Central business district is on the rebound

What a difference two years can make! In December of 1983 the Ledger ran a lengthy front page article which focused on the closing of six Main Street businesses. Those six, along three other closed businesses, brought the total of empty storefronts to nine. An alarming number in a community of this size.

The six businesses closed that December were Bif's Ranch House, Video Wizard, B & M Furniture, Riverside Fireplace Shoppe, The House of Townsend and the Sunoco gas station. With the lone exception of the Sunoco station, all of these storefronts will be occupied when new owners open the doors on April 21 at the former Bif's Ranch House. Riverside Fireplace Shoppe's building is now the home of Cousins' Card and Gift Shoppe. B & M Furniture's building is the home of Curt's Sound and Home Arcade (Radio Shack Dealer Store). Video Wizard's building is now Lowell Water-

beds and the old House of Townsend building is the Flat River Antique Mall.

Other businesses that have been vacated over these past few years have also been re-occupied. Carole's Critters moved in when Radio Service Co. went out of business. Lambert Variety expanded into the small building next door when Tummino and Tummino Law Offices moved into larger quarters vacated by a philatelic supply business at 311 East Main St. The small building just east of Lambert's, most recently occupied by Dick & Owen's Barber Shop will soon open as a Fabric and Craft shop. Hinkley Drugs moved in to the building vacated by Discount Enterprises and the Lowell Sport Shop recently opened in the building most recently occupied by Sparky's Cafe. Modern Mini-Lab and Camera opened at 106 West Main. The Lowell Buyer's Guide purchased the building once occupied by Lippert Pharmacies as their general offices.

The building which was once the home of That Special Place was vacant only a short time before Straw Basket Collections opened their doors.

In nearly every one of the above listed transitions, extensive restoration and remodeling has dramatically improved the appearance of each building. The demolition of the old Root-Lowell building at the corner of Main and Broadway was also a visual improvement. These efforts, along with city projects such as the tree planters on Main St. and the Riverside parking mall, have given the downtown a new lease on life.

The only negative examples in this miniature renaissance are Hill's Shoe Store, Rivertown Mall and the Sunoco station. News via the grapevine indicates that the Rivertown Mall (including the After Deck Restaurant) may soon re-open. There is a new owner of the Sunoco station property with plans to possibly open a franchised fast food business. If these plans come to pass, only Hill's Shoe Store would be left vacant in the central business district.

On the west side of town, work is progressing at the new 7-11 convenience store, and a sign that reads, "Coming soon, Mar Lee's Village Inn and Pizza Express" is hung in the window of the vacant building most recently occupied by Brother's Inn. Sam's Service Center is expanding their operation at the former Lowell Tire Co. and Michigan Mobile Homes opened early this year across from Harold Zeigler Ford.

In all, about twenty businesses have opened during the past two years, with more scheduled to open their doors soon. Residents can certainly look to this as a very positive trend, especially when compared to our article of two years ago.

School Board Notes:

The Lowell Board of Education held its regular meeting on Monday, April 14, 1986.

During the recognition of the audience, Denise Dommer, President of the Lowell Athletic Boosters Club, presented a check in the amount of \$3,300 to the Board. This represented the final \$2,000 payment of the total \$6,000 promised to the schools for the intramural program, and \$1,300 for the girls' softball program for this year. Superintendent Fritz Esch then distributed Certificates of Recognition earned by each school and the students in the district for performance on the 1985-86 Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) tests.

Following the payment of bills, the Board received an update from middle school teacher, Mrs. Betty Brinks, on the Quest program being held at the middle school. The Quest program is a program that sets a code of ethics in the classroom to obtain positive attitude skills and self-confidence and is being financially funded by the Lowell and Alto Lions Clubs. Sixth grader, Mark Lyon, also addressed the board with his positive comments on the program and stated that the program has helped him to better communicate and get along with others.

In other business, Dave Douma and Charles Kohler of the Lowell Area Soccer Club made a request for the Board to recognize soccer as a varsity sport. Following the discussion, the Board requested further information from the athletic department and stated they would consider the item further at a special meeting to be held on April 28, 1986.

In business relating to personnel, the Board approved contracts for the 1986-87 certified staff and accepted resignations from Chip King (effective immediately), and Virginia Fonger and Gayle Lycos effective at the end of the 1985-86 school year. Approval was given to add a teacher consultant position for the Special Education program beginning with the 1986-87 school year.

In other action, the Board adopted a resolution to set matters for the upcoming annual school election to be held on Monday, June 9, 1986. The only matter being voted upon is the

election of two board members. Incumbents, Chris VanAntwerp and John Haggai, have been nominated to run. The Board then awarded the Construction Manager bid to Jeff Peel for the proposed baseball field.

In the last items of business, the Board appointed Jim Lindhout and Sandy Nagy to serve on the Recreational Survey Needs Committee for the purpose of planning and coordinating the efforts of governmental units for recreational planning. The Board then adopted a resolution authorizing the issuance of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) Energy Conservation Improvement Bonds for the purpose of paying the cost of providing energy conservation improvements to school facilities.

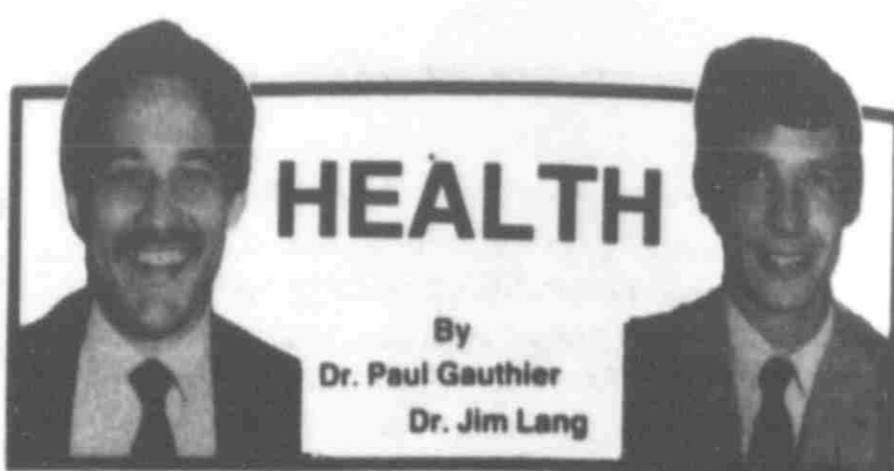

HEALTH

A "WEIGHTY" TOPIC PART II

Last week, in our column, we discussed obesity and concluded that obesity (generally regarded as 20% above ideal body weight) leads to shorter life expectancy and increased medical problems. This week, we'd like to discuss some of the current diets and their drawbacks.

Fasting or starvation is probably effective for short term weight loss but it is not recommended for several reasons. Over extended periods, it can cause severe metabolic disturbances including anemia, loss of bone strength, electrolyte abnormalities and even death. Obviously, fasting will not maintain weight loss.

Several protein-sparing diets have been on the market for the past few years and are often sold through distributors or "health food stores." These diets generally restrict the daily intake to 300-700 calories/day and are available as a powder that you drink after mixing. A few years ago there were several deaths associated with these "liquid protein diets." These plans, if followed, will result in some weight loss but one wonders how long weight loss can be maintained. Several low calorie, novelty diets are promoted through books (grapefruit diet, banana diet, etc) that also may cause nausea, fatigue and dehydration among other medical problems. These usually suggest that you follow the diet for 3-4 weeks and you'll lose a desired amount of weight. Unfortunately, they don't tell you what to do after you go back to your normal eating pattern three weeks later and regain all the weight you lost!

Another fad that is promoted in tabloid ads are the amazing starch blockers or other pills that, if taken several times a day (at considerable expense), will allow you to lose weight while eating almost anything you want. These wonder pills are purported to work by blocking digestion or absorption of carbohydrates. Most studies have reported questionable effectiveness of these "wonder drugs."

Other popular items are the "appetite suppressants" that are available over the counter at your local drug store. Appetite suppressants have shown limited effectiveness at best, and can often lead to irritability, high blood pressure, nervousness, and insomnia. Suffice it to say that we have never seen anyone lose weight and maintain weight loss by simply taking appetite suppressants. Diuretics (water pills) have no place in weight control, as obesity is not due to excess water in the body. We've seen what doesn't work -- next week we will discuss some things that do.

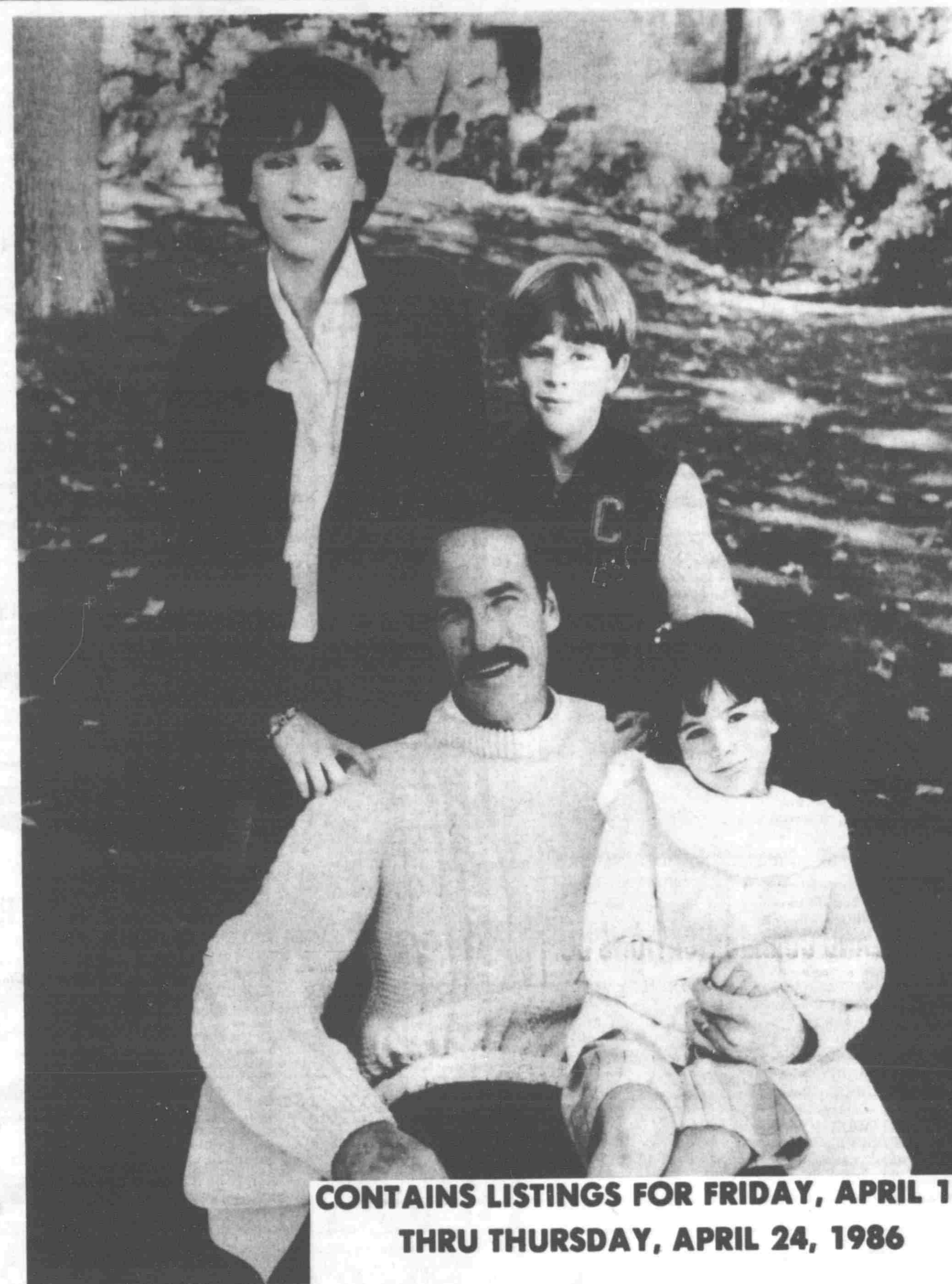
