Lowell officers investigated 25 accident complaints in the month of February. None involved injuries.

City gets new rescue vehicle

The old adage says, "Every cloud has a silver lining," and that has proved to be the case with a 1971 fire truck owned by the city. About six months ago, Lowell City Manager Ray Quada told the City Council that the city's primary pumper truck had serious problems with its pumping system. A survey of the damage revealed that the truck was in need of more repair than it was worth. Some quick shopping uncovered a readily available 1985 FMC demo pumper. The city was due for a new pumper in the county's purchase rotation schedule in about two years. A deal was struck that allowed the city to buy the truck now, and be reimbursed when their turn for a new truck came up in the county's schedule. So, Lowell had a new pumper, and the chassis of a perfectly good truck with only 15,000 miles on the odometer.

What to do with the truck chassis became something of a problem, until someone had the idea of mounting a crew box on it. About two months and \$9,500 later, the city had a new rescue vehicle. The unit has cabinets around the outside of that will be filled with the fire department's emergency gear, such as breathing apparatus, hydraulic extraction equipment, etc. This equipment is now on the city's 1966 Ford rescue van, which will be sold once the new unit has been fitted out.

The new unit will be equipped with a generator and searchlights to aid in night emergencies. It will also be equipped with extra

All items are tagged, and shoppers can deal directly with the McCullums and their assistants.

Avoid eating or drinking excessively before going to bed. A full stomach increases the work load on the heart and can raise the body temperature, making it difficult to fall asleep. Also, drinking large quantities of fluid immediately before bedtime can cause an urge to urinate during the night.

2. Don't use any products that contain caffeine after noon. If you must have an evening cup of tea or coffee, use decaffeinated

4. Follow a daily exercise routine. Caution must be taken to avoid strenuous exercise within 2 hours of bedtime; in addition to being stimulating, exercise carries an increase in body temperature, which is in conflict with the natural tendency for sleep to occur when the basal body

5. Don't rely on alcohol to induce sleep. Alcohol exerts two effects upon the sleeping person. Mayor Maatman stated that the city had discarded the concept of a snow removal program, run by the city, due to cost.

Manager Quada stated that every effort is made to avoid pushing snow on the sidewalk but occasionally it cannot be

The public hearing was closed at 8:22 p.m.

The Council directed the City Manager to prepare a Sidewalk Ordinance for consideration by the council as quickly as pos-

In response to an inquiring by James Hodges, 422 North Jefferson, about the length of time it would take to complete an ordinance, Manager Quada stated that it would require approximately sixty days.

Mayor Maatman then opened discussion on a recommendation from the Planning Commission to consider removing the requirement to construct garages as part of a multi-family

Manager Quada cited the fact that the city has several apartment units without garages or carports and that the Planning Commission felt it was unnecessary to continue the require-

The Council set the first meeting in April as the date for a public hearing to consider this proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance.

Manager Quada then led a discussion on current building, plumbing and electrical inspections inside the City of Lowell.

He stated that he had recently hired Joe Nowak to conduct building inspections, on a part-time basis, for the City of Low-

In that Mr. Nowak, currently an inspector for Grattan Township, is also certified to perform Plumbing and Electrical Inspections, the manager suggested that perhaps the City of Lowell should return to the practice of performing its own inspections rather than having them done by the State of Michigan inspec-

The Council concurred and Manager Quada indicated that snow removal program, and they also raised again the issue he would prepare a total program for the council to consider, to include fees, ordinance amendments, etc.

> The Council then discussed a proposed contract with Kent County for the use of a Hazardous Material Vehicle.

> Also under Council Comments, Councilman Doyle stated that he did not like the name Creekside Park for the city's newest park and after a lengthy discussion he made a motion to change the name to the Lee - Look Park. The motion was seconded by Councilman Fonger.

The Council then continued the discussion about selecting names for future parks and after discussing contests, suggestion boxes, name selections based upon significant donors etc., it was decided that there is no sure way to name a park that will make everyone happy.

Manager Quada reminded the council that a motion was made and approved to erect monuments in the parks to the significant donors such as Helen "Look" Daley and Solomen S. Lee.

Councilman Thompson reiterated that the council should have a format for name selection.





The city is in line to get a new tanker through the county this year. Martin says it will replace the 1963 Dodge, and will have at least a 1,500 gal. capacity.
