Weather Bureau at the Kent County Airport told us that the highest gust recorded there was 63 miles per hour on their precisely calibrated equipment that is placed at a standard 20 feet above the ground. LCTV adds to its receiving potential

Residents of Lowell may have noticed the addition of a second large satellite receiving dish atop the Lowell Cable Television Departments's head-end station on Lafayette Street. The second dish was necessitated by Home Box Office's move to the new Galaxy 1 satellite on May 1. LCTV will continue to receive transmissions from Cinnemax and others on the old dish.

Several cable channels transmit over the Galaxy 1 system besides HBO, the most noteable being the Disney Channel. LCTV Manager Herb Haines says that the LCTV Board of Directors will be working with the newly formed Cable Advisory Board to decide if a new tier of extra fee channels will be added. 





BUYING AN EXISTING EARTH-SHELTERED HOME



Though the concept of underground dwellings has been popularized only over the past decade or so, thousands of subterranean homes exist today. Unfortunately for the average house-shopper, much of the material written about earth-sheltered structures is directed to the professional That's why A Consumer's Guide to Earth Shell tered Housing by Mary Rollwagen with Susan

Taylor and T. Lance Holthusen (Copyright 1983, 1984 by Van Nostrand Reinhold Company Inc.) would be of interest to those intrigued by the possibilities of living in

The authors have specifically directed their attention toward potential homeowners who don't want to build their own houses, but would prefer to have the task contracted or to buy an existing earth-sheltered structure. If you're considering buying such a home, you need to be very sure you're making a sound investment, as this is a venture in which mistakes can be costly.

Since it's virtually impossible to inspect outside earth-bermed walls or waterproofing systems of earth-sheltered dwellings, this book suggests other ways to look for leakage or structural problems. Cracks in the wall are, of course, dead giveaways of structural problems, but they can also suggest a ruptured waterproofing membrane, uneven settling of the building, or excessive deflection of the roof deck. Water stains or moldy smells are also telltale signs of poor construction.

On the outside of the house, the authors recommend that you look for settling or pools of water, which can indicate poorly compacted backfill or inadequate drainage. You need to check the condition of the edge of the parapet and around roof penetrations to see if the flashing is exposed or in bad condition or if any waterproofing material is exposed. Inspect the retaining walls to see if they're in good condition or if there

Check the heating and cooling systems. If there is an active or passive solar heating system, find out how, and how well, it works. Ask about proper ventilation, too, and notice whether there are enough exits for fire safety. Of course, electrical wiring and plumbing should be up to code standards.

Home insurance raises a whole slew of questions about earth-sheltered housing. Rollwagen, Taylor, and Holthusen discovered that some insurance companies have lower rates since such structures are less vulnerable to fire and storm damage.

The book quotes the following list circulated by the National Association of Mutual Insurance Companies (NAMIC) as areas of concern to insurance inspectors considering the underwriting of an earth-sheltered home. NAMIC concluded that, assuming specific areas of concern are found to be satisfactory, earth-sheltering is "an insurable risk" if the following conditions are met: [1] The shelter was designed by an architect. [2] The plans were checked and an engineer's stamp of approval was included. [3] Building codes were followed and quality building materials were used by a reputable, qualified contractor. [4] Natural drainage and water table height were adequately determined. [5] The foundation drainage was properly installed. [6] Good waterproofing material was expertly applied. [7] The supplemental heat (wood/coal burner) was properly installed (air intake and venting) with adequate clearance between heating

These are sensible areas of concern for you to look over before making a buying decision. Naturally, you may also want to hire an experienced earth-shelter architect or engineer to inspect the property. If you're cautious and use good judgment, however, an earth-sheltered home can be a good investment, both economically and environmentally.



The notes were rated by Moody's Investor's Service Inc., at MIG-1; and Standard and Poor's Corporation rated the notes as AAA.
