





A DANGEROUS TREND

Two successive years of removing millions of acres from production should be cause for concern about a negative trend taking place

Anyone directly or indirectly connected to agriculture had better be proposing a reversal in this negative trend and an immediate switch to the concept of full production. At stake is the survival of the infrastructure that supports our far

mers. Full production helps machine dealers, truckers, fertilizer manufacturers, and on and on goes the list. U.S. farmers are expected to spend \$42 billion on machinery and equipment, ag chemicals and energy this year -- up 13% from last year. But what would the increase be with full production?

Over a million American farm families now depend on off-farm sources for a large portion of their annual income. Most of that offfarm income is derived from other rural enterprises. Thus, the very economic survival of the American farm families depends heavily on the vitality of the non-farm rural economy.

It's estimated that an additional billion dollars worth of exports creates 30,000 jobs to support agricultural production, which make it clear that as we discuss the '85 farm bill, we must production agriculture -- supported by strong exports -- and then design a program to make it work.




