## Mailing tips for Christmas season

With the Christmas mailing season just ahead, Lowell Postmaster Charlie Doyle is offering tips for customers to assure that their cards and packages arrive on time and in good shape.

In addition to shopping and mailing early, customers are urged to properly address cards and packages with the name, house number and street (or post office box number), and the city, state and ZIP Code reserved for the last line.

"It is also a good idea to put a slip of paper with the recipient's name and address and your return address inside parcels, and be sure the addressing on the outside of the parcel includes your return address and ZIP Code," Doyle says.

Customers are also reminded to check the size of their envelopes before mailing Christmas and other holiday cards. Letter size standards require that envelopes be at least 3-1/2 inches high and 5 inches long to be accepted for mailing.

The Postal Service is also asking customers to put an ounce of extra care into preparing parcel post and other packages for mailing. Parcels will arrive at their

intended destination in good shape if you follow a few simple suggestions:

**CUSHION:** Make sure contents are well-cushioned and there is no empty space in the box. Use crumpled newspaper around the item -- included all sides, top and bottom. Commercially available foam shells or air-pocket padding also make good cushioning materials. Padded mailing bags are a good way to mail small items.

**DON'T OVERWRAP:** Just use your carton. Brown paper and twine cord are not necessary. Paper can rip, and twine can become entangled in processing equipment.

**SEAL PROPERLY:** Close your parcel with one of the three recommended types of tape: pressure sensitive, nylon-reinforced kraft paper, or glass-reinforced pressure sensitive. It's a good idea to put a slip with the address and return address inside the parcel.

**AVOID SMUDGES:** Use smudge-proof ink for your addressing.

**POSITION ADDRESSES PROPERLY:** Put the recipient's address in the lower right por-

tion of the package. Put your return address in the upper left hand corner of only one side of the package. Remove all other labels from the box.

**USE ZIP CODES:** Be sure to

include the ZIP Code in both the recipient's and your return address. Remember, wrong ZIP Codes can delay the mail.

## Antifreeze can kill children and pets

Waste products and spillage from cleaning and winterizing the radiator on the family car are extremely dangerous to children and pets, says Michael Slanker, D.V.M., veterinary toxicologist at Michigan State University's College of Veterinary Medicine.

"Antifreeze contains ethylene glycol, which is very poisonous," Dr. Slanker explains. "Only two tablespoons can kill a child, a 25 pound dog, or a five-pound cat. The solution tastes sweet, so children and animals will drink it."

Signs that may indicate antifreeze poisoning range from uncoordinated movements, convulsions, and vomiting in severe cases to progressive depression and loss of appetite in milder cases. If antifreeze poisoning is suspected, professional medical assistance should be sought immediately.

"Early treatment can prevent further complications," Dr. Slanker says. "But once kidney damage has occurred, the prognosis usually is grave."

Dr. Slanker recommends dis-

posal of used antifreeze in a septic tank or at a waste water disposal plant. Unused antifreeze should be kept tightly sealed and stored out of the reach of children and pets.

A Real Lifesaver

A split second of awareness turned Consumers Power lineman Tom Burghdoff into a hero and saved the life of a father of six.

It happened in mid-August as Burghdoff drove his company truck along M-50 south of Alto, his thoughts running ahead to the job awaiting him in Freeport.

"I was wondering how long the job would take and whether it would be straightforward or not," said Burghdoff, 39, who works out of the company's Hastings office in southwestern Michigan.

He never got to find out. Something he glimpsed—seen for an instant, then hidden by a barn—made him swing his truck around and head back to the farm he had just passed.

"Out of the corner of my eye I thought I saw a tractor tipping over," he said. "I don't know how I happened to catch it; it was back off the road some. And I wasn't really sure that I had seen it."

As Burghdoff pulled into the driveway of the Logos Christian Farm he found that his eyes hadn't been playing tricks.

Pinned beneath an overturned tractor lay farm maintenance man Tom Mellon. His 8,000 pound Massey-Ferguson had slid sideways off a ramp leading up to a barn, thrown Mellon to the ground and rolled on top of him. The rear fender was crushing his chest and head.

Burghdoff summoned help from people at a store next door, but realized he couldn't wait for an ambulance to arrive.

"His air was cut off by the weight of the tractor and he was beginning to turn blue," said Burghdoff, a former Barry County sheriff's deputy.

He decided to use the cable winch on the front of the Consumers Power truck to pull the tractor off. It worked. As the tractor was raised a helper positioned car jacks underneath.

This prompt action saved Mellon's life, according to the surgeon who treated him at Butterworth Hospital, Grand Rapids.

"There's no doubt in my mind about that," said Dr. Lee Pool. "Every second counted in getting that tractor off. I applaud the alertness and quick response of Tom Burghdoff."

Burghdoff has since been nominated for his company's Exceptional Service Award.

For Mellon, now almost fully recovered from his injuries, August 15 was a day of miracles. He said: "From the road he (Burghdoff) could have seen the tractor for only one second—and right at the moment he passed by the tractor was tipping. Two seconds later it would have been on the ground and out of sight. Also, he had the right equipment with him and knew how to handle an emergency without going to pieces."

"There were all kinds of little miracles going on that day. It confirms my Christian faith. Mellon's wife Pat and their children — Lisa, Christy, Janet, Michael, Deborah and Denise — would probably say "amen" to that.

If bathroom humor, locker room humor or humor obsessed with bodily functions turns you on, then turn on your pay channels this week. HBO and Showtime have two offerings that will delight you. If your tastes run to more sophisticated humor, look elsewhere.

**MARVELOUS MEL** — You either love him or you hate him. Depending on your perspective — or tolerance level — Mel Brooks is one of the grossest or funniest comics in America today. Judge for yourself when Showtime airs "An Audience with Mel Brooks" on Dec. 6.

On the special, taped before a London audience, Brooks is joined by his wife Anne Bancroft as well as comedian Ronny Graham and Shakespearean actor Jonathan Price.

You'll also see three clips from Brooks' new film, "To Be or Not to Be," which is set for Christmas release. It's a remake of one of the funniest film comedies, a 1942 Jack Benny-Carole Lombard vehicle about a Shakespearean troupe in Poland fleeing from the Nazis.

**PIGGING OUT** — Another test of one's definition of good taste is "Porky's," the film about adolescent hijinks in a South Florida town. HBO airs the film, which stars Alex

When "Porky's" was released, the highbrows hated it, but the mass of American filmgoers disagreed. They flocked to theaters and made the low-budget comedy one of the surprise box-office hits of 1982. Indeed, "Porky's" has moments when it makes "Animal House" seem like a comedy of manners, but overall it has a lowbrow spirit — like a well-choreographed professional wrestling match — that compensates for its truly tacky moments.

**FREEDOM OF SPEECH — LANSING STYLE**

Around the Capitol in Lansing, a new meaning is being given to the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. It is: "Say what you want to say, so long as the Democrats say it's O.K."

Democrats have apparently been stung by their support of Governor James J. Blanchard's 38 percent tax increase followed by a nearly 13 percent boost in state spending. As a result, their legislative leaders are now attempting to minimize the communication of these facts by "censoring" articles and newsletters being sent to Republicans by their constituents.

The Democrat leaders are going far beyond the Senate-approved printing guidelines which state: "The guidelines shall prohibit the mailing and printing at Senate expense of personal or campaign material of any nature."

Now upon orders of the the Senate Majority Leader, a Democrat, all Republican material to be printed in the Legislative Print Shop must be reviewed and approved by the Majority Leader's staff. In addition, the material is also now subject to review by the Chairman of the Legislative Council — a Democrat representative. So now, when you receive any printed material from me, expressing my views and concerns on what is happening in the Legislature in particular and state government in general, it will have been "censored" by members of the opposition party.

Their contention is that no

mention of the words Republican, "Democrat" or "Governor Blanchard" should be made. This seems to me to be ridiculous. Describing the legislative affairs in Lansing while leaving out those words is like describing the World Series and leaving out the names of the teams.

In one recent article prepared for mailing to constituents in a district represented by one of my Republican colleagues, the Democrat Leader's staff censored the words "Blanchard," "Republicans" and "Democrats." Those deletions were carried in a story detailing the Governor's signing into law the end of presidential primaries in Michigan — legislation which was favored by the Governor and both Republican and Democratic political parties in Michigan.

Freedom of speech is one of our most cherished rights and the success of our political system depends on the public's free access to the positions held by all parties. The free flow of information between citizens and the government they elect is essential to the maintenance of a republic and state such as ours and increases the accountability in government.

The "censoring" of any material is uncalled for. It is political arrogance at its worst and a reckless abuse of power. "By censoring" Republican material, we are being denied the opportunity to express our views on what is happening in Lansing. And you are being denied the opportunity to hear directly from your elected representative his or her explanation of legislative action.

### Mailing tips, cont'd...

**TIME IT RIGHT:** Mail early in the month and early in the day.

**USE THE RIGHT SERVICE:** Irreplaceable items, such as cash and other valuables, should be sent by registered mail.

**IF YOU RUN OUT OF TIME:** Priority Mail affords First-Class handling for packages weighing over 12 ounces and up to 70 pounds. Priority Mail can be sent from any post office, station or branch or through rural carriers to any ad-

dress in the U.S. Delivery of Priority Mail is accomplished in two to three days anywhere in the country. Priority Mail can even be used for foreign mailings.

The service is available with insurance, return receipt, COD, certificates of mailing and special delivery. Customers interested in Priority Mail should contact the Post Office for details.

Dead vehicle batteries are just as much a part of Michigan winters as sub-zero temperatures, snow and ice. The Michigan Department of Labor, Safety Education and Training Division reminds everyone that jumping a dead battery requires safety precautions to avoid serious injuries due to explosion.

When jump-starting a vehicle the Safety Education and Training Division suggests these guidelines:  
**BEFORE ATTACHING CABLES:**

\*Put out all cigarettes and flames. A spark can ignite hydrogen gas from the battery.

\*Make sure vehicles don't touch. Set parking brakes and put automatic transmissions in park; manual transmissions in neutral; turn ignition off.

\*Add battery water, if needed. Replace caps, cover with damp cloth. Don't jump-start if fluid is frozen.

\*Do not jump-start unless

both batteries are the same voltage. Batteries can be either 6-volt or 12 volt. Check owner's manual.

**ATTACHING THE CABLES**

1. Clamp one jumper cable to positive (+) pole of dead battery. Then clamp cable's other end to positive (+) pole of good battery.

2. At good battery, clamp second cable to negative (-) pole. Then clamp cable's other end to

dead vehicles engine block on side away from battery.

3. Start vehicle with good battery - then start the disabled vehicle.

4. Remove cable from engine block and other vehicle's negative pole. Then remove cable from positive poles.

When jump-starting vehicles avoid standing between vehicles and be sure to stay a safe distance from traffic.

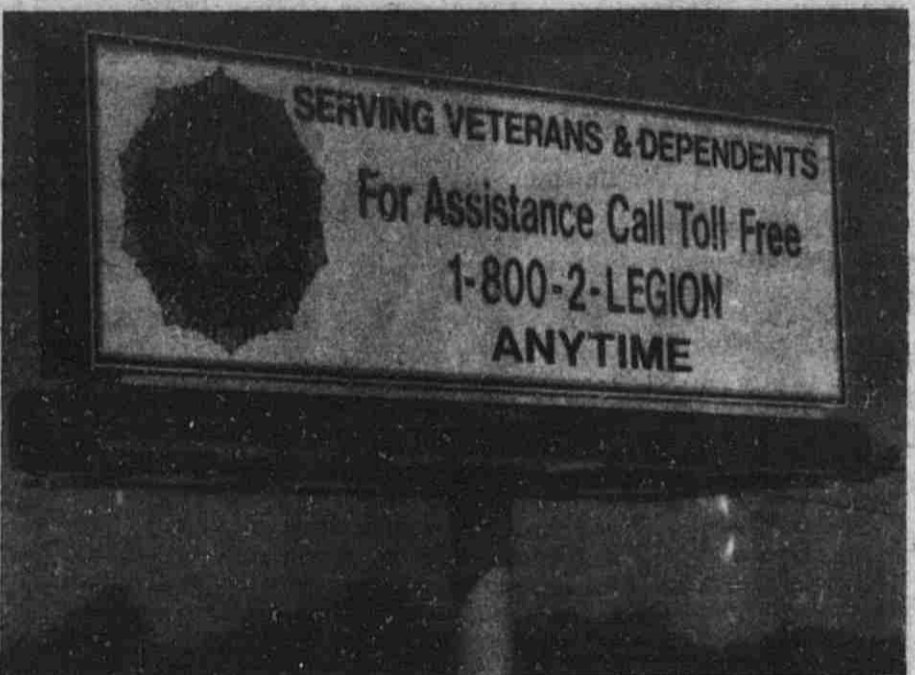

### Year-end Tax Planning

If you earned investment income from stocks and bonds this year, it's probably worth your while to learn how to lower your tax liabilities by buying and selling your assets. It's a game anyone can play provided they understand the different ways tax laws deal with long or short-term transactions, says the Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants.

For tax purposes, investments are divided into two categories: long-term and short-term. Long-term investments are held more than a year while short-term are held for a year or less. Only 40 percent of long-term gains are taxable, while 100 percent of short-term gains are taxed. One dollar of long-term loss is only worth 50 cents off your taxable income but one dollar of short-term loss is worth a full dollar.

To demonstrate the tax rules, let's say you bought 100 shares of ABC Chemical Company nine months ago at \$10 a share, then sold the shares for \$20 a share this month. That would give you a short-term gain of \$1,000 and every dollar would be added to your taxable income.

If you continue to hold those 100 shares for an additional three months, and the selling price remains \$20, you would still have a gain of \$1,000. But it becomes a long-term gain and only 40 percent of it, or \$400, is listed as income.

But under tax laws, losses work another way, CPAs say. For instance, if you bought 50 shares of XYZ Computer Company 13 months ago for \$25 a share and sold them this month for \$5 each, you'd have a long-term loss of \$1,000. Only \$500 would be deductible from your ordinary income.

If, however, you became aware of the loss before the 12 months elapsed and sold for that same price, you'd have a short-term loss and the full \$1,000 loss would be deductible.

How do these rules affect your year-end tax planning? It depends on the amount of your gains and losses and if they are short-term or long-term.

Providing you have a lot of long-term losses this year, try not to let half of those losses go to waste, CPAs advise. To take advantage of the full amount of your losses, look for any short-term gain.

In other words, if you have \$1,000 in long-term losses, you will only be able to deduct \$500 worth of losses from ordinary income. But, sell some short-term assets and produce \$1,000 of short-term gains and those short-term gains will completely offset the long-term loss.

Generally, it's good tax planning to avoid long-term losses and long-term gains in the same year, CPAs note. If you end up with a lot of long-term losses this year, look for short-term gains to balance them out and hold onto your long-term gains to balance them out and hold onto your long-term gains until next year when you can claim the full tax break on long-term gains.

You may find yourself with a lot of long-term gains this year but you may not want to do anything only 40 percent of those gains are taxed.

However, if you owned stock in a company and that stock became worthless in 1983, you must claim the loss this year. You can only claim such a loss in the year in the year it occurred, whether short-term or long-term, CPAs say.

The general rule in selling securities at year-end for gain is to act by December 22. Sales of securities for a gain have to be completed within calendar year 1983 and they usually take five business days to become settled.

For those selling at a loss, the sale date rather than the settlement date is considered the date the transaction is completed. So you can sell at a loss until December 30.
