

ness here the bank has found that they have just plain outgrown their facility, and have approved a \$450,000 expansion project to the south of the existing building, nearly doubling their floor space. The new addition will add two more teller's windows bringing the total to nine, double the drive-up banking lanes to four and accomodate several new offices and sorely needed room in the bank's computer and bookkeeping department.

"For nearly a year now two bank officials have been sharing space in the bank's boardroom", said the bank's President Keith Caldwell, adding, "we had to do something, and after much discussion it was decided that adding on to our present facility was more cost effective than constructing a complete new building". The bank's directors had discussed a new building on bank property near the Westown Branch, but after property purchases to the south and west of the main office were made, it became more economical go with an addition.

Dan Vos Construction of Ada will be the contractor on the project, and work should begin this week. The addition will be in much the same design as the original building, and will measure 114' x 47', about the same dimensions as the present building. The Main Street entrance will be left pretty much as is, but the main entrance to the bank will be built at the center of the west end where there will be a 13 space customer parking lot. Four new drive-up banking lanes will

The drive-up windows will be closed during early phases of the construction, but bank officials hope to get the new drive-up equipment installed and working while construction is being completed on the building itself. **ARTHRITIS - PART I** One of the most common afflications of mankind is osteoarthritis. All vertebrate animals can develop arthristis. Evidence of arthritis exists in prehistoric animals and early forms of man! Some humans will develop arthritis by age 20, while almost all wil experience arthritis by age 70! There are many forms of arthritis. The most common arthritis is osteoarthritis, which causes more incapacity, loss of time from work and disability than any other joint disease.

Osteoarthritis, more correctly termed degenerative joint disease, is a loss of the protective covering over bones at the margins of joints. Cartilage, a firm, smooth, shock absorbing tissue, covers the ends of bones at the joint space and allows for painless movement of our bones. As we age, an imbalance between stresses applied to the cartilage and bone leads to a wearing away of the cartilage and an increased density of the exposed bone. The rough margins of bone will not move over each other as easily as before. This leads to pain, inflammation and limitation of motion. Obesity has long been blamed for arthritis but no evidence exists to link obesity and arthritic development, although excessive weight will undoubtedly aggravate symptoms in weight bearing joints.

The hip, spine, knee and larger joints are the most common sites of involvement. The onset of degenerative joint disease is slow. Initially there is stiffness, followed by pain on motion of the joint which is made worse by prolonged activity and is usually relieved by rest. Deformity of the joint can occur with bony enlargement and limitation of range of motion.

Diagnosis is made on symptoms and x-ray findings. Early diagnosis is difficult but recognition of advanced stages could be made by a first year medical student. Stiffness after any period of rest especially in the morning is common. Some people will experience sensitivity to weather changes with aching in the affected joints. Movement seems to aggravate symptoms while rest brings relief. X-rays show narrowing of the joint space, sharpened boney margins, calcium deposits, and thickened, dense bone. There is no specific lab test used to diagnose degenerative joint disease.


Although there is no cure for arthritis, proper treatment can improve symptoms drastically and thereby improve function. Next week we will discuss the multifaceted approach to treating arthritis including physical therapy, rest, medicine and surgery.



### City Helps pay for Fireworks

The Lowell City Council voted themselves into a good old fashioned split decision at their regular meeting Monday evening. The issue at stake was a request from the Lowell Area Chamber of Commerce for some financial help from the city to pay off a \$950.72 debt left over from this year's 4th of July fireworks display. Representing the Chamber was Board Member Bob Pfaller. Pfaller said that in the future the Chamber would raise money in advance for the fireworks display, and then only buy fireworks that could be paid for with that amount. Chamber president Jerry Patton added that the newly reorganized Chamber was left with this deficit, and needed some help in paying it.

Lowell City Manager Ray Quada said that in a sampling of area municipalities he found that other communitities were pretty evenly split by those that totally funded fireworks displays, partially funded them or did not participate at all. Councilman Bill Thompson raised the quest of, "What happens next time an organization asks for funds after the fact?" Patton and Pfaller repeated that this was a "one-time" request, and that it would not happen again.

Finally, after much discussion, councilman Phil Schneider offered a motion to pay \$600.00 of the bill. Councilman Jack Fonger seconded the motion, and Mayor Jim Maatman called for a vote. Schneider and Fonger voted yes, but Thompson and Dean Collins cast no votes. It was left up to Mayor to break the tie, and Maatman voted yes.

In other council busines it was decided to move the Helen Look Daly funds from the Dean, Witter & Reynolds account in Tuscon, AZ to Buys, McGregor and MacNaughton in Grand Rapids. The move was made because the Daly's broker, Bob Crawford is leaving Dean, Witter and Reynolds, and Quada recommended that now might be a good time to make the move. Nearly all of the approximately \$3/4 million is invested in government Genny Mae bonds.
