## Fires ravage two Lowell homes

The Lowell Fire Department was called out to two major fires last. Fire completely destroyed the Margaret Nowicki residence at 10712 Bennett Rd. on Friday, May 9. The residents had left the house at about 9:45 p.m., and the Lowell Fire Department received a call an hour later at 10:45.

The fire apparently had a good start, as the firemen spotted heavy smoke while in route and still a considerable distance away.

Lowell Fire Chief Frank Martin called in assistance from Ada and Cannon Townships, but the two story farm house was too far gone, despite the efforts of the three departments the house burned to the ground. Martin estimated the damage at \$70,000. No cause has yet been determined, but insurance investigators are still looking into the matter.

determined origin caused about \$20,000 in smoke and water damage. No one was home when

the fire was reported at 9:09 p.m. The fire remains under investigation.

## Local high school students to appear on national television

Thirteen Grand Rapids high school students will participate in a national television program, airing Saturday (May 10) being produced by Close Up Foundation.

The 60-minute telecast will air nationally on the C-SPAN cable network to 23 million households wired to receive C-SPAN. The program will be a discussion

of growing drug abuse problems in American and some possible solutions. The Grand Rapids students will be able to question John Cusack, chief of staff of the Select Committee on Narcotics Abuse and Control and Cortlin Malloy, metro correspondent of the Washington Post.

The C-SPAN program, supported through grants to CLOSE

UP by R.J.R. Nabisco, Inc. and The Du Pont company will air at 10:00 a.m. EST. Students from Maine and New Jersey will also participate in the session.

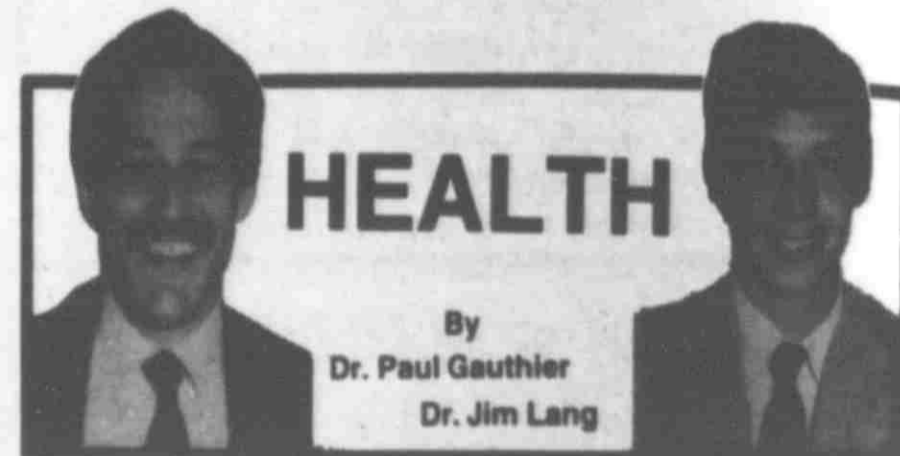

## HEALTH

### SHIN SPLINTS

With the onset of warmer weather, and more people taking to the streets to jog, it's appropriate to discuss a very common runner's injury...shin splints.

"Shin Splints" is a term used to describe several different conditions affecting the lower leg. A patient suffering shin splints will usually describe a painful sensation occurring along the inner, forward portion of the lower leg between the ankle and knee. The pain usually starts during early training periods or when a runner increases his/her usual weekly mileage. Pain is due to inflammation of the area where the posterior tibial muscle attaches to the tibia bone. Sometimes actual tearing of this attachment may occur. Several other problems may lead to "Shin Splints" such as inflammation of the membrane covering the bone or even a small stress fracture of the tibia bone itself. Shin splints can be a frustrating injury to a runner because of its prolonged nature and tendency to relapse. The intensity of pain can vary from mild tenderness during exercise to constant aching even during rest.

Because shin splints are due to a broad range of injuries, treatment is varied and is not always completely effective. The primary treatment is rest. Unless the injured site is adequately rested, reinjury will occur leading to further disability. Depending on the severity of the injury running should be discontinued at least one week to several weeks. Cardiovascular fitness can be maintained during this time by performing another activity such as biking or swimming. Local heat should be applied using a moist compress or soaking in a tub.

In some cases use of an arch support may provide some relief. Aspirin or other anti-inflammatory medications may be taken to decrease the inflammation at the site of injury. Strapping of the involved area has its proponents but its effectiveness is limited. Some runners will find relief by running on soft areas such as grass or rubberized tracks.

In summary, the "Shin Splint" is a nagging injury of many causes that is most appropriately treated with adequate rest.

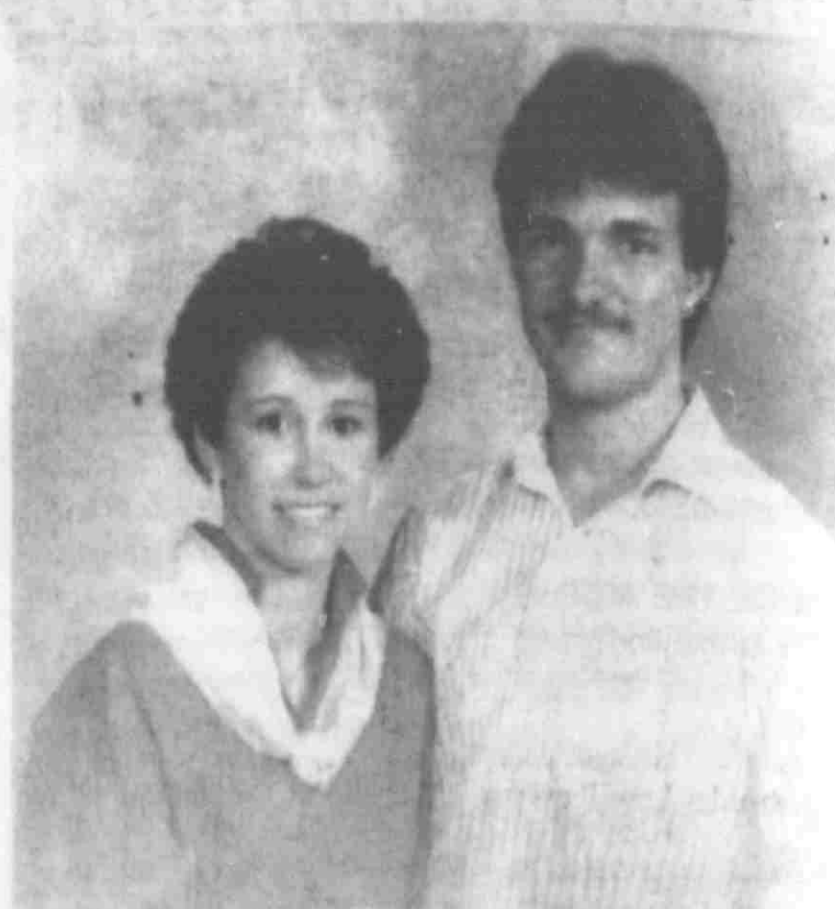

### Aims of mailbox improvement week: Better service, safety

The U.S. Postal Service has designated May 19-24 as "Mailbox Improvement Week."

"Each year a week in May is set aside to remind customers on rural, city motorized and contract delivery routes to examine and improve, where necessary, the appearance of their mailboxes," Lowell Postmaster Charlie Doyle said.

"The purpose is to call attention to the need to provide mail receptacles that are conveniently located, safe to use, neat in appearance and are designed to protect the mail from the weather," Postmaster Doyle continued.

There is no question that neat, attractive mailboxes improve the

appearance of country roads and suburban streets. The Postal Service points out, however, that Mailbox Improvement Week means more than eye appeal.

"Say that an old, dented box has sharp, cutting edges or that the receptacle is too small, too hard to reach or made inaccessible by obstructions," comments Postmaster Doyle. "In such cases, the mail would be stamped undeliverable and the customer could have to come to the post office to pick it up. We need the co-operation of our customers to maintain service at its highest level."

Postal regulations require that rural and contract route carriers must have access to mailboxes without having to leave their vehicles. Such boxes must be located on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier's direction of travel where traffic conditions would endanger a carrier driving to the left to reach the boxes. The boxes also must be placed to conform with state laws and highway regulations.

Customers are requested to remove obstructions -- including vehicles, trashcans and snow -- that make delivery difficult.

For both suburban curbside and rural roadside boxes, the Postal Service requests a height of 3-1/2 to 4 feet from the bottom of the box to ground level. The address should be clearly printed on the receptacle to assure more efficient delivery.

There are approved traditional and contemporary mailbox designs. A customer-designed rural box need the prior approval of the postmaster before it can be installed.

One last safety caution from the Postal Service: Some mailbox supports are so massive (heavy metal posts, concrete, farm equipment filled with concrete), they are damaging vehicles and causing serious injuries to people who accidentally strike them. The Federal Highway Administration has suggested mailbox mounting and support designs that post offices will share with their customers.

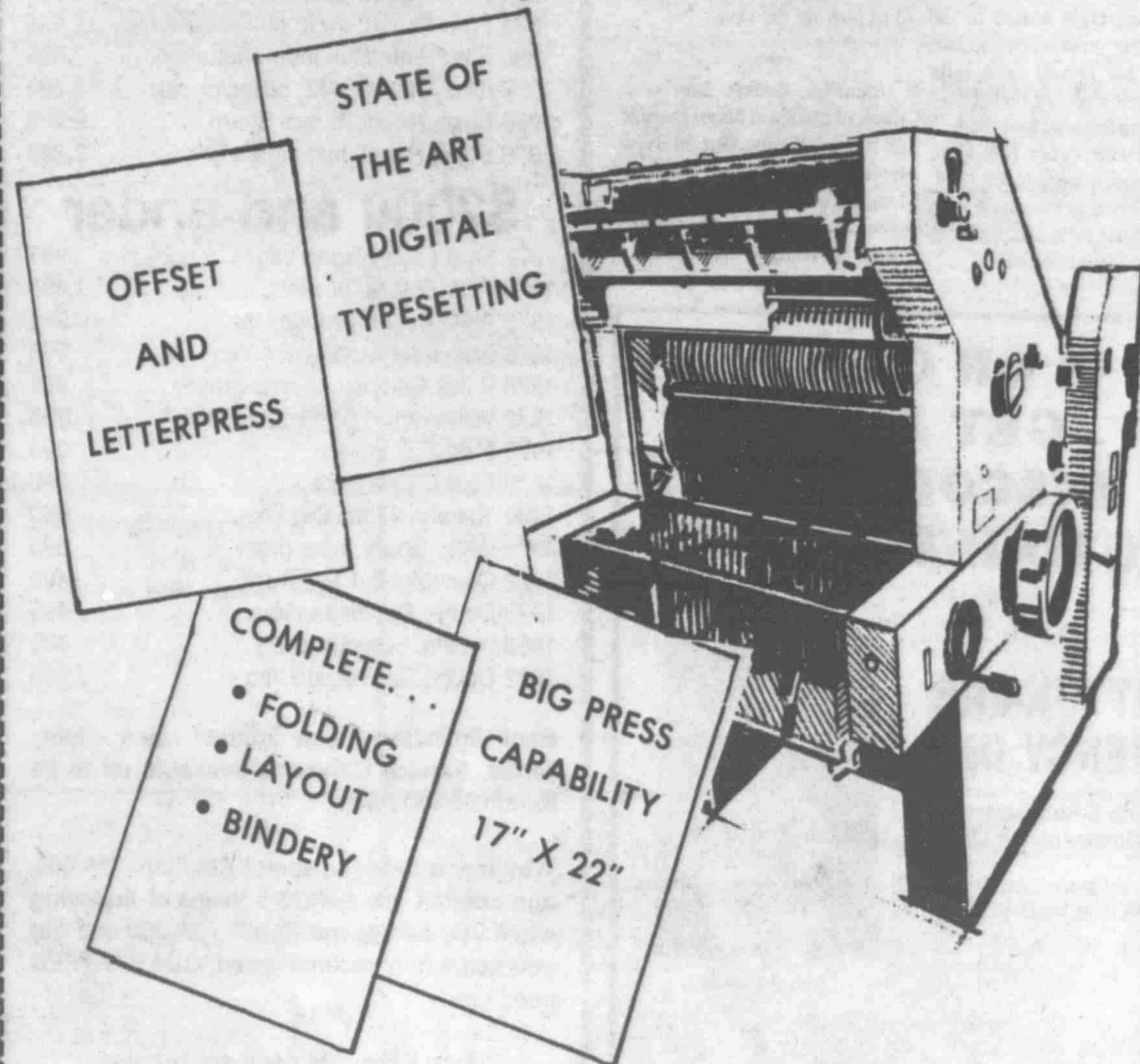

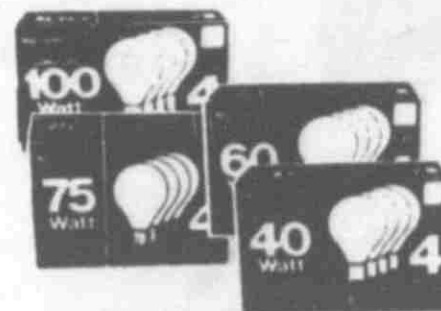

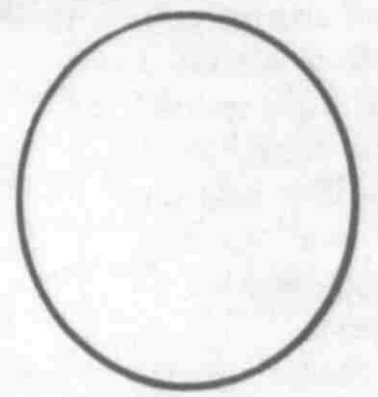
