King Milling & City resolve one issue; another problem is left undecided

The King Milling Company and the city are having trouble seeing eye to eye on a couple of issues that have come before recent city council meetings and a planning commission meeting. At the July 16 Lowell City Council meeting the milling company asked the council to abandon parts of Lafayette and Kent Streets as they cross the milling company's property south of Main St. east of the Flat River. King wants to construct a truck lot on the site so that their trucks can be secured nights and weekends.

The council countered with a proposal to exchange the street right of ways (the portions of the streets in question are only designated streets and have never been developed) for the King Milling owned parking lot south of Main east of the Flat River.King Doyle, president of the King Milling Co. said that they did not want to relinquish ownership of the parking lot partly because they wanted to develop a small park there marking the site of their first mill, and partly because their lawyers had advised against it. The issue was not resolved at that meeting, and a motion was made by the councilmembers to send it over to the planning commission for their opinion. The issue came up before the planners at their meeting of July 23. At that meeting the planners voted unanimously to not vacate the streets as requested by King Milling. In the interim Lowell City Manager Ray Quada and King Milling officials agreed to propose a lease to the city council; the streets would be leased to King in exchange for a lease on the parking lot. King agreed to the lease providing that the billboard at the rear of the parking lot be razed or improved and that a provision for some type of park be considered that would mark the property as an historical location. The council agreed to the compromise, and the issue was settled. The other problem between the city and King Milling is still not resolved. King Milling has a huge 500,000 bushel wheat storage bin constructed at the southwest corner of Ottawa and Broadway Streets. To the west of the bin is a truck unloading ramp

and scales. King Milling wants to construct a second bin west of there on the corner of Hudson and Ottawa Streets. A grain drying facility will also be constructed on the site.

The problem that King Milling has is that trucks can't maneuver onto the unloading ramp without swinging out onto city property to the south. This issue also came up at the July 16 meeting, and the council directed Brian Doyle, an officer with the King Milling Co. and Quada to conduct a study to determine how much of an easement was needed to accommodate the trucks. Doyle and Quada came back to the council at the August 6 meeting reporting that a 20' easement was needed.

Quada pointed out that such an easement creates a problem for a

King Doyle called the proposal an "excessive" price to pay for a 20' easement that would only be used for two weeks out of the year during the wheat harvest. Doyle estimated that such a project would cost \$10,000 or more. He then threw out an offer of \$2,000 for the assessment. Doyle said that his is the oldest company in Kent and Ottawa Counties, employs a lot of people here, and has invested heavily in the community over the years. He went on to say that the new bin and dryer would add

Councilman William Thompson asked Doyle if he would agree to paying the difference in what the city's project would cost if no easement were granted, and what it would cost if the plans are changed because of the easement. Doyle said that such an approach would be fair, but added that the problem has to be resolved at the next council meeting, or the project will have to be scraped. Some feel that emotions or an imbalanace of female hormones may play a role in dysmenorrhea, however, the most current heory is that susbstances called prostaglandins are produced by the lining of the uterus that cause the uterine wall to contract, resulting in pain. Women with severe menstrual cramps seem to produce more prostaglandins than women with mild or no cramping.


The pain of primary dysmenorrhea statrts about the same time as menstruation and may last a few hours or several days. Other symptoms associated with dysmenorrhea are headache, fatigue, flushing, nausea, irritability and diarrhea. It is felt that these symptoms may be the result of the pain the woman is experiencing or a direct action of prostaglandins.

Primary dysmenorrhea begins a few months after periods start whereas secondary dysmenorrhea begins later in life, as it takes time for the disease process or abnormality that causes it to develop. Most women with primary dysmenorrhea ovulate regularly and have regular menstrual cycles so that fertility is normal.

Any woman experiencing menstrual cramps severe enough to interupt her life style should seek medical consultation which would include a complete menstrual history, and a thorough pelvic exam. Only then can a distinction between primary and secondary causes be made. Sometimes further diagnostic tests will be required such as a pelvic ultrasound (sound waves are bounced off the pelvic organs to give us an accurate picture of the uterus, ovaries and fellopian tubes) to rule out secondary causes.

The treatment of primary dysmenorrhea is individualized depending on the severity of the pain. Starting aspirin one to two days prior to menses often is sufficient to prevent the inflammation caused by prostaglandins. The usual dose is two tablets every four to six hours. Using a heating pad for the first few hours may also help. Sometimes specific medications are prescribed by the doctor which inhibit the action and production of the prostaglandins. These should also be started a day or two prior to your period. Birth control pills are also used in women who want to prevent pregnancy. The pill prevents ovulation which in turn prevents buildup of the lining of the uterus and causes the period to be very light. Less menstrual flow leads to less pain and less production of prostaglandins.

If dysmenorrhea affects your normal activities something can almost always be done. No two women are alike and you and your doctor can decide on a particular program which will relieve your symtoms most effectively.



STATEWIDE TROUT AND **SALMON REGULATIONS**

The Natural Resources Commission, at its meeting on July 13, 1984, under the authority of Act 165, P.A. 1929, as amended, and Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended, ordered that for the period beginning September 1, 1984, and ending March 31, 1987, no person shall possess, take or attempt to take any species of trout or salmon from any of the waters of this state except by hook and line during the open seasons prescribed, and within the minimum size limits and maximum possession limits indicated below.

Statewide open seasons on all trout streams and designated trout lakes shall be from the last Saturday in April through September 30 (longer on waters designated by the Director for extended fishing under Act 165) on all trout and salmon. Statewide open seasons on all other inland lakes and the Great Lakes shall be any time for all trout and salmon except on Lake Huron and its tributary streams and on Lake Michigan and its tributary streams the season on lake trout is from May 1 through August

Size limits shall be 8 inches in Lower Peninsula streams, 7 inches on Upper Peninsula streams, and 10 inches on all lakes. The possession limit for trout and salmon shall be 5 fish singly or in combination but no more than 2 lake trout or splake from Lake Michigan and its tributary streams or 3 lake trout or splake from Lake Superior and Lake Huron and their tributary streams, except that an additional 5 brook or brown trout may be taken from streams from the last Saturday in April through September 30 only.

In addition to one day's possession limit of salmon and trout, a person may possess an additional two day's possession limit of processed salmon. For the purposes of this Commission Order the term processed means:

(a) Canned in a sealed container (b) Cured by smoking or dyring (c) Frozen in a solid state

Any processed salmon or trout aboard a vessel on the water or at dockside shall be included in the daily possession limit.

COZY corner -By Roger Brown

When people ask me what I do for kicks, I only have one reply . sailing! I don't care if it's the middle of February and it's cold enough outside to freeze your boomvang or barberhauler, my answer is still "sailing". When I tell people that my first love is sailing, I think they automatically get a picture in their mind of a 40 foot sloop moored at an expensive marina in Holland or Saugatuck.

To the contrary, my idea of sailing is jumping on my 18 foot catamaran in 20 knots of wind and white caps and seeing how fast I can get it going. I don't figure it's been a good weekend unless I flip it at least once. So, when someone has heard me talk of sailing, and gets this peaceful, noiseless, gliding through the water picture in their mind, they are in for quite a surprise when they show up at the lake for a ride:

If we've got enough wind, and where I sail we usually do, the first thing I do is lace them into a harness. Until I explain how the harness is used, all sorts of weird thoughts go through their minds and they begin to wonder if the sailing bit was just a ploy to get them into some hang gliding or something. The harness has a stainless steel hook in front that is hooked through the eye of a cable affixed to the mast (the tall pole) about 3/4 of the way up. I then show them how to hook in and slide out so that they are suspended by the cable, with only their feet touching the side of the boat. The usual response to this first on shore lesson about the harness is, "how do I get this $@#\% \times \pm \%$ &? thing off".

After a fair amount of coaxing I get them on the boat, sometimes lying about how stable the boat is because it has two hulls. The two hulls bit makes sense, but what I don't tell them is that these catamarans have about twice as much sail as they ought to have, and flipping them is no difficult task.

Once out on the water I head the boat on a beam reach, which is a sailboat's fastest course with the wind coming almost directly over the side of the boat. With the boat fairly well trimmed, but still dumping a lot of air, I go to work on my crew trying to get them into position dangling over the water. This is often easier said than done. I've had crewmembers swing out into position only to discover that they weren't hooked in. This of course means taking a bath, and I have to come about and retrieve them. I've had crewmembers lose their footing and go swinging like a circus act all the way around the stern of the boat and end up way over on the downwind side looking back over at me with eyes like saucers. The good sports in these cases (the dumber ones) try it again, and again finally mastering the technique of hanging like a puppet off the side of the boat.

The whole idea behind this harness business is to help hold down the windward side of the boat which allows the skipper to haul the sails in tighter, and go faster. Twenty five miles per hour may not seem like much when you're driving your car, but try that speed zipping through white caps while suspended from an eighth inch cable with only your toes touching the boat. I give my new crewmembers a little taste of that before the next treat.

Once they've got their sea legs, and are probably figuring that this sailing business is a piece of cake, I haul in a little more sail. As I mentioned before, these catamarans are way over-sailed, so in stiff winds it's easy to just haul your sail in so tight that you just tip over. The trick is to haul in sail, constantly adjusting the pressure on the main sheet, and tip the boat over on about a 45° angle and keep it there. This of course means that the upwind hull with the skipper and crew perched on it is a good four or five feet above the water. We call it hull flying. When I get a glance of a first time crewmember out in the trapeze, with the boat on the verge of tipping over and still making great speed, those eyes that were like saucers are now like dinner plates.

Since I'm not perfect, I sometimes get carried away and flip the boat. Just flipping over on the side because we caught a big puff, or didn't get the main sheet uncleated in time is no big deal. The boat goes over fairly slow and everybody usually has time to pick a spot and jump in the water. But, if we're really humming, and I should get over zealous and dive the downwind bow, these boats do something called pitch poling. The boat literally flips forward, and it happens "right now". The skipper is launched off the stern of the boat like he has been shot from a catipault, and you can imagine what happens to the crewmember out on the wire. A couple of times I've caught a glimpse of my crew while we're flying through the air, and those eyes that were like dinner plates were more like serving plat-

So, who wants to go sailing with me? By the way, you can forget your topsiders, green and blue whale pants and Izod shirt. A swim suit is all you need, and maybe a crash helmet if you don't feel lucky.






