usual payment of bills, Mr. Randy Baker, the newly appointed student representative was welcomed by Board members to his seat on the Board as a non-voting member. Randy is a Senior at the Lowell Senior High School and is President of the Student Council. He will be serving on the Board as an advisor on matters affecting students and will serve throughout the remainder of the year.

In matters relating to personnel, Mrs. Nancy Sanderson was appointed to a 4/5 math position at the high school following the Board's approval of a request made by Mrs. Karen Pizarek to be reduced to a part time position. The resignation of Mr. Roger MacNaughton was reluctantly accepted by the Board with best wishes for much success in his new direction.

Mr. Ed Timmer of Hemholdt and Company, the school district's auditing firm, presented the annual district audit for the business year ending June 30, 1983. The audit report revealed that the district's financial status

was sound and included a minimal fund equity of approximately \$500,000. Mr. Timmer's oral presentation of the audit was appreciated by the Board and copies of the material may be obtained through the Board office.

In other school business, the Board accepted the revision of the 1983-84 school calendar and authorized it to be duplicated for distribution. The Board took formal action to waive the policy governing the number of exchange students during the school year to accept an additional exchange student by the name of Marco Moreira of San Paulo, Brazil. Marco will be residing at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Wilder for this school year.

At the request of the Board at its last meeting, the problems of deciding which part of the middle school needed to be re-roofed was brought back to the Board for consideration. The administration has received letters of recommendation from other district maintenance supervisors in surrounding school districts regarding the use of Infrared Photography to detect roofing conditions which require replacement. They also received proposals for re-roofing entire sections of the middle school roof by roofing contractors. The Board approved the Thermocore process by Tremco for analyzing the middle school roof to assist the Superintendent in planning for a roof maintenance program over the next five years.

The annual course offerings for Lowell Senior High School were presented by High School Principal, Dick Korb, for the Board's annual review. The course offerings were briefly reviewed by the Board and were approved for the 1983-84 school year.

Athletic Director, Bob Perry and Principal, Dick Korb provided the Board with a status report on the 1983-84 interscholastic program. The status report reviewed the athletic program for Lowell Area Schools and indicated a return to the 1980-81 funded levels as was committed in the approval of the additional millage passed by voters in June. The report also contained recommendations for coach needs in the area of interscholastic programs as the district prepares to enter into the White Division of the OK League for the 1984-85 school year.

The Board approved the revision of graduation requirements for Community Education students to include credit for taking the General Education Development (GED) test. Current Board policy did not recognize the GED as partial fulfillment of graduation requirements under the Community Education program. Community Education students working toward a high school diploma will now be able to gain credit up to a maximum of six units of credit following the successful completion of the GED test.

In the last item of business the Board approved a plan presented by the Superintendent for the development of the 1984-85 budget. Administrators and Board members will begin the process of developing next year's budget with the review of the preliminary expenditures during a workshop at the first of the year. The budget development plan calls for the final draft of the proposed 1984-85 budget to be adopted by the Board by June 30, 1984.
