Lowell may soon see the construction of five sorely needed four-family apartment buildings. Bob Koetje, owner of a long, narrow parcel of property on the east side of N. Center Street, unveiled his plans before the Lowell Planning Commission at their regular monthly meeting Monday evening. Koetje intends to parcel the property off into five lots, with a four family unit and adequate parking on each lot. Koetje, of 9292 68th St., Alto, recently constructed a duplex apartment building on the Center Street property.

Lowell City Planner, Paul LeBlanc of WBDC Achitects & Engineers, had reviewed Koetje's preliminary plan, and stated that it met with approved use of the property under the zoning ordinance. LeBlanc did indicate the plans needed to be more complete and more detailed before the city could approve them. Koetje said that he realized the need for more detailed plans, but wanted to get a preliminary drawing before the

LeBlanc questioned Koetje's plan to parcel off the property. He suggested that leaving the property intact might even make room for an additional unit, and would likely require less driveways. Koetje responded that he might possibly want to sell the buildings in the future, and theorized that they would be easier to sell if separated.

Koetje told the commissioners that the buildings would all be of the same design, and that he intends to build them one-at-atime, as his finances allow.

The commissioners agreed that the apartment buildings would make good use of the parcel, and directed Koetje to proceed with his project while working with LeBlanc to insure that building and zoning requirements are met.







CURRENT FACTS ABOUT A.I.D.S. PART 3 In the last of our 3 part articles on AIDS we'll touch on blood donation and prevention.

Is there a danger of contracting AIDS from donating blood? NO. Blood banks and other blood collection centers use sterile equipment and disposable needles. The need for blood is always acute, and people who are not at increased risk for getting AIDS are urged to continue to donate blood as they have in the past Can AIDS be prevented

YES. Cases of AIDS related to medical use of blood or blood products are being prevented by use of HTLV-III antibody screening tests at blood donor sites and by members of high risk groups voluntarily not donating blood.

The Public Health Service recommends that the following steps be taken to prevent the spread of AIDS:

Do not have sexual contact with persons known or suspected Persons who are at high risk for having AIDS should not donate

Don't abuse IV drugs. If you use IV drugs, then don't share

cozy corner

Last week I filled this space with a lot of hoopla about replacing our old typesetter. I even got a little bit sentimental about writing my last column on old "Big Guy". Well, it's a week later, and I'm still banging away on old "Big Guy". I should have guessed that things wouldn't go according to plan. Everybody knows that when making any big investment, "Murphy's Law" comes into play somewhere along the line.

In this case, "Murphy" came in the form of a young, red haired service technician. I began to have my doubts about the kid when we vere uncrating the two new machines. They were bolted to wooden pallets with hex head machine bolts. When he asked if he could borpointed out the "Allen Wrench" taped to the front of the machine

I helped him wrestle the machine into place, and he immediately at down to read his installation procedures. It was then that I asked him if he had ever installed a CRTronic 300 and CRTerminal. "No" he replied. "Have you ever worked on one?", I asked. "Well, helped another technician work on a 300 one time", he answered. At least he was honest about it, though I probably would have felt bet-

I can't blame the technician for being inexperienced, and I can't really blame the company for sending a "trained" (he had completed their school) technician out into the field to get his feet wet. But, why did they have to send him to me? I conjured up a picture of the technician in a phone booth that morning, opening a package containing an 8 X 10 glossy of a CRTronic 300 and listening to a tape that went something like . . . "Dave, your mission, should you decide to accept it, is to install a CRTronic 300 and terminal at the Grand Valley Ledger. We realize that you've never installed this equipment before, but there's always a first time. The owner can be an impatient "bear" to deal with, so be careful. Good luck. This tape will self destruct in five seconds". From there on on out, the day went more like a "Beverly Hillbillies" re-run, than a "Mission Im-

The technician was here on a Monday, the day I use to call on advertising accounts. I kept stopping by the Ledger to see how things were going. I left once as he began to take the covers off the machines. I came back twenty minutes later to find him still struggling with one of them. He finally had the covers off, and was looking for the power cord when I left again. I returned about 45 minutes later, and he was still looking for the power cord. He theorized that the company probably didn't ship a power cord for the new CRTronic that I was trading in. No kidding, he actually said that. "Right", I said, "That's like buying a new Mercedes and being expected to use the tires off your old one". He finally found the cord

He admitted that he had lost his diagnostic software, and could only make the machine run by getting my operator to patch together some software from our old typesetter. He was overjoyed when he finally got the machine to output a couple of lines of type. He showed the type to me, and I sarcastically said, "Whoopee!". shown extensive samples of fine grids, huge type, small type slanted type, etc. I finally told him that I would run some tests of my

He packed up his tools, and put on his coat. Before he left, he shoved a couple of documents at me. One was his work report which basically accounts for his time. The other was an "Installation Acceptance", which stated "Customer acknowledges that the following equipment has been satisfactorily installed on the date indicated and accepts same without exception". 



WHEREAS, in accordance with the Base Contracts, the County of Kent has acquired, operated and maintained landfill refuse disposal sites in the County for the benefit of said public corporations; and

WHEREAS, Section 25 of Act No. 641 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1978, as amended (sometimes to Base Contracts. hereinafter referred to as "Act 641") requires all counties to adopt a solid waste management plan; and

WHEREAS, the County adopted its Solid Waste Management Plan pursuant to the provisions of Act 641, which Plan was approved by the governing bodies of not less than 67% of municipalities within the County and by the Director of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources both as required by Act 641; and

WHEREAS, Section 25 of Act 641 requires solid waste management plans to include an enforceable program and process to assure that the nonhazardous solid waste generated or to be generated for a 20-year period is collected and recovered, processed, or disposed of at facilities which comply with Act 641 and rules promulgated pursuant to the provisions of Act 641; and WHEREAS, Section 24 of Act 641 provides that a municipality or a county shall assure that all solid waste is removed from sites of generation frequently enough to protect the public health and is delivered to

licensed solid waste disposal areas; and WHEREAS, Section 30(1)(c) of Act 641 provides that the rules of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources shall require solid waste management plans to evaluate and select technically and economically feasible solid waste management options which may include resource recovery systems; and

WHEREAS, the Kent County Solid Waste Management Plan recommends the construction and operation of a refuse-to-energy facility, i.e., a mass-burn steam confirmed energy generating incinerator with an average daily processing capacity of approximately 625 tons per day, to be a part of the System previously established under Act 185 and to be acquired with the proceeds of County bonds and/or by contract or lease with public or private

WHEREAS, the County now intends to improve, enlarge and extend the System by the acquisition of a mass burn steam energy generating incinerator and related facilities including facilities for or contracts for the sale and/or distribution of steam and/or electric energy all of which facilities will be located in the City of Grand Rapids in the County (herein sometimes called the "Project" or the "MBI"); and

Some of these tournaments advertise enormous sums of money for first prize, and some pay down 71/2 miles, with a lower first place being advertised. A word of caution to you, the tournament bowler, be sure that any tournament you enter is ABC/ WIBC sanctioned! Why? Both the ABC (American Bowling Congress) and the WIBC (Women's International Bowling Congress) protect you the bowler from deceitful proprietors, as far as your Administration prize money goes, and believe me, there are a few slightly shadey

Another word of warning before you pay good money to bowl "For The Gold". Case in point, a few years ago there was a tournament up north that advertised \$50,000 for first place, guaranteed. Entries weren't up to the proprietor's expectations, so he took it upon himself to reduce the overall prize fund. ABC took the proprietor to court and forced him to pay out the guaranteed first place money, which made the winner happy, but not one other bowler received as much as plug nickel for their efforts. Needless to say, the tournament no longer exists.

Finally, don't go into any tournament with the idea you're going to win it. Why? Because you're going to be deeply disappointed why you don't, unless you are an exceptional bowler who has that very special "killer instinct" built in. Go into your tournament play with the sole purpose of cashing, or at least getting your entry fee back, anything more than that is the proverbial "frosting on the cake". Sure, it's nice to win, but I look at it this way: If I cashed in a tournament and at least got my money back, I must have beaten out a lot of those who didn't cash, and in my mind that makes me a winner. Tournaments can be great fun, if you let them, and they're a great way to sharpen your bowling skills. It stands to reason that you bowl better if you bowl with better bowlers, or in tournament competition.





vironmental impact, noise and appearances were among them.

Quada updated the commissioners on the downtown re-hab projects, which include all the new paint and awnings on many Main Street businesses. Quada said that about nine projects are complete, and about five more are in the works. Quada said that there is still a lot of money left in this federally funded project. Michigan's banking regulations will be vastly overhauled under legislation approved by the Senate, and waiting for a signature by the Governor.

Long-awaited reforms to branch banking, interstate banking, bank powers and venture capital investments were approved by the Legislature last year, but were vetoed by the Governor. The current bill addresses the concerns the Governor had with the last bill, and should be signed into law before Thanksgiving.

Current law limits bank branching to the same county, or a 25-mile radius of the main office. Banks are also constrained from branching into an incorporated area (city or village) where a bank or branch bank is already in operation. HB 5105 allows state banks to create regional banks, which could then build branches. A new branching regulation would also establish a two-and -one-half year waiting period before that bank could become a branch. Also, independent banks could consolidate statewide.

Interstate banking restrictions would also be drastically changed. HB 5105 would permit a bank holding company in Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Ohio or Wisconsin to acquire Michi-

gave Michigan the same right. After October 1, 1988, reciprocal banking would be authorized nationwide. Holding companies acquiring Michigan banks must agree to abide by Michigan's interest-rate laws and consumer protections, although credit card companies operating in Michigan would not be subject to the rate restrictions.

Bank powers would also be changed under HB 5105. Federal legislation enacted in 1982 eased restrictions on national banks, creating a competitive imbalance between national banks and state-chartered banks. HB 5105 would ease restrictions on state banks, including giving state banks new purchasing power, increasing lending limits, and allowing more flexibility in making real estate loans.

Finally, HB 5105 would au thorize a bank to make ventur capital investments in emerging growth companies and in professional veture capital companies, which they cannot currently do.

Michigan's banking regulations haven't been updated in years, while national bank deregulation has brought swift and drastic changes to nationwide financial institutions. HB 5105 will help Michigan stay compet tive -- and on the leading edge of the ever-growing and changgan banks if law in those states ing financial industry.
