repeatedly over recent years, but has always gone unresolved because of concerns over how to enforce a snow removal ordinance, and a lack of manpower to clear sidewalks if homeowners don't. At the November 18 meeting City Manager Ray Quada was instructed to draft a suggested snow removal ordinance, and have it ready for the December 2 meeting.

The document prepared by Quada calls for removal of snow from all sidewalks within 24 hours of each accumulation. It also calls for a path to be cleared properties without sidewalk, but adjoin existing sidewalk at the property line. The suggested ordinance calls for a fine of not less than \$50 and payment of costs to remove

The need for a snow removal ordinance varies widely among the council members. Maatman represents one end of the spectrum, emphatically citing a need for clear sidewalks as a safety factor, especially for children. On the other end, Dean Collins calls work on a snow removal ordinance, "A gross waste of time". Collins feels that the city has neither the money or the manpower to enforce such an or-

Park's name draws flak

How does "Creekside Park" sound to you? That's the new name given to what has been referred to as West End Park. The Lowell City Council asked the Lowell Parks and Recreation Committee to discuss a possible name for the new park, and Creekside was the final recommendation.

In their statement to the city council the parks committee said that they chose not to name the park after Cherry Creek, the Valley Vista Subdivision, adjacent streets or by geographic designations for various reasons. The committee members also declined to name the park after a person or persons because of the difficulty in selection.

In addition to naming the park, the committee members also feel it is important to name the individual softball and soccer fields. They suggested White Pine, Maple, Spruce and Oak for the softball fields and Locust and Elm for the soccer fields. The names are all those of native trees, and thje parks committee members suggested plant representative trees around the perimeter of each field.

Quada suggested that the issue could be brought up at a publicized public hearing during the December 16 council meeting. "That wouldn't meet public hearing requirements so that an ordinance could be adopted at that time, but we could get some input from the public", Quada said. Councilman Thompson and Maatman asked

if the ordinance could be adopted if the public hearing were held during the first meeiting in January. Quada informed them that there was sufficient time to advertise the public hearing so that the ordinance could be adopted at the January 6 meeting. By a concensus of the council, Quada was instructed to proceed with the neccesary steps to place the issue before the council at that meeting. If adopted, the ordinance could go into effect immediately



GALLBLADDER ATTACKS

We will frequently see patients in the office complaining of 'gall bladder attacks", this is usually described as pain or cramping in the right upper abdomen which has been present for a variable length of time. Some of these patients will have acutely inflamed gallbladders which is the topic of our discussion today.

Cholecystitis is the medical term for an inflamed gallbladder. This usually occurs after a gall stone becomes impacted in the duct of the gall bladder resulting in obstruction and inflammation. Gallstones are much more common in women and seem to increase in frequency with aging. American Indians have a very high rate of gallstones and resulting cholecystitis. Patients with Crohn's disease or diabetes will also have a greater incidence of gallstones.

The "gallbladder attack" is usually proceded by a fatty meal and is characterized by severe cramping pain located in the upper abdomen, right lower rib cage or mid right back. Nausea and vomiting is usually present and fever is quite common. The attack generally subsides after 8-16 hours.

The diagnosis of cholecystitis can generally be made after checking the history and performing a physical examination. Certain lab tests may be ordered which will indicate inflammation of the biliary

Once the diagnosis of cholecystitis is made conserative treatment is begun to "put out the fire" until definitive therapy is available. Usually the patient is instructed not to eat anything for several hours. Antacids and analgesics are prescribed. In more severe cases antibiotics and some times hospitalization may be required. Once the acute inflammation subsides a gallbladder ultrasound (a sound wave picture of the gallbladder) will be ordered to assess the presence of stones. The patient will usually be scheduled for gallbladder removal (cholecystectomy) at a later date unless the acute symptoms fail to subside or complications occur.

Recently, medication has been approved for use in disolving gallstones. This is an alternative to surgical treatment. The medication is expensive and there are frequent side effects and it must be taken for at least one year and possibly longer. After the medication is stopped there is a 25-50% chance of recurence of stones within 5 years. In selected cases, medication may be a viable alternative but surgery is still the treatment of choice.

We plan to introduce a series of bills defining foster care criteria and bringing greater legislative and judicial oversight to the foster care program. The bills will set clear guidelines for removing children from their natural homes, and will clarify the role of the court. They will also set up frequent reviews by the court to determine the next step in an overall case plan. cally. He went so far as to call the new name, "stupid", and stated



Michigan 1985 regular gun deer season is now history and another excellent season was enjoyed by hunters. The total deer harvest will amount to nearly 200,000 animals. Since the average Michigan whitetail will produce about 70 lbs. of venison, 14 million pounds of excellent meat now grace the larders of successful hun-

I would like to make one early prediction concerning the 1986 season. Remember, you read it here first. For several reasons, I predict next year to see the largest harvest of big bucks in Michigan's history. Wider dissemination of the herds are one reason. We now have excellent, established populations of whitetails throughout the state. This has resulted in less hunting pressure by spreading the hunters over a much larger area and consequently a better survival of big bucks statewide. Several relatively mild winters in a row have resulted in good survival and provided excellent fawn crops for the past four years. I have never seen as many triplet fawn births as we had this past spring.

In this area, at the end of the season we also have the best carry over buck population I also, have ever seen and from the reports I get, this same condition exists statewide. This past season should have seen a record number of bucks taken but I believe that, when the tally is in, it will amount to about the same as 1984. Our extremely wet weather throughout October and November was the primary factor. It curtailed access to many low lying areas and also discouraged many fair weather hunters from venturing affeld. This same heavy rainfall has prevented timely harvest of the corn crop and this also aided the deer herds by increasing cover.

Deer herd populations in the Upper Peninsula are dramatically increasing, particularly in the Western Counties, where the hunting pressure has been light and the area traditionally produces huge bucks. Better deer herd managment, particularly in Zone 2, is paying off with more deer and better bucks. The antlerless deer program has been much improved, in recent years, and the timber. pulp and cordwood cutting programs on State and Federal lands has improved the browse and habitat of the whitetail



The **Bowling Corner**

By Jay Michaels If you've been around bowling for awhile, you've no doubt heard some rather odd terminology that may be amusing to you. Today we'll go through my list of bowling jargon, and maybe, just maybe, you'll be able to better understand what your teammates are referring to when they put one "in the ditch".

Realize of course, that this is an unofficial list of terms, but it will certainly serve its' purpose to get your through the night (or whenever it is you bowl).

The Ditch: Also referred to as the channel, and more commonly referred to as the gutter. This is a very bad place to be while bowling and I suggest you stay away from this area as much as

The Betty Crocker Ball: Also known as a mixer or a splash ball.

This one is self-explanatory. The Pit: The area at the end of each lane where all ten pins are

SUPPOSED to end up on your first ball. Brooklyn or Jersey Strike: This is one of my trademarks. This is getting a strike when the ball crossses over the opposite pocket.

Necktie: When you need a strike or a spare to win the match and you choke and miss everyhthing but the ditch.

Marshmellow or Puff Ball: This usually occurs when your ball hits the pocket like a three year old rolled it.

Chicken Wing: A nasty habit that most bowlers experience at one time or another. The chicken wing occurs when the elbow breaks out - as you come through your downswing, alowing the ball to go wide of your mark, or be pulled to the inside of your mark. The Scout: A scout is a slowly rolling pin that eventually knocks over the lone standing pin you left on a perfectly rolled strike ball. When the scout gets to that lone remaining pin before the pinsetter

does, the bowling gods are watching over you. % THOTE CHECK THE TE You usually hear this pharse uttered when someone just missed an easy spare, or dropped the bowling ball on his or her foot. Not recommended for children under 17 unless accompanied by parent or guardian.

Sticks, Trees, or Telephone Poles: The pins.

Tap: A perfect strike ball in which you leave one pin standing, thereby making your perfect strike ball not so perfect at all.

A Basketball: This one will ususally get you a dirty look from the proprietor. A ball that bounces several times on the lane is called a basketball: NOTE; Bowling balls are not made to bounce. Duster: When you put one in the ditch, you're dusting the ditch for the nice proprietor so he doesn't have to after your league is

Blister or Cannon Ball: Thrown by many, this is a bowling ball that resembles a Mack Truck going down the lanes. Cherry: Another of my famous hots, this occurs when you have

two or more pins standing and there's still at least one standing AFTER you've rolled your spare ball.

Turkey: Three strikes in a row, or the guy next to you who insists on distracting you as much as possible. This guy's also referred to as a % TS@ % % SO SOTS!

The Jewel: A perfect game of 300. Fluff: This one's for the guys in the audience. Fluff is that pretty

Awesome: Your answer to the wisacre who asks how many points you took just after you're seriously considered throwing ball, bag, and shoes in The Grand River, you can just answer with a smirk

Revs: Better known as revolutions. The more revs on the ball, the harder it hits the pocket.

Pocket: Between the 1 and 3 pins for righthanders, the 1 and 2 pins for lefties.

There's many, many more terms used in bowling that Mr. Brown just simply won't let me divulge in this column. Of course, this isn't X-rated material you're reading here either, so it's perfectly understandable. I'm told this is read by young and old alike, so I'll let you learn some of the other terminology on your own.

In the meantime, I hope that the next time you're bowling, you'll be able to carry on an intelligent coversation about our sport. Just remember one thing in your search for the "jewel", STAY OUT OF THE DITCH!

Manager Quada opened the first discussion item, stating that the City must reinvestigate wastewater alternatives. There is no way that the citizens of Lowell can handle an extrememly large increase in water rates to support the total construction costs of a plant the size proposed.

He attended the meeting on November 13 and discovered that the City of Lowell is the only municipality in the State of Michigan that has been ordered to comply by May of 1988. We have been told all along that we were not the only community, up till now. He asked for documentation as to why Lowell was singled out, citing other communitites that have primary treatment plants. He informed them that the City of Lowell has not been dragging their feet, we have worked on this problem since 1976. We have done, and paid for our own rehabilitation of the system, installed a 24 hour sampling system, and began the process of privatization.

He had requested that someone from the Grants Division be at the meeting, and a Miss Tompkins was there, who stated that it was time for the City of Lowell to "bite the bullet" and build the plant. She stated that the community of Ironwood has built a secondary plant, and their bills now run only about \$29.14 per month on the average, but, it was learned that they had received a 75% grant, as well!

Manager Quada stated that he feels that the move by the DNR and EPA singling out the City of Lowell is retaliatory for our pursing the grant funds. The Councilman Thompson asked that it be made an agenda item amendment could be handled as an emergency amendment, for the next Council Meeting. Council concurred. to become effective immediately

Manager Quada suggested that the ordinance read "black and white" and allow the Planning Commission to deal with other colors on a variance request basis, at their discretion.

IT WAS MOVED by Councilman Schneider that an emergency amendment be approved to the CATV Dish Ordinance to include the allowance of Black Mesh Dishes, supported by Counilman Fonger.

The next item for discussion was to have been refuse collection cost charges. Manager Quada stated that he would have to rework the plan, citing the closing permanently of the Saranac Landfill, which changes everything. He will have new figures for the next meeting. He stated that the dumping fees for collectors has skyrocketed making an increase inevitable.

Councilman Collins asked if it might be wiser for the City to solicit bids for collection service only, and pay dumping fees

Manager Quada replied that it could be considred. In any case, with so many landfills closing, it will continue to become a growing problem.

Manager Quada reported that the cost for the West End Park restroom/concession stand will be submitted to the Helen Look-Daley Committee for consideration at their December

Under Citizen Input and Suggestion, Mr. Jim Hodges stated that he hated to bring it up, but, has anyting been done on a Snow Removal Oridnance yet?

Manager Quada replied no, but an impasse from last year needed to be worked on before adoption. The problem lies this process could have been better spent for the construction in enforcement, and what to do about the areas that do not James D. Maatman

Councilman-Elect Charles Doyle stated that his mother-in-law is 84 and lives in Detroit. She must have the snow removed within 48 hours, the same as everyone else, no allowances. He also stated that he walks to work every day, and in Winter must walk in the street because of snow-filled sidewalks. Motorists yell at people to get out of the street, and it is a

Councilman Thompson stated that it is also a problem for those people who do try to keep sidewaks and driveways cleared out. You no more than bet it cleared, and a snowplow comes along and fills it right back in. They can't help it, but it creates the problem of having to do it all over again.

Councilman Collins asked how we can enforce having to clear a path where there is no sidewalk, espeically in area such as his, where his property is at a 45 degree angle right down to the curbline, and covered with trees and brush.

Manager Quada replied that allowances would have to be made for impossible terrain, and perhaps worded to include all fairly level, unobstructed areas within the confines of the

Under Council Remarks, Councilman Thompson asked if the current Main Street rehabilitation projects are done.

Manager Quada replied yes, with the exception of the Lambert sign, and there are about five more businesses getting ready to start.

Under the Manager's Report, Manager Quada stated that some trees will be trimmed and a few removed at the end of the runway at our airport. Several really nice Red Oaks were found there and will be moved for \$40 apiece. One will be placed on either end of the billboard in the center Main Street parking lot, if the ground there is compatible.

He also asked Council to consider some type of a quarterly newsletter to Lowell Citizens, to keep them informed on some of the problems the City faces. He will work up some cost figures on printing, bulk mailing. Another suggestion was perhaps to have it delivered with the Buyers Guide.

He congratulated incumbents, Fonger and Collins and Councilman-Elect Doyle for winning seats on the Council, and congratulated Councilman Schneider for being able to stay home and watch "Monday Night Football".


Councilman Schneider stated that he had enjoyed his service on the Council and will miss it, but will enjoy Monday Night Football too.

Janeland cow is reserve champion at big show


