A car owned by Anna Porritt was struck by a hit and run driver in the Rite Aid parking lot Thursday afternoon, October 24.



Consumers Power employees prepare a 500,000 pound transformer for a 100 mile rail trip from a substation near Midland to a similar facility at Lowell. Five years of sustained economic growth in the western part of the state created the need for this equipment which will permit more high voltage power to be brought into the area. Consumers Power will pay \$100,000 for the move, well below the \$1.9 million cost of a new transformer.

growing demand for electricity in the western part of the state, especially the greater Grand Rapids area. Paul E. Roney, Grand Rapids district manager for Consumers Power says, "Demand for electricity in this area has gone up some 4.4 percent for each of the last five years. That's more than double the average

growth in demand for the total Consumers Power system."

Joe Powers, senior vice president for the Grand Rapids Area Chamber of Commerce says, "Many of the communities in this part of the state have experienced steady, diversified growth over the last ten years, but since 1980 economic activity has really mushroomed. This project shows Consumers Power shares that optimistic outlook for our future."

Meeting that demand with a stable supply of power will be easier, once the Vergennes project is completed. The high-capacity transformer will allow the Company to provide larger

supplies of electricity from its generating plants. The high-voltage electricity will then be reduced in voltage as it flows through the system on the way to Consumers Power cutomers.

With the resurgence of bow and camera hunting, scent lure use has once again come into wide spread use. The use of lures by hunters is thousands of years old. However, with the advent of the long range rifles, the art of compounding and using these lures was lost. Now the demand for lures is great and the manufacturers are falling all over themselves in an attempt to corner the market. The problem is that very few know, or care about compounding lures.

In even poorer shape, are the hunters who misuse these lures, They follow the manufacturer's suggestions on use, and I have never seen one manufacturer's suggestion which was correct. They recommend placing the lure on your boots or sell clip or pin on dispensers and scent pads to place on your clothing or at your blind. These recommendations are completely wrong. Lures should never be placed upon clothing or at your blind. Deer, like most animals have acute senses of smell, hearing, and eyesight, and at close range their senses of smell and hearing can pinpoint objects just as accurately as eyesight. If you want the deer to focus and concentrate directly on you, follow these instructions, if not, place your lure where you want them to focus their attention.

There are three basic types of scent lures available. They are gland, curiosity and food. Gland lures fall into two categories. These are natural and in heat type lures. Natural lures are compounded from deer glands and secretions taken at any time. In heat, or Matrix lures are from these same glands and secretions, but should be taken from only does during the peak of their acceptance period. Curiosity lures, are just that. They excite curiosity, without enhancing suspicion or fear. This lure is used very little by the hunter of today, but should be the primary lure used during pre rut and post rut periods. It is a valuable lure to the trapper and works well at all seasons. I have compounded and used a fox and coyote long distance curiosity lure for many years, with excellent results. I also have had deer travel in a direct line, across open fields, for a quarter mile, directly to this lure. Food type lures are the most widely used of any modern day lure, and the poorest choice for deer. During the fall the deer have a choice of all their favorite foods, and not much interested in food type lures. Most of these lures consist of a drop of apple, carrot, acorn or corn extract in an ounce of low grade glycerine. Anyone can compound a quart of this for less than five dollars. They should work fine for attracting other apples, carrots or acorns, but are not very interesting to deer during this time of

I have been a successful trapper for some forty years and one secret to this success is understanding, compounding and using lures. Learn to use lures correctly and your hunting will greatly improve. Do not follow manufacturer's suggestions, and place lure upon your clothing or at your blind. Put it where you want the deer's attention. Keep yourself and your location as scent free as possible.







Community Fund has helped many

With the annual United Way campaign now in progress, members of the Lowell Community Fund asked that we present a brief history of the fund to include its conception, and how it is related to the United Way. Lowell is quite unique, in that many of those donating to the United Way can request that a portion of their contribution be sent back to the Lowell Community Fund, and in turn be put to use helping the community.

The Lowell Community Fund was organized Feb. 9, 1955 with three members selected from the Lowell Rotary Club and three from the Lowell Lions club. The six men were Elmer Schaefer. Ray Avery, Gerald Rollins, Sandy Watterson, Frank Battistella and Bill Jones. Dr. Robert Reagan was elected Sec.-Treas. in.Oct. 1955, and still services in that capacity. The main purpose for setting up this fund was to share with the United Way a portion of the money collected in the Lowell area each year. The percentage was set at 25%. Only one other cummunity in Kent County still has this arrange-

In 1958 the Community Fund collected \$4,900.00 and \$1,237.00 was returned to Lowell. This was in turn divided between the Boy Scouts, and Lions Swimming Pool Fund (\$300.00 to Scouts and \$900.00 to the Lions). This practice continued until the early 1960's.

In 1964 various other groups began requesting funds. The Community Fund's by-laws were changed so that requests for operating expenses could be honored as well as those requests for capital expenditures.

Since 1955 the following oranizations have shared over 52,000.00: Boy Scouts, Cub couts, Campfire, Girl Scouts, for Understanding, YMCA, various Lions and Rotary projects. Lowell Community Center, Senior Citizens Center,

car the week of October 28, the transformer's two-day rail trip will begin November 4. The railroad will use a special train, including "dummy" cars to transport the unit. "Dummy" cars are regular flatbed railcars that are added to extend the length of the freight train so the locomotive and its heavy cargo don't end up crossing a railroad trestle to-

Once in Lowell, the transformer will be loaded onto a special trailer and trucked the final ten miles to the Vergennes substation.

This transformer is one of two originally installed at Tittabawassee substation as part of a high-voltage transmission system in the early 1970s. Sub-

sequent expansion of that system, which included additional support equipment, allows this transformer to be put to better use, meeting the growing needs on the west side of the state. The move will cost an estimated \$100,000, well below the \$1.9 million price tag on a new transformer.
