

cozy corner

One of my father's favorite cliches has always been, "Three moves are as good as a fire". Well, we just moved last week, and it was our third move in thirteen years of marriage. Though my father's words of wisdom aren't entirely correct, he wasn't far off. It wouldn't take too many fingers to count the items that were with us when we moved into our first apartment, and still with us for this move. Some of my old Army uniforms, a few of the more durable wedding gifts and a few small personal items would just about catch all of our original equipment.

Of course this doesn't mean that we didn't have anything to move! It's amazing how much JUNK a family of four can accumulate in thirteen years. We gave the garbage collectors a real workout every Wednesday for about three weeks running. We built mounds of junk out by the street that would rival the Calder stable in Grand Rapids. One trash heap was so large that I suggested we give it a name. "Garbage Giganticus", "Trash Can Titantic" and "Mounds of Memories" were a few that came to mind.

We had a key to our new house for about two weeks prior to moving day. Since it is only about three blocks from one house to the other, we made innumerable trips with carloads of micellaneous items. Working until midnight nearly every night of the week we were successful in hauling most of the junk that would fit into a car. Clothes, basement junk, garage junk, TVs, stereo, pots and pans, dishes, food, linens, Christmas decorations... all that kind of stuff was already moved and squirreled away before "moving day". So, when moving day rolled around, I told my crew of volunteers, "this will be a piece of cake, all we have to move is the furniture and we're done". I had moving sounding so easy that I even started looking forward to it.

When the big day rolled around we went at it like killing snakes, (another one of my father's cliches). I guess I just never stopped to calculate how much moving is involved in four bedrooms, a family room, dinette set, living room, etc. I also hadn't prepared myself, or my volunteers, for a freezer, pool table, king size water bed and an upright player piano. We were all moving a lot quicker at 9:00 in the morning than we were at 5:00 that afternoon when we finished. We had planned on a big party that evening, but everybody was so tired that they just drifted off toward home when we were done. That's a heck of a way to treat a guy's brothers and friends, isn't it?

For weeks prior to the move I received letters from moving companies almost daily. My name must have popped up on their mailing lists when our house was listed. I opened the first two or three, then just started throwing them away, determined to move myself. But, if there ever is a "next time", I may just look at those letters a little more closely. I know that I have two brothers and two buddies with barked knuckles, wrenched backs and aching muscles who would say, "here, here" to that proposal.

Bedwetting in Children New Treatment Approaches

Bedwetting in children (called nocturnal enuresis) is a common childhood problem. Several plausible causes have been identified, and in the next two articles we will examine recent thoughts on both

There is a vast amount of literature continually being published bill prior to adjournment. The bill is written to have on nocturnal enuresis. Studies indicate that it is a problem in about 15 percent of five-year-olds, 7 percent of eight-year-olds, and 3 per-

> The many factors implicated in the cause of enuresis can be broadly classified into three groups: adverse environmental circumstances, psychological disturbances, and physiologic mechanisms (sleep disorders or truly something wrong with the urinary tract).

> Adverse Environment Circumstances - An over crowded household, a broken home and substitute parenting, emotionally traumatic events, fear of the dark or the sound of a flushing toilet, and a poor history of toilet training are among the adverse environmental circumstances proposed as causative factors in nocturnal enuresis.

> Psychologic Disturbance - Although enuresis is usually an isolated disorder, there are cases in which it is linked with problem behavior. Enuresis is most likely to be associated with other behavior problems if the child is older and female, and if incontinence occurs during the day as well as at night. Sometimes enuresis is a manifestation of psychologic disturbance of family members other than the bedwetter. Certain studies have noted that enuresis seems more common in children whose mothers were domineering, neurotic or were overly ambitious for their children.

> Physiologic Mechanisms - Enuresis may be associated with a genetic predisposition, developmental delay, actual pathology of the urinary tract, or sleep patterns. It has been found that in approximately 70 percent of families with a bedwetting child, at least one other sibling also has had the problem. In 40 percent of the families with an enuretic child at least one of the child's parents had enuresis in childhood. These findings tend to indicate that enuresis has a family pattern. A urine sample should routinely be obtained to rule out infection


