The 1,000 Mile "Journey For Sight" Non-Stop Relay run is undertaken by The Deputy Sheriffs to help publicize the work being done by Leader Dogs for the Blind and to make known services the organization makes available for sightless individuald, as well as its continuing need for contributions from the genoral public and business organeral public
