

Separate accidents claim two Lowell men

their lives in separate traffic accidents during the past week. Reginald Grant Cridler, 71, of 11849 Vergennes Road, Lowell Hospital and released. collided head-on with a truck owned by Attwood Corporation of Lowell. Cridler was east bound on M-21 near Settlewood Dr. at 11:15 A.M. on Thursday, 20, of 320 Elizabeth Dean, Low-March 15 when he crossed the ell. The car was westbound in the centerline in his compact pickup truck colliding with the loaded pet German Shepherd were both apparently killed on impact. Kent County Medical Examiner Bernard Kool ordered an autopsy to determine if a medical problem contributed to the accident. The impact demolished Cridler's pickup and knocked the front wheels and axle out from under the larger truck. One of the sidemounted gas tanks on the large truck was knocked loose and sent skidding down the highway finally catching fire. Fortunately it was far enough away from the vehicles so as not to cause a larger fire. Passing motorists pulled Cridler and the driver of the Attwood truck,

Two Lowell area men lost Raymond Young, 33, of 45 Zeno St., Grand Rapids from their vehicles. Young was treated for minor injuries at Butterworth

David Allen, 18, of 650 Montcalm Ave., Lowell died when he was thrown from a vehicle driven by Frank J. Murphy, 8100 block of Bailey Drive when it struck a guardrail, tree and westbound truck. Cridler and his fence, then rolled over. Allen was apparently thrown from the rear window and then pinned under the car. He was pronounced dead at the scene by Kent County Medical Examiner Bernard Kool. The accident occurred at about 11:00 P..M on Saturday, March 17. Two other passengers and Murphy were taken to Butterworth Hospital. Sam Haner, 20, of 705 Montcalm Ave., Lowell was listed in stable condition. Murphy and Timothy Cook, 19, of 525 High St., Lowell were treated and released. The accident remains under investigation.

Don Fizer, owner of Michigan Manager said that the city coun-Wire Processing Co. told members of the Lowell City Council Monday night that his company was prepared to pay \$75,000 for the five acre parcel that is now the site of Recreation Park Baseball/Softball diamond. Fizer said that he was willing to pay \$25,000 now and \$10,000 per year over the next five years.

This is the first time that a dollar figure has been mentioned in the issue that has developed into quite a debate in local coffee shops and the "letters to the editor" column in the Ledger. Michigan Wire Processing is a growing company that has found itself in desperate need of more Appointments not always space, with the only space available being the ball diamond. McDonalds given nod

McDonalds got the green light Monday night as the Lowell City Council acting as the Zoning Board of Appeals granted four zoning variances, all related to signs at the proposed new restaurant. McDonalds plans to build one of their famous restaurants on Lowell's West Main Street between Thomet Chevrolet and Buick and Heritage Meat Market. Following the approval Bob Shippel, Real Estate Manager for McDonalds of Michigan told the Zoning Board of Appeals that they would be in to City Hall "tomorrow" to get the neccesary building permits.

The variances included placing the main pylon sign 13 feet back from the road right of way rather than the required 25 feet, a sign that is 10.3 sq. ft. larger than allowed by in the city ordinance, placing an exit sign 21 feet from the east property line rather than the required 25 feet, and allowing the use of entrance and exit signs that are about one square foot larger stated in the ordinance.

The project almost ran into a snag because of the placement of the entrance, or west drive. The drive was originally drawn 30 feet west of the Eberhards entrance across the street. The Lowell Planning Commission approved this plan, but State Department of Transportation threw it out saying they wanted it directly across from the Eberhard's entrance. McDonalds redrew the plans, and the Lowell Planning Commission met in special session at 7:00 Monday approving the revision allowing McDonalds to stay on the agenda for the Monday night Zoning Board of Appeals meeting.

Shippel said that McDonalds hopes to break ground by the first of April, and be open for business by Memorial Day.

Council approves

Police contract

The Lowell City Council voted unanimously to accept a new two year pact with the Lowell Police Officers Association. The new contract included the following provisions; a 4.8% salary increase in July of 1984 and in July of 1985, longevity increase from \$30 to \$40 for each year over five years, 1 day instead of 1/2 day sick leave accumulated per month for the first year of employment and extend the probationary period from six months to one year and prohibit membership in the association for that period.

Lowell City Manager Ray Quada noted that the negotiations went very smoothly over four sessions, and he was pleased with the contract that resulted.

Below is a health advisory published in the DNR's 1984 Michigan Fishing Guide, and I feel that it deserves as wide a dissemination as possible.

PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY

Persons frequently eating fish caught in Michigan waters should be aware of the potential risk of exposure to chemical contaminants which may be present in some species caught in some locations. Contaminants of concern include Mercury, PCB, PBB, DDT, Dieldrin, Chlordane, Toxaphene and Dioxin. One or more of these chemicals have been detected in fish and serve as the basis for the advisory for various bodies of water.

DO NOT EAT FISH caught from the following waters:

Deer Lake, Carp River and Carp Creek (Marquette Co.); Tittabawassee River (Midland); Saginaw River; Pine River (St. Louis): Chippewa River (downstream of the Pine River); Rasin River (Monroe); Shiawassee River (M-59 to Owosso); and Cass River (Bridgeport).

DO NOT EAT walleyes and sauger from Torch Lake (Houghton

DO NOT EAT MORE THAN ONE MEAL per week or 26 pounds per year of fish from the waters listed below. Lactating mothers, expectant women, women who anticipate bearing children and children age 6 and under SHOULD NOT EAT THESE FISH.

Lake Michigan* (all areas) carp, catfish, all salmon, all trout and (southern half) whitefish; Lake Huron* (southern half) all salmon, all trout and muskellunge; Saginaw Bay* - carp and catfish; Lake Superior - [all areas) lake trout; Lake St. Clair and the Detroit and St. Clair Rivers - muskellunge; Lake Erie (western end) carp, catfish and muskellunge

Grand River (Clinton Co.) carp; Lake Macatawa - carp; Hersey River (Reed City area) - bullheads and trout; St. Joseph River (downstream of Berrien Springs) - carp; Kalamazoo River and Portage Creek - carp, suckers, catfish and largemouth bass, Manistique River (downstream of US-2 carp and white suckers.

*Advisory also applies to tributary rivers and streams into which almon may migrate

NOTE: Careful cleaning, trimming, skinning and filleting to remove fatty portions and cooking by baking, barbecuing and broiling on a rack help reduce the level of contaminants in fish. Persons preparing fish for consumption are urged to follow these precautions.

This Advisory depicts exactly what I have been dwelling upon in this column for the past two years. Continued wide use and development of chemicals will in the future extend these same advisorys to include fish from nearly all waters and also virtually all items in the food chain. Think about it. How much time do we have. Most of these heavy metal and compounded chemical pollutants have been concentrated during the past twenty years. Today we are utilizing and disposing of many times the amounts that we were some twenty years ago and in much stronger concentrations. Just what levels of ination can we expect twenty years from now? How then will the Advisory read? Do not eat ?!

Steelhead fisning has been slowed by very cold air and water temperatures in area streams. Temperatures (stream)

have been in the low 30's. A warming trend bringing air temperatures to the 50's is forcast and improved runs should increase as these temperatures begin to rise.

Fish ladder use has been minimal. Warming temperatures should help by making fish more active, sending them over the ladders and upstream in the Grand River. Sixth Street dam by the Grand River fish ladder should be the best spot for this weekend.

Streams are low and quite wadable at this time. Snow melt has occurred and no major rainfall amounts are being predicted. Ice conditions are good on

most area lakes. 6-8 inches of solid ice is present at this time. Continued warming temperatures will cause worsening ice conditions. Extreme caution should be used. JUNE IS "RIVERS MONTH"







The Lowell Red Arrows stayed alive in the post season regional tournament Thursday night in a 63-62 thriller over De-Iton-Kellogg at Ford Fieldhouse. The win put them into the regional championship game on Saturday night when they ran up against a powerful Okemos team that dashed their hopes of a trip to the state quarter finals 88-46. Getting to the regional championship game is as far as any Lowell team has ever gone in post season play, and that hadn't been done since 1948.
