Blind golf pro promotes leader dogs

Rivers, golfs regularly and carries a 28 handicap. What's so inspirational about a 28 handicap golf pro? Nothing, unless he has been blind since 1970.

Matthews, 48, lost his sight to sugar diabetes fifteen years ago, and a foot and part of his left leg to the disease five years ago. But, while listening to Matthews one soon learns that these handicaps have done little to slow him down or dim his enthusiasm. He quips, "when someone wants to play a round of golf with me I ask for two strokes a hole, or offer to play them even at midnight." Matthews prothesis is a relatively new one with a flexible ankle. The doctor who designed it said a patient of his that switched from a solid ankle to a flexible one claimed he shaved ten strokes off his golf game because of it. Matthews passed this information along to the surgeon at the Mayo Clinic who amputated his foot adding, "if this is really true, I'll be back next year to have the other taken off." Hardly the type of comments one would expect from a family man of his life.

Matthews speaks frequently to all sorts of groups, but his message isn't about golf or his handicaps, it is to promote the Lions Leader Dog School in Rochester, Michigan. Three years after he lost his sight, Matthews decided it was time to quit relying so heavily on other people and get a leader dog. He now says he's sorry he didn't do it sooner. He now walks with the aid of his second leader dog, A Golden Retriever named Nugget.

Over the past eleven years, Matthews has given over 500 speaking engagements that have directly or indirectly resulted in thousands of dollars in donations to the leader dog program. In 1975 Matthews organized the annual Greg Matthews Pro-Ce-Lions charities such as the dogs. The school has about 290 Hairstyling. Phone 671-8102.

The 1984 tournament included 40 LPGA Tour Stars, 40 WMPGA professionals and 120 amateurs. This event alone has now raised over \$40,000 for Lions charities.

The Lions Leader Dog program at Rochester is the largest of the five leader dog schools in the nation, and is the only one sponsored by the Lions Club. The school graduates approximately 325 teams per year at no cost to the students other than their phone calls home. Matthews says the cost to put a team on the street is about \$7,500, which adds up to a \$2.25 million per year budget for the school.

The dogs at the school are all either Golden Retrievers, Lab-Retrievers, rador Shephards, Shepard/Retriever mixes and a few Rhodesian Ridgebacks. The Ridgebacks are primarily show dogs, and when the distinctive ridge of long hair on their backs is not quite right, they are often donated to the program. Matthews said that these breeds are used because of their so severly afflicted in the prime intelligence, temperment, and size. The dogs are both male and female when they enter the program, but as Matthews says, "they are all "its" when they go out on the street." The dogs come from a variety of sources, but most are donated or sold to the school at a very low cost. Only about 21% of the dogs taken in meet the qualifications and complete the four month

A fairly new program has people raising dogs from puppies to the desireable training age of one to two years. These dogs wear banners proclaiming that they are leader dog trainees when out in the public, and are allowed in all public places by law, just as real leader dogs are. dogs in kennel at any given time, and Matthews says their kennel conditions border on the plush side, with heated ceramic tile rooms complete with running water that the dogs dispense with their muzzles.

Matthews says that the one month school for the humans is quite an experience. The instructors are tough, yet understanding with the students. Matthews said that when he checked in he was given a room number on the second floor and told to "find it." For the first few days the instructors work with the students substituting themselves for leader dogs. Matthews said that the students are quite embarassed about being led around the city of Rochester by a wise guy instruc-

tor pretending he's a dog .. All this serves a purpose as the instructors use this time to learn the traits of the students so that they will be able to match them up with the best dog for their individual needs.

Once the student and dog are teamed up, the remaining weeks are spent in learning techniques. getting to know each other but most of all, learning to put your trust in the eyes of the dog. Matthews says that very few do not complete the course, and go on to lead more productive lives.

She explained that when she had started school in an old country school the teacher made her write with her right hand, even though she was a natural lefty. 

Compete in Science Olympiad

Because of their total team points, Lowell High School placed third overall out of the fifteen teams in their division and will therefore compete in the State Science Olympiad Tournament, April 27 at Michigan State University.

Lowell Science Olympiad Team

I am somewhat sorry I ever started writing about water pollution in this column. I keep coming across information concerning the subject which I feel compelled to bring to peoples attention.

Recently, the E.P.A., Environmental Protection Agency, released some astronomical figures required to clean up the known toxic dump sites. These sites range in size from a leaking chemical vat all the way up to the poisoned upper New York State community of Love Canal

The investigative arm of congress, The G.A.O. is asking additional funding for the federal "Superfund" for pollution clean up of \$39.1 billion. In addition to this, the states would be required to spend \$7.6 billion and private industry, or those responsible for the toxic pollutants would be required to pay some \$26.1 billion.

The EPA and GAO are the first to admit that this is the tip of the iceberg since new sites keep coming to light almost daily. These now known sites, one way or the other, are going to cost the U.S. taxpayer over \$70 billion to clean up. I am sure these now known sites will eventually cost at least double the estimated amount. I have never heard of any government project yet which did not result in at least a 100% cost overrun. Based upon this you can rest assured that these known sites will cost at least \$150 billion.

I am also equally certain that not over 50% of the actual sites are now known. Bearing this is mind, we are actually looking at a federal clean up project of some \$300 billion. This figure is mind boggling and actually rivals the entire national debt.

It would appear that we are in a position of "damned if we do, and damned if we don't." These toxic dump sites pose a health hazard to all living beings on this continent and must be cleaned up. On the other hand, how can we realistically spend this money which we do not have? \$300 billion represents approximately \$850 for every man, woman, and child in this nation. Can we afford not to clean up? We must, but how?
