
halftime crowd as well as providing the music for the pre-game parade. The Middle School Band also performed in the parade. In the game Brian Gessler

Lowell chewed up 335 yards on the ground while limiting Kenowa to just 60 yards rushing. The Knights relied on the passing arm of Brian Lawrence, who hit 4 of 18 passes for 141 vards.

Dennis Jannenga, who added 72 yards to Lowell's ground game, put the Red Arrows on the board with a 25-yard run in the first period and Gessler sprinted 26 yards for another TD in the first period. A Red Arrow safety, when Kenowa's punter stepped out of the end zone, made it 16-0 after one quarter.

Gessler broke loose on a 55yard TD dash in the second quarter and Dumas raced 29 yards for another score to give Lowell a 29-0 command in the second period. Kenowa got on the board Marculis scored from the two.

tion held its regular Board meeting on Monday, October 8, 1984 in the Board offices. Following the payment of bills, the Board took action on several personnel items. Pam Heemstra was appointed as the new JV Football and Basketball Cheerleading Advisor and Laurie Rehl as the new high school Debate Coach under extra-duty contracts. Mike Fillman was hired as a 5th grade teacher at Alto Elementary School for the 1984-85 school year due to heavy class sizes. The Board granted a ten day unpaid leave to Joan Allinder, a middel school teacher, in order for her to attend an Educational Opportunities Tour of the Middle East, and also granted an unpaid medical leave to Alto teacher, Kim Lum, beginning October 8, 1984 and terminating at the beginning of the day on January 3, 1985.



After recounting how the two of them met and the story of their romance, Grandma said "Isn't that something, Sue? It was forty-nine years ago, and I still remember

There are some things one doesn't forget easily - like love affairs and other memorable events. There are certain things Christians should remember.

The children of Israel had crossed the Red Sea and traversed the wilderness. But they had yet to enter and possess the land of Canaan. This was no task for sissies. It demanded strength and courage. Thus, Moses exhorted his followers to recall the mercies of God, the miracles which He had per-







Acne is the most common skin disorder in the United States. Although not disabling, it is socially distressing to some degree in 50-60% of all adolescents and may leave physical or psychological scars that last a lifetime.

The sebaceous follicles on the face and trunk normally produce sebum. In acne, both an overproduction of sebum and excessive cohesiveness of the cells lining the duct cause congestion and partial blockage of the follicle. During puberty an increase in sex hormones results in elevated sebum production. Heredity also plays a role as an estimated 70% of acne patients have a positive family history of acne. A bacteria called Proprionobacterium acnes is found in much greater quantities at puberty and in individuals prone to acne. The bacteria degrades the normal sebum which then acts as an irritant resulting in acne.

Before we review the management of acne, let's discuss some common issues that are important for all acne patients.

1) Picking and popping the pimples by patients may lead to further inflammation and scarring, so this should definitely be 2) Acne is not caused by dirt. Excessive scrubbing may actually

make it worse. Wash, don't scrub, twice daily 3) Cosmetics have been implicated in acne formation, especially those containing sodium lauryl sulfate, isopropyl myristate, and

lipids. Before using cosmetics look at the ingredient label. 4) Acne patients do not generally need moisturizing lotions and

5) Eat a healthy diet. It is not felt that foods such as chocolate, coke, or greasy foods increase acne production.

6) Stress may cause an increase in acne formation. 7) Treatment controls acne. It does not cure it! Treatment should

be considered as a long term program. Medicine for acne can be started at home by using benzoyl

peroxide 5% applied to the face or problem area twice daily. There are many different brands on the market so, once again, check the label. A 10% formulation is also available. Side effects of benzoyl peroxide are mild peeling, flaking and irritation of the skin. Further treatment is indicated if there is no improvement with

benzoyl peroxide after 6-8 weeks. Your doctor may prescribe Retinoic acid, topical or systemic antibiotics or more potent agents, depending on the severity of each individual case. Follow your doctor's instructions and work together, so the best possible results can






